ELDERS' DISTRICTS.

The Congregation is divided into sixteen districts, and each Elder has a district assigned to him for visitation.

The limits of the districts are arranged to run from centre to centre of streets named.

(For residence of Elders see page 3.)

District No. 1.—Mr. F. P. Bronson : Hintonburgh, Bayswater, Wellington Street, west of Pooley's Bridge, Le Breton Flats, Victoria Island and Hull.

District No. 2.—Mr. Gemmill : From Sparks Street Northward to the Ottawa River, and from Pooley's Bridge Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 3.—Hon. E. H. Bronson : From Concession Street Westward to Hintonburgh (not inclusive), and from Richmond Road and Wellington Street (not inclusive) Southward to the Experimental Farm (inclusive).

District No. 4.—Mr. Wyld : From Concession Street Eastward to Bay Street, and from Sparks Street Southward to Isabella Street.

District No. 5.—Mr. May : From Bay Street Eastward to Bank Street, and from Sparks Street Southward to Maria Street.

District No. 6.—Mr. Allan : From Maria Street Southward to McLaren Street, and from Bay Street Eastward to Bank Street.

District No. 7.—Prof. Macoun : From McLaren Street Southward to Isabella Street, and from Bay Street Eastward to Bank Street.

District No. 8.—Mr. Gibson : From Sparks Street Southward to Slater Street, and from Bank Street Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 9.—Dr. Gibson :—From Slater Street Southward to Nepean Street, and from Bank Street Eastward to the canal.

District No. 10.—Mr. Alexander : From Nepean Street Southward to Cooper, and from Bank Street Eastward to Canal.

District No. 11.—Mr. Orme : From Cooper Street Southward to McLaren Street, and from Bank Street Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 12.—Mr. Chrysler : From McLaren Street Southward to McLeod Street, and from Bank Street Eastward to the Canal.

District No. 13.—Mr. Hamilton : From McLeod Street Southward to Billing's Bridge, and from Bank Street Eastward to Canal.

District No. 14.—Mr. Larmonth : From Rideau Street Southward to Stewart Street, and from Canal Eastward to Janeville.

District No. 15.—Prof. Robertson : From Stewart Street Southward to Ann Street, and from the Canal Eastward to Rideau River.

PASTORAL LETTER.

To the Members and Adherents of St. Andrew's Church:

MY DEAR FRIENDS:

Although the best results of Christian labour cannot be recorded in words and figures, the Reports which follow are most encouraging, and afford abundant reason for gratitude to God. The various departments of church work have been well maintained during the year, and there is increase in membership, in collections, and in gifts to the church in general.

The public services of the church have been faithfully attended by most of you, and a large number of strangers find a hearty welcome. I thank God, for constant evidences that my ministrations from the pulpit are not in vain.

Your generous and enthusiastic action at the Annual Meeting has already received my sincere thanks. I value it not simply for its practical effect, but for the proof it gives of your esteem and affection.

The recent additions made to the Kirk Session will increase its efficiency. I desire to acknowledge the assistance given me by the Elders, the Temporal Committee, the Sunday School Teachers, the members of the various Societies, and all others who have shown their readiness to advance the church's prosperity.

During the year a good deal of sickness has prevailed in the congregation, and we mourn the loss of those whose memory will long be cherished amongst us. No part of my work is more dear to me than that of ministering to you in trouble and sorrow; and while it is impossible to do much visiting of a general kind, I am always ready to serve you in the hours when you need me most.

The Young Peoples' Society has not held regular meetings during the year, but its influence has been felt in the large number of young people at our mid-week service, and in the substantial aid which many of them give to the various currents of Christian activity. KIRK SESSION REPORT.

In submitting a brief report of the seventieth year of congregational life and work in this Church, your office-bearers have much reason to express their gratitude to God for the measure of success which has attended the efforts of minister and people in their endeavours to promote the chief objects for which the great Head of the Church has continued our existence as a Christian Congregation.

The results of the various branches of Christian activity in which both the junior and senior members have been engaged, cannot, in all respects, be fully reported. This is especially so in regard to the faithful discharge of the manifold duties pertaining to the pastoral office, and to the self-denying work of those who have been intrusted with the religious instruction of the juvenile members of the Church. In these matters statements cannot be made with the same degree of accuracy as is possible in financial reports; yet, judging by the ordinary tests of success in Christian work, our congregational efforts in that direction afford evidence of satisfactory progress.

In regard to the religious services held on the Lord's day, these have been regularly continued, and a careful retrospect of the usual attendance upon these means of grace enables the Session to report that there has been no falling off in the deep interest which has hitherto been so encouragingly manifested in the observance of the ordinary services of the Church, as well as of the quarterly communions of the Congregation, and that there has been rather an increase in the attendance at the mid-week services which are held for religious instruction and worship. During the months in which they have been held in the past year, the Pastor has conducted a series of studies in the Book of Proverbs. The practical nature of the lessons drawn from this rich treasury of moral and religious instruction have been followed with appreciation and profit by the young people of the Congregation, as well as those of more mature years.

Members of the Congregation while enjoying the Church privileges which they possess, have not been unmindful of their less favoured brethren in the sparsely settled districts of our own land or the more distant regions of the world, as the Treasurer's Statement shows that, during the year, there has been an increase both in the number and amount of contributions to those missionary and benevolent schemes, by means of which the Church is endeavouring to extend the blessings of the Christian religion to the destitute, both in home and foreign lands. Their contributions to these schemes, through the medium of the Church schedules, have enabled the Session to make the following allocations to the several objects named therein, viz. :—

The total amount thus allocated being three thousand seven hundred and forty dollars.

The Church debt having been reduced in the past year by the payment of fifteen thousand dollars, the amount required for the payment of interest will be considerably less next year, so that a continuance of the same liberality which has been shown in the contributions of the past year will, it is hoped, enable the Session to make still larger allocations to the several schemes of the Church in the coming year.

The Treasurer's Statement of the Session Fund forms part of this Report. By reference thereto it will be seen that the plate

collections at the Sabbath-day and other services have been rather larger than those of the previous year. The ordinary Sunday collections were, \$2,216, and the special, including Thanksgiving-day collections, were \$657.

The Session have much pleasure in reporting an addition of 48 new members since last annual report, among whom are a number of young people from the Sunday School. The number of members on the Roll reported in March last, was 543. Since that date 18 have been admitted to full communion with the Church on profession of faith, 23 have been received as certified members from other Congregations, and 7 were re-admitted after absence. During the same time 5 were removed from the roll by certificate, 10 by death, and 7 by action of the Session. The Communion Roll, after revision, numbers 569 members in full communion with the Church, being a net increase of 26 members since last Report.

In the course of the year ten of the membership have been removed by death, several of whom were office-bearers in the Congregation, whose services will be missed in the departments of Church work in which they took an active part. Among those who have thus passed away from the present into the veiled beyond of the life everlasting, the Session have been bereft of two of their most valued members, ANDREW DRUMMOND and ROBERT CASSELS, in regard to whom the following minutes were recorded:

“The Kirk Session desire to record their deep sense of the loss which they and the Congregation have sustained by the death of Mr. Robert Cassels, who died on the seventeenth of June last, in the fifty-third year of his age, God in his providence having called him away in the prime of life, and in the midst of a career of usefulness in Christian service. He became connected with the Congregation, as a certified member of the Church from Peterboro in 1872, and for several years rendered valuable service in the management of its temporal affairs, having been President of the Temporal Committee for seven successive years. He was elected to the Eldership in 1892, and his services in that office were highly appreciated. In all his intercourse with the members of the Congregation he exemplified the characteristics of the Christian gentle-

man. The Session will especially miss his wise counsel in their future deliberations.

“The Session, as sharers in the burden of sorrow which must bear most heavily upon the widow and family of their departed brother, desire to extend to them their sincere sympathy in this time of sore bereavement, and would commend them to that never failing source of comfort and consolation which flows from the infinite compassion of the Heavenly Father, who has promised to be a Husband of the widow and a Father of the fatherless.

“In recording the death of Mr. Andrew Drummond, who died on the 24th of August last, in the eighty-eighth year of his age, the Kirk Session realize the severe loss they have sustained by the removal of one of their number, who possessed so many estimable qualities of heart and mind ; and who was so conscientious in the discharge of his official duties, so wise as a counsellor, and so courteous and conciliatory in his deportment. He was ordained an Elder of the Presbyterian Church nearly sixty years ago, and as an occasional representative Elder he was well and favourably known in the higher courts of the Church. He was received into the Eldership of this Congregation in 1844, and rendered efficient service under the successive pastorates of the Revd. Messrs. McKid, Durie, Spence, Gordon, and the present incumbent. During the pastorate of the Rev. Dr. Spence he removed from Ottawa and was absent for seventeen years, but returned in 1866 and resumed his former position as a member of this Session, and continued to discharge the duties of his office with great fidelity, until the Great Head of the Church relieved him from earthly service and called him into rest.

“In all important matters recorded in the history of the Congregation, Mr. Drummond took a prominent part and lent the aid of his varied abilities and experience in the management of Church affairs. The Session especially recall the great interest he manifested in the planning and building of the present Church, and the time and attention he gave to secure its completion ; his knowledge of architecture enabled him to render valuable assistance in selecting the style, as well as in superintending the erection of the beautiful edifice in which the Congregation now worship.

“He enjoyed the public services of the Church, and until recently was very regular in his attendance at its ordinances ; but latterly the infirmities of age seldom permitted him to be present at more than the communions of the Congregation, from which he was never willingly absent, and now, that he has been called away from fellowship with the Church militant to that of the Church triumphant, his venerable form will be missed at future communions, but the memory of his consistent Christian character, blameless life, and faithful service will be cherished by all who came in contact with him in social life or Christian fellowship.

“The Session sincerely sympathize with the members of his family in their sore bereavement and would commend them to the infinite compassion of Him who can comfort as a mother comforteth, and who has promised to be a Father to the fatherless, and the orphans’ shield and stay”.

In consequence of the diminished strength of the Session by the removal of one Elder to Montreal, and of three others by death, it was deemed necessary that the number of Elders should be increased so that the districts into which the Congregation is divided might be provided with an Elder, or Elders, for each, the Session therefore requested the Congregation to elect five new Elders to represent them in the Session. This election took place last month, and resulted in the election, ordination and induction of the following members, namely : Prof. J. W. Robertson, Messrs. Gilbert Allan, L. H. Alexander, Dr. Thos. Gibson and Mr. J. A. Gemmill. The Session having extended a cordial welcome to these members who have been called to take part with them in the oversight of the Congregation, good results are anticipated from this acquisition of strength.

During the Pastor’s three months summer vacation, his pulpit was supplied by Rev. Prin. Grant, Rev. Prof. Kerswell, and Rev. Mr. Milne. Notwithstanding the excellence of the pulpit supply the attendance at most of the services in mid-summer was much less than usual, in consequence, probably, of so many families being out of town recuperating in quiet rural retreats, or other places of summer resort. Pastor returned from his visit to Britain, with health improved, and, shortly afterwards, resumed his ministerial duties with renewed energy and quickened zeal. And the members of the Congregation returning from their holidays about the same time, the pews were gradually filled by their presence as usual at the services of the Church.

The Session refrain from reporting the details of work done by the several organizations now existing in the Congregation, as these will be given in the reports of the office-bearers of each, which are to be presented at the Annual Meeting. The Session commend these reports to the attention of the membership generally.

In closing their report the Session may state that the Glebe Mission, which is still under the fostering care of this Church, has made good progress since last report. In April last the Rev. Mr. Milne was appointed to labour there as ordained Missionary, and under his ministry the Mission having increased in membership and means of supporting religious ordinances, the Presbytery of Ottawa recently raised it to the status of a regular organized Congregation, and shortly afterwards the Rev. Mr. Milne was called and inducted as its first Pastor; but while it has in a certain sense become an independent Congregation it has not yet gained strength sufficient to be self-sustaining, and must still look to this Church for some measure of assistance financially. The Session have therefore promised to assist in the payment of its minister's stipend to the extent of four hundred dollars for the year ending 1st January next. After that date it is expected that a smaller grant will be required from this Church.

REPORT OF GLEBE TRUSTEES.

To the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa :

The Glebe Trustees of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa, beg to present the following report for the year ending 1st March, 1899 :

During the year payments have been steadily made upon the lots sold by the Trustees, and the total collections reached the sum of \$15,055.41, of which \$14,141.25 was paid on account of principal and \$914.16 on account of interest.

New sales have been made during the year, principally in Spenceville, which has been almost entirely sold out ; the sales being, in the City, nineteen and one-half lots for \$6.025 ; in Spenceville, forty-five lots for \$7,250, making a total of \$13,275. The result is that, although a very large sum has been collected during the year, the balance payable on sales and mortgages is almost as large as it was on the 1st March, 1898. At that date the balance payable was \$21,097.06, as against \$20,703.21 on the 1st March of this year.

The Trustees have paid during the year to the Temporal Committee, under different By-laws, for the purpose of reducing the Church debt, the sum of \$15,000, reducing the balance upon the mortgage to Mr. Manuel to \$15,000. They have also paid, under By-law No. 33, a sum of \$1,513.54 to the Temporal Committee, being the expenditure for the maintenance of the Glebe Mission during the last three years.

The Treasurer has compiled a statement of the amounts paid since the incorporation of the Glebe Trustees for advances to the Temporal Committee and for payment of the mortgages on the Church property, shewing in all a sum amounting to \$83,016.42.

The number of lots remaining unsold in Spenceville is 18, and in the City 540.

The Ladies' Aid Society have much pleasure in presenting this, their twenty-sixth Annual Report.

The meetings have been held, as formerly, on the second Friday of every month. Ten regular and four special meetings have been held during the past year, with an average attendance of 12; the largest number present at any one meeting being 21; the smallest, 8.

The Society still looks for its revenue from the voluntary offerings of its members and others interested in the work, and the amount realized from this source has been \$121.56. This sum, together with that received from donations, fees and the balance from last year, makes a total of \$238.84.

As was stated in last year's report the Society undertook to furnish a room in the Perley Home for Incurables, and the sum of \$50.00 has been given towards this object.

The Maternity Hospital has received \$25.00. In the main aisle of the Church a strip of carpet has been laid, costing \$23.72, and through the kind donation of our President, Mrs. Perley, the Society has been enabled to present the Church with a Baptismal Font.

At the Anniversary Social, held on the 25th of January, an excellent musical programme was carried out under the direction of Mr. Jenkins, while the ladies provided that "which cheers",

**ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE HOME
MISSIONARY SOCIETY.**

This report differs from any previous ones in the fact that during this year the Mission Church supported by this Society in far-off Lake Dauphin has become a self-sustaining congregation, mainly due to the assistance rendered by the funds sent out by this Society, and, as Dr. Robertson expressed it, we may call this field the child of St. Andrew's Home Missionary Society, and now turn our efforts to the growth of another. We feel that this is indeed a red-letter year, even though the funds have somehow fallen behind, and we must re-double our efforts in order to maintain our assured position.

The meetings have been held regularly on the first Friday of every month, and have been well attended. The monthly letters from the Missionary are heard with much interest and afford the hearers a vivid impression of life in these primitive settlements. Mr. Gourlay continued in charge of the Lake Dauphin Church until mid-summer when it became a self-sustaining congregation; and although the people gave him a call to continue as their Pastor, he had accepted a charge at Thornhill.

Dr. Robertson addressed the Society in May, and gave a most interesting account of Mission work in the North-west, and especially referred gratefully to the help and encouragement given by this Society; and after describing two or three points for which this Society might now work, the Swan River district was selected as being a most promising field. Mr. Meban was then in charge, but was succeeded in August by Rev. Mr. Johnson from Nova Scotia, and judging from his interesting letters seems to be the right man in the right place. Swan River is fully 100 miles from a post office, but the railway is expected in there in the spring, and land is being rapidly taken up and the outlook is very promising. The men had rallied around him and had helped him to build a log hut, and he held services every Sunday and visited the people for many miles distant. One of the surveyors had lent

In December the ladies sent out the usual Christmax box by a kind friend, and it was filled with gifts of warm clothing, toys, books, etc., for distribution among the people.

At the Thank-offering in April the sum of \$122.00 was realized, and on this occasion Her Excellency the Countess of Aberdeen addressed the meeting on the work and aims of the nurses being sent out to the Klondyke.

In October the sum of \$150.00 was sent to Dr. Robertson towards Mr. Johnson's salary.

In December a lecture was given by Mr. Tyrrell on the Klondyke, illustrated by lime-light views of Dr. Ami's, and the sum of \$14.00 was realized in behalf of the Society's funds.

Before the departure of our Honorary President, Lady Aberdeen, this Society resolved to give her a tangible expression of their regard in the form of a framed portrait of our Pastor, which was most cordially acknowledged, with the request that her name continue in that office.

With these facts we close this account of the year's work, and trust that the new year will be one of increased usefulness and activity.

Miss Ross and Miss McDonald had to relinquish for some months the charge of the Young Women's Bible Class and the Infant Class respectively on account of ill health, but have resumed their work in these important departments of the school.

We shall be glad to receive offers of service from those who may be disposed to assist in the work of instructing the young in Christian truth.

The Library has been replenished by the addition of several hundred books, the cost of which was defrayed by the generosity of the Treasurer of the Temporal Committee.

Christmas Day was specially observed by the school assembling at morning service in the Church, when Mr. Herridge gave an interesting address on the subject of unselfishness. The service was brightened by floral decorations and appropriate music. On the previous Sunday the scholars brought gifts of toys, books, provisions, etc., for distribution during the week, thus bringing Christmas cheer to many homes less favoured than their own.

On the 3rd of February the Annual Festival was held and proved to be one of the most successful entertainments ever given by the school. The Hall was crowded by scholars, parents and friends, who thoroughly enjoyed the varied programme.

The teachers are encouraged by the interest of the parents and earnestly desire their co-operation in the preparation of the lessons at home, and in united prayer that the seed sown may be watered by the Divine Spirit.
