THE KAISER AND THE PRINCE OF WALES. The Kaiser and the Prince of Wales Were Chief Mourners in the Procession on Saturday.

BEAUTIFUL WREATHS WERE SENT. LI HUNG CHANG'S SERIOUS THREAT. Makes All Europe Anxious-Chinese Are Said to Fear Germany.

London, Aug. 5.—Europe is still in doubt as to what the Chinese situation portends, but the optimism which followed the first authentic news, that most of the residents of the legations were still alive, is disappearing. China instead of being repulsed, has engaged Germany, and continues to be the most hostile power.

While the final escape of the foreigners from Peking is by no means assured, it is felt, especially in London, that only the greatest mischance would result by even a passive recognition by any power that the foreigners in Peking are virtually in the position of hostages. As such, in fact, the Chinese Government evidently means to treat them, and all its efforts are devoted to opening negotiations with some or any of the powers on that basis.

No Time to Tarry with China. Both England and France consider it the greatest mistake for any country to discuss the situation with China in any form until the danger threatening the Ministers is absolutely and unconditionally removed. One or two communications made in reply to the Chinese Emperor's appeal for mediation, have not been sufficient to induce upon this first principle of international intercourse, wherefore it should not be surprising that the French Government resorts to threats of massacre to be recognized before any peace can be effected. It is felt that all events, the powers should unanimously convey to the Chinese authorities an explicit and stern declaration that with penalties will be inflicted, if further harm befalls the foreigners.

Great Grief, if No Harmony. It is impossible to exaggerate the grief which is involved in any belief by China that the powers are not acting in absolute harmony and determination on the point of the rescue of the legations, and the refusal to negotiate anything until this is effected.
