



The new statue of Queen Anne, which the corporation of Londom have erected in front of the Peter's Cathedral, is to be unveiled on Dec. 15 by the Lord Mayor, with full civic ceremony. Mr. Belt, who is now undergoing a long term of imprisonment, is the artist, and his incarceration has in no way impeded the progress of the work. The statue has in fact been modelled in jail, and its execution in permanent form has been personally superintended by the sculptor. A canvas cloth at present conceans it from public view, but it is admitted by all who have seen it to be an exceedingly successful work.


