PHILATELIC SOCIETIES.

The United States and Canada are represented to-day by six national societies, not including semi-national and other societies with a national tendency. The total member-

elic Association 700; Sons of Philatelia 500; Philatelic Sons of America 600; Columbian Philatelic Society 300; Southern Philatelic Association 200 and the Dominion Philatelic Association 20c making a total of 2,500 members. In comparison with the total population of stamp collectors in United States and Canada, this is indeed a poor showing.

The blame for these discouraging low membership lists can be laid at the door of politics. These nationsocieties are being destroyed by the many political squabbles at each Many of the memyearly election. bers who adhere to the saying, "mare work and less play" become become disgusted with these yearly disgraces, and either resign and join some other society, or quit all of them for good. Fhilatelic societies have lost many a member just by this cause, and it is not a very easy matter to get these cellectors to change their views regarding philatelic societies, and become one of us Important offices are given again. to political allies of the "boss", who may be utterly unfit for the position where another candidate, whose qualifications can be relied upon, is defeated, the primary reason having no recognition from the "boss". On several occasions unfair politics caused almost complete destruction of our societies. As I state this wrangling tends to decreae the membership, and it should be discontinued for the good of philately. "The proof of the pudding is in the eatship of these six societies is estiling," is very true, and this saying mated as follows: American Philat- can exually be applied to the situation we find our societies in to-day. Here's how we should reason it. The pudding is our total membership; and here's the the eating. The total membership of our societies five years ago, was as much, if not more than it is to-day. Is not this enough prof? The reason of this decrease is neither with the hard times nor the scarcity of collectors. Politics can shoulder the entire loss.
