ANNUAL REPORT.

A comparison of the relief given during the season just closed, with that of the preceding and corresponding twelve months, shows a small increase in the number of individuals relieved, and a slight diminution in the amount of aid granted.

It may consequently be inferred that the general condition of the city poor is much the same as it was at this time last year.

This being so, the Managers see no necessity for enlarging on that question, but they will be happy to receive and consider any practical suggestion tending to extend the beneficial influence of the Institution.

The supply of bread has hitherto been procurable at the House only. This practice seems a hardship to poor and infirm people living in remote parts of the city, who are thus obliged to make long and sometimes painful journeys to obtain

their allowances. Arrangements for the delivery of bread at certain points throughout the city are now in progress, and will probably be completed in a few days.

The improvements and additions to the out buildings, referred to in last year's report, have been completed ; they give increased accommodation, and can be used as working rooms for the inmates, or for any other purpose consistent with the general objects of the House. These improvements entailed the expenditure of a large sum, part of which has been defrayed by a grant from the city corporation ; the remainder forms a charge upon the resources of the Charity.

The main building, erected in 1848, being in need of repair, some expense has been incurred in necessary alterations and improvements, details of which will be found in the report of the Treasurer.

At the suggestion of many influential citizens the labour test was applied during the months of November and December. It proved satisfactory in regard to the number of men who were willing to work ; but difficulty has been found in disposing speedily of the wood which had been cut and split. While the test was in operation, 45 cords of wood were cut. When it was discontinued the number of tramps applying for relief doubled. It would be premature to pronounce as yet upon the success of the attempt.

The Managers regret the loss by death of two old and very efficient members of the Board, Messrs. E. H. Rutherford and Robert Walker. Mr. Rutherford was the oldest member of the Board, having been associated with it for at least forty years, during part of which time he filled successively and successfully the offices of Secretary and Chairman. In token of his appreciation of the work done by the House, he left a handsome bequest to the Investment Fund.

Mr. Robert Walker, one of our best known and most esteemed citizens, took an active interest in the workings of

The removal of these gentlemen makes two vacancies on the Board, which are to be filled by election at this meeting.

The Managers have to thank the Consumers' Gas Company for a gift of 1,500 bushels of coke, a substantial addition to the fuel supply, which has been distributed in the usual manner.

The Managers have pleasure in stating that Mr. and Mrs. North, the Matron and Superintendent, have performed their duties to the satisfaction of the Board.

The Reports of the Treasurer, Superintendent, and Medical Officer await inspection, and will, it is hoped, be found satisfactory.
