Praise was given the society's officer, Mr. Chapman, for his work during the year, 203 animals having been attended to. There had been 87 prosecutions for cruelty, resulting in 57 fines, hine remands, nine withdrawals and 13 discharges. He had paid 330 visifs to the cattle markets and 103 animals had been humanely killed by his orders. The report commented on the need for volunteers to carry on the work of collecting contributions. 
