INTRODUCTION.

This Catalogue contains the titles of the books in the Circulating department only, being a little less than 10,000 volumes. A more complete catalogue, arranged under both author and subject, of the books in both Circulating and Reference departments, and including a further purchase of books now being made, will be issued next year.

PLAN.—This is an Author Catalogue, consisting of an alphabetical arrangement of authors' names. Three faces of type are used :

(1) *Antique* : in which this line is printed.

(2) *Roman* : in which this line is printed.

(3) *Italic* : in which this line is printed.

Each author's surname is printed in *Antique*, with the Christian name following in *Roman*. Anonymous works—works of which the authorship is not known, are entered under the titles of the books, and such titles are printed in *Roman*. The titles of periodicals also are printed in *Roman*, thus reserving the *Antique* for author's name exclusively. Following the author's name, in many cases, the country of birth, with year of birth, is given; if dead, the year of death is also given. The articles *A*, *An*, *The*, have in most instances been omitted. Lists of the International scientific series and of a few other series have been given for convenience of reference.

AUTHOR ENTRY.—Under each author's name is given, in alphabetical order, (1) collective works; (2) separate volumes; (3) books edited by him, which are preceded by the contraction *ed.*; and (4) books or parts of books of which he may be the subject. Note especially that biographies appear under the name of their subjects; in many cases the surname only of the compiler or editor of the work follows, printed in *italics*. Titles, as *Hon.*, *Sir*, *baron*, etc., are printed in *italics*.

PERSONAL ENTRY.—Under the Christian, or first name, are placed all sovereigns or princes, as *Victoria, queen of Great Britain and empress of India*; all canonized persons, as *Paul, apostle, saint*. Under the family name are placed, in general, all persons not included under the foregoing, as *Campbell, Geo. D. G., 6th duke of Argyll*; with a reference from their titles. The names of married women are placed under the name of the husband, with a reference from the maiden name.

PSEUDONYMS.—Works written anonymously, or under assumed names, are placed under the real name of the author, if known, with a reference from the pseudonym. For this reference, look for the pseudonym as actually used; thus, *Mark Twain, not Twain, Mark*; *George Eliot, not Eliot, George*.

CONTENTS.—The contents of the more important works are given: thus, under *Lingard's History of England*, the reader may at once find the particular volume dealing with *Mary or Elizabeth*. Explanatory notes also are frequently added to assist the reader.

TRANSLATORS.—Books are not entered under the translator's name, unless more likely to be inquired for under that name.

NUMBERS.—A hyphen between numbers signifies that the volumes are numbered consecutively from the first number to the last: as, *Froude's History of England, 12 vols. G 131.42*: if the sixth volume is wanted, ask for *G 136*. When only one duplicate is in the Library, "Second copy" has been printed, to show plainly that it is not a second volume; but, when there are two or more duplicates, a semi-colon has been placed between the numbers.

INSERTIONS.—Words within brackets [] are not in the title: they have been inserted to give a clearer idea of the contents of the book: as, *Harris Wm., History of the radical party in [the British] parliament*.

PERIODICALS.—In addition to the list of periodicals, as printed in alphabetical order, the titles of many articles and stories therein will be found under the author's name: as, Knight, Edward H., Crude and curious inventions. [*The Atlantic monthly.*] K 1166. These articles and stories frequently run through more than one volume: but, as only one volume can be drawn at a time, only the number of the volume in which the article or story begins is given.

CLASSIFICATION.—The books in the Circulating department have been grouped in classes as follows:

- A Natural sciences and mathematics.
- B Biography.
- C Theology.
- D Mental, moral and social sciences.
- E Useful and fine arts.
- F Travels, geography and description.
- G History.
- H Language and literature; including essays, collective works, etc.
- I Poetry and dramatic literature.
- K Periodicals, (bound.)
- L English prose fiction.
- M Books for young people
- N Books in German.
- P Books in French.

Cards, containing the titles of the books arranged under above classes, also a second set arranged alphabetically by authors, will be found in the Card Catalogue case, standing in the Reference reading room.

REFERENCE BOOKS.—The dictionaries and encyclopedias have been placed on shelves in the Reference reading room, so that they may be consulted readily, without the formality of asking for them. Every person consulting any of these books is, however, asked to record the fact on one of the slips to be found on the shelves, and deposit it in the box provided; so that some idea may be formed of the use made of these special books. The titles of the other books in the Reference department are now being copied on cards which, when completed, will be placed in the Card Catalogue case standing in the Reference reading room.

HOW TO DRAW BOOKS.—Consult the Indicator and ascertain if the book wanted is in. [Blue is in, Red is out]. If in, write the class letter and number of book, with the number on the borrower's card, on a slip to be procured from the attendant at the Receiving desk. Hand this slip, with the borrower's card, to the attendant at the Delivery desk, and wait till book is delivered. In calling for books, be particular to give the class letter as well as the number of the book; and see that letters and figures are written plainly and distinctly. For Reference books, to be consulted in the building, apply to the attendant at the Delivery desk.

SUGGESTIONS.—Read the rules and regulations of the Library carefully; this may save possible annoyance and expense. Watch the city papers for notices affecting the Library. Do not turn down the leaves of books; use a piece of paper as a book-marker. Readers searching for information on special topics should consult the Librarian, who will render assistance if possible. Recommend books for the Library by entering titles in the Suggestion book in charge of attendant at the Delivery desk. Three things to remember—your card number; that young children are not permitted on the Library premises; that perfect quiet must be maintained while in the Library and reading-room.
