PROCEEDINGS OF THE
ANNUAL MEETING.

The Anniversary of the Society was held on Sunday and Monday, June 9th and 10th, in the Bible Christian Church, Mitchell. On Sunday two Sermons were preached; in the morning by Bro. J. Kenner, and in the evening by Bro. A. larke. In the after noon a public service was held in connection with the Sabbath School; addresses were delivered by Bros. W. Ayers, and S. H. Rice. On Monday, at 2:30 p.m., the public meeting commenced, Bro. J. J. Rice, the President, occupied the chair. The Secretary, J. Harris, read the Report, when the following resolution was moved by Bro. H. J. Nott, and seconded by W. Quance:

Res. That the Report, an abstract of which has been read, be adopted, and published under the direction of the Missionary Committee. We would also express our thanks to the friends who have aided us during the year by their prayers, sympathies, and cash; and to the Collectors for their self-denying labor and co-operation.

The meeting then adjourned for tea. At the adjourned meeting, J. Hull, Esq., of Lakefield, presided; Bro. T. Mason moved, and Bro. G. Webbers econded the following resolutions:

REPORT.

The age in which we live is remarkable for the great progress made in our knowledge of physical science, and a general possession of intelligence among the people at large. The days of mediaeval darkness have passed away, and the disposition to inquire after truth, possessed by the early reformer, has passed, from the few, to the many. In all branches of scientific and secular knowledge, new discoveries are being made. The knowledge thus gained is promptly laid before the nations through the agency of the press, in its periodical literature, from the Quarterly Review to the Daily Newspaper. Amidst such multiplied and varied activities, it behoves the Church to "arise and shine," to faithfully testify, by word and life, of the "Lamb of God which taketh away the sin of the world." When the minds of men are absorbed by science and nature, there is a tendency to forget the spiritual, and to regard their teachings as comprehending the whole of truth. This brought the ancients to regard sun, moon, and stars, as being supreme deities; in later ages has produced pantheism; among modern scientists, has made natural laws and fitness of things the first causes; and the worldly-minded of to-day to look upon earthly wealth and pleasure as the sum of all blessedness. Thus these partial truths have brought the ancient pagan and the modern sceptic, the sage philosopher, and the most grovelling peasant to the same point of forgetfulness of God, and their own spiritual nature. In view of this we may well call to mind the statements of Christ to the Church: "Ye are the salt of the earth" "Ye are the light of the world." The work of the church is not to discredit the teaching of nature and science; but to bring the seasoning and enlightening powers of Gospel truth and grace to the hearts and lives of men, that God may be seen as the creator of the Heavens and the earth, and the things that therein are; and felt as the Almighty Saviour, who saves the people from their sins.

The Bible Christian Denomination has ever concentrated its efforts to lead men to Christ; to teach the Gospel truth. Originating among a few people, struggling after Gospel light and life, in the remote districts of the West of England, the Denomination has endeavored to be true to its call, and mission; and has from the beginning devoted much attention to missionary work. At the present time, the operations of the Parent Society extend through various parts of England, Scotland, and Wales; the Isle of Wight, the Channel, and Scilly Islands; South Australia, Victoria, Queensland, and New Zealand.

We present a short account of the opening of the Canadian Mission by the English Conference.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND.

In the year 1829, Mr. J. Ayers and others, who had been connected with the Bible Christian Church, emigrated from Devonshire, England, to Prince Edward Island, and being desirous of again enjoying the ministrations of their own church, sent to the Conference, asking that a preacher be sent out to them. The Conference secured the services of Francis Metherall for this work, who landed on the Island in 1831. Mr. Laird gave the Denomination twelve acres of land at Vernon River; here Bro. Metherall settled. A parsonage was erected, and Bro. Metherall lived in it sixteen years. The labor performed by the first Missionary must have been very arduous. His Circuit was composed of the following preaching places: Vernon River, Murray Harbor, Three Rivers, Union Road, Winsloe Road, Wheatley River, Malpeque Road, Rustico, New London, New Bideford, and Cascumpec. Through this Circuit, about one hundred miles long, Bro. Metherall toiled alone, only aided by the societies and Local Preachers, for four years. In 1835 Philip James was sent to his assistance, a man of deep piety and sterling worth, who labored a few years, and then was called to Ontario. A few others labored for a short time, then Bro. J. W. Butcher entered the work. The English Conference sent out William Harris, and William Calloway, and Jesse Whitlock was taken out on the Island. The difficulties encountered were great, the privations of the missionaries were numerous, but trusting in the Master whom they served,

“They labored on at God’s command,
And offered all their work to Him.”

ONTARIO.

Letters were sent to the Conference, held at Hick’s Mill, Cornwall, asking for a Missionary from T. Courtice and others, of Darlington; and T. Thomas, and others, of Dummer. There being a difficulty in finding a man to offer for this Canadian work, John Eynon stated that he was willing to go if he was of any service. His offer being accepted, Bro. Eynon came to Upper Canada in 1833. He landed at Cobourg, and there resided for some

time. He preached his first sermon the Sabbath after his arrival, in Cobourg Jail; his next service, the same day, was held in the open air, in Cobourg. The next Sabbath was spent in the neighborhood of Columbus, Whitby Township. The third Sunday found the Missionary in Dummer Township, where he found on what is now known as the "English Line," the "Chapel," that the English Conference was informed, was already built for the use of the Missionary. Said chapel being built of logs, with trough roof, and not a particle of iron or glass in the whole building.

The first Circuit extended from Grafton westward to Columbus, a distance of about sixty miles, and from Cobourg northward to Dummer, a distance of about fifty miles. The first preaching appointments were Grafton, Cobourg, Precious Corners, Guideboard, (Welcome) Zion, Hope Township, Wm. Elford's house, Darlington, Bowmanville, G. Smith's house near Hampton, Columbus, Two rod Road, 5th Con. Whitby, English Line, Dummer, McFadden's settlement, Payne's settlement, Duoro. The first church built was at Precious Corners, near Cobourg. The first Quarterly Meeting was held in the Elford's settlement, Darlington, the receipts for the support of the Missionary, were fifty cents. Among others in attendance at this meeting, were Humphrey Rundle, and his wife Grace, and on their way home with their two children, a pack of wolves in full cry began to follow on their trail. Humphrey caught up the boy, (the late W. Rundle, of Darlington) while Grace took charge of the girl, and ran for their lives, and had only just got inside their house, when five ravening wolves came up to be disappointed of their expected prey.

The first church built by any denomination in Darlington or Bowmanville, and the next to the one built at Precious Corners, by the B. C. Church, was erected in Darlington, one Concession south of the present Providence Church, at a cost of £10, and it was with great difficulty paid for, on account of the great scarcity of money among the settlers. There were scarcely any roads worth the name in those days, mere trails through the woods, the trees being blazed to indicate the right direction.

Bro. Eynon for a considerable time performed all his journeys on foot, through his extensive circuit, holding meetings every day in the week, taking a month to get

around his field of labor. And such was his zeal, that finding he had one day in the month without any appointment, he went into the Township of Asphodel, and preached once in the month to a congregation of Presbyterians, till they felt able to get a preacher of their own.

The following persons composed the first list of Local Preachers who nobly aided in the blessed work: Humphrey Rundle, Wm. Elford, Christopher Courtice, Wm. Werry, Grace Rundle, and Betsy Eynon. As the work in Canada advanced, additional Missionaries were sent from England to extend and consolidate that work; for most of the first preaching appointments possessed the germs of several future churches. We have now within the bounds of the first Circuit, about as many Circuits as there were then preaching places. Next to J. H. Eynon, came J. Kemeys, P. James, J. Edwards, T. Greene, and J. Tapp.

In 1843, the English Committee instructed Bro. Eynon, to visit the western parts of Ontario, and ascertain if there were any settlements destitute of the Gospel. In harmony with those instructions, he set out on a journey to St. Thomas, London, Exeter, Colborne, and Mitchell. The people were found to be largely destitute of Gospel privileges. At this time there were in the village of Mitchell, one frame house, (Hick's Hotel) one log house, and three or four shanties. Hick's Hotel was the first preaching place and preacher's home in Mitchell. Philip James was at once sent into what was then known as the Huron Tract; his first Circuit embraced the townships of Usborne, Stephen, Colborne, Logan, Fullarton, and Downey; and the flourishing Bible Christian Churches and congregations in those townships to-day, testify of the faithful labors, and godly zeal of Philip James and Arthur Doble, in their efforts to carry the Gospel of Christ to the people, who in the days of their poverty were hewing out homes for themselves in the wilderness.

The following incidents shows the spiritual hunger in those early days, also the power of believing prayer. The wife of Mr. Morris, one of the early settlers in the township of Colborne, hearing that a neighbor was a religious man, went and asked him to call the people together, and read the Scriptures and pray with them. He tried to excuse himself, saying he could not pray in public, he could only pray a

"bit" in the family. A prayer meeting was however held; Mrs. Morris' mind was so absorbed with the spiritual wants of the people, that she could only pray "Lord send us a preacher! Lord send us a preacher!" and so confident was she that the Lord would answer her prayer, that when, some time after, she saw Philip James coming towards the house on horseback, she ran with joy to inform the family that the preacher was coming, though she had no previous knowledge of the man or his coming.

In 1855, the work had become sufficiently strong to be organized into a distinct Conference, and ceased to draw any further monetary aid from England. There were at that time, in the Canadian Conference, and Prince Edward Island District, 29 ministers, 62 churches, 2572 church members, and \$3,693 missionary receipts for that year. At the present time (1878) there are 82 ministers, 182 churches, 7,744 members, \$18,158.46 missionary receipts, and church and parsonage property acquired to the value of \$425,000, showing an increase for the 23 years of 53 ministers, 120 churches, 5,172 members, and \$14,465.46 missionary receipts.

By reference to our Balance Sheet, it will be seen that we have a debt of about \$26,000.00, all of which has been expended on legitimate mission work. It will be impossible to extend our operations till the most of this is provided for. We confidently appeal to our friends, so to increase their donations as to relieve the society of its present indebtedness; we do this with greater assurance, knowing that all the other departments of our denominational work are in easy financial circumstances.

The following are condensed reports from the Pastors of the various missions:—

BELLEVILLE.—Numerous removals and unfaithfulness have considerably lessened our numbers, while the monetary depression has discouragingly affected our finances—yet we are not slow to recognize some bright spots in the cloud. 1st. There are to be found among us loving hearts, cheerful minds, and willing hands to wait on, trust in, and do for God. 2nd. We have not been without seasons of refreshing coming from the presence of the Lord. 3rd. The word of the Lord is true, "They shall prosper that love

thee." We therefore pray and wait for the dawning of a brighter day.

HUNGERFORD.—We cannot report that degree of prosperity that we desire, yet the year has not been wholly unfruitful; we have had tokens of the Divine goodness, and are comforted by the assurance that our labor hath not been in vain in the Lord. Several of the societies are in a low state, and we are wont to exclaim, "By whom shall Jacob arise, for he is small?" Financially several causes have combined to make the year one of unprecedented depression; so that our position in this respect is not very cheering. We are however still sowing in hope.

CAMPBELLFORD.—The Master has given us tokens for good in the conviction and conversion of precious souls. We held two special meetings, at the English Line, and at Breaws. At each place many professed conversion, and the blessing of God rested upon us. To Him be all the glory. The congregations on the whole are good. We are starting a Sabbath School at Breaws, with fair hopes of success. We have an increase of 26 approved members after losing 51 by removals, &c. The finances are in a good condition, the debt on the parsonage has been reduced to \$589.51. We thank God for past success, and hope for better days in the future.

PERRYTOWN.—This has been a year of labor and anxiety, some souls have been converted to God. The experiences related in our class meetings are expressive of faith in Christ as an all-sufficient Saviour, and growth in the Divine life, which has been corroborated in most instances in public life. A noble effort has been made by the friends of this mission in removing \$171.00 of the debt on Perrytown Church. The Quarterly Receipts though equal to the corresponding quarters of last year, are not what they ought to be, considering the number of families attending our places of worship.

PORT HOPE.—The moral status and spiritual life of the society have somewhat improved. Latterly we have observed with much satisfaction an increase as to numbers and interest in both the public and social means of grace, while good-will and harmony prevail. In our Sabbath School operations, we have enjoyed unusual prosperity, as seen in a large increase of scholars, the purchase of a \$40 library,

nearly the whole school being pledged to total abstinence, and 8 of the scholars professing saving faith, and uniting with the church. Financially we have had difficulties, nevertheless, we have succeeded in meeting the year's current expenses, and paying \$60.00 for repairs, besides reducing the original indebtedness of the society \$100.00.

PICKERING.—In reviewing the year's labors, we are grateful to be able to report as large an amount of work performed as any year of our toil in the Master's vineyard, and not a service omitted through sickness. We have held about seven services a week since our coming on this Circuit. We have been much cheered in our work by the hearty co-operation of the officials, and especially by the manner in which our able staff of Local Preachers have performed their work; without them we could not sustain the work of God among us on this Circuit. Their labors are appreciated by the church, and blessed of God to the profit of souls. The Societies have been living in peace, and the means of grace have been to us seasons of refreshing, coming from the presence of the Lord. Our special efforts at Frenchman's Bay, and Ebenezer, were crowned with some success. At the former place we have formed a Society of 18 persons, and at Ebenezer about the same number were admitted on trial.

UXBRIDGE.—The congregations have somewhat improved during the year, but owing to a large number of removals, and other causes, we report a decrease in the membership. Unanimity generally prevails, and the societies are attaining to more durable things in their religious life, and are daily showing the power of religion. The Sabbath School at Uxbridge has greatly improved in proficiency. A good work has been done in remodeling and rebuilding the Parsonage, making it a very suitable residence for a minister.

PRINCE ALBERT.—Owing to the sickness of the Pastor, and other difficulties, all the work has not been accomplished that we anticipated a year ago, yet, in the midst of all, we can say God hath been with us. Special meetings have been held at Bethel, Prince Albert, and Bethesda; there have been admitted to the societies 30 persons during the year. More than usual interest is being taken in our S. S. department. There is room for hope in relation to the future of this mission, that with toil and faithfulness on the

part of the ministry, and interest, energy, and a genuine spirit of Christian liberality on the part of the members at the different appointments, it might soon pass to the list of Self-supporting Circuits

TORONTO.—The year just closed has been one of much care and anxiety. The too heavy debt on the church had to be seriously lessened, so that the calculable income from church sources might meet the inevitable expenditure for interest and insurance, whilst other expenses for ordinary disbursements and a considerable outlay for a much-needed alteration in Bible Class, and other accommodation had to be met, and this, in a year of unprecedented monetary depression; but out of all, through God's help, we have come safely and successfully. The church debt has been reduced to \$4,800, so that with due care and management, it has been placed in workable, if not easy, circumstances; whilst all other expenditures are fully met, and outstanding accounts and balances settled. The Sabbath School is much improved, and we hope for it, increasing usefulness. We have again to report removals and losses, but notwithstanding, the number of members is increased, and everything considered, the position and prospects of the church are much better than before. Through the terrible dearth of money and work, our friends have been repeatedly called on to assist the distressed in our midst, which they have done as for Christ. They have given bread to the hungry, clothing to the naked, and in other ways, have done good, leaving the results to God.

MANVERS & CARTWRIGHT.—During the year, the work has moved on very evenly; a few souls have been converted to God, so that after filling up vacancies caused by removals, &c., we return about the same number of members as last year. The congregations continue good, and the interest in the cause generally, is unabated, while general harmony prevails.

PETERBORO.—Two special services were held during the year. At Bethel, where we labored hard and hopefully, comparatively little good was accomplished. At Peterboro, about thirty persons professed faith in Christ, many of whom have been received as probationers for membership. Our congregations in the country continue good, while in the town, an encouraging increase has been realised. More pews have been rented, and the membership is steadily increasing. The Sabbath Schools are in an encouraging con-

dition, and means of growth. As a whole, we have had only real difficulties. It has been the heaviest which has prevailed, though that with a the same liberality shall soon prevail.

dition, and have proved a nursery to the church. The social means of grace are generally well attended, and on the whole, we have reason to thank God, and take courage. The only real difficulty with which we have had to grapple, has been the heavy financial liabilities on the town property, which has taxed (during the monetary depression that has prevailed) the utmost energies of the society; but we trust that with a lessened amount to pay as interest, and with the same liberality and effort on the part of the friends, we shall soon place the trust estate in easy circumstances.

ASHBURNHAM.—Unbroken peace and harmony have prevailed through the year. The congregations have considerably increased, and the attendance at the prayer meetings has much improved. Special meetings were held five weeks resulting in the quickening of the church and the conversion of several souls.

LINDSAY.—We have suffered very much from removals and deaths, the congregation, nevertheless, has rather increased. The parsonage house has been improved at the cost of \$27. \$100. has been paid on the church debt.

FENELON.—The Lord has been with us. The attendance on the means of grace is encouraging. Our Local Brethren have worked very harmoniously with the people, and we feel to say, "How good and pleasant it is for Brethren to dwell together in unity." We have many good friends who give proofs of their zeal for, and attachment to, the Denomination, and desire its welfare in every respect. A few persons have been raised from a death of sin to a life of righteousness.

SUTTON.—The congregations continue good; the Sabbath-school at Sutton is much improved, and several persons have united with the Church. The parsonage property has been improved to the amount of \$75. without increasing the debt, and a new organ has been procured for the Sutton Church. At Ravenshoe \$47. has been expended in improving the church. At Egypt the debt on the property has been paid off.

PALMERSTON.—God has poured out His Spirit, and saved some precious souls, so that we are able to report an increase in our membership. The societies are living in peace, and are praying for greater prosperity. At Palmerston the congregation has somewhat improved, while the Sabbath

school is larger than formerly. At Maitland we have succeeded in getting deeded to the Connexion the church and property formerly occupied by the late Methodist New Connexion. A new driving shed has been built and paid for, and a Sabbath school has been organized with cheering prospects. A new appointment has been taken up at Fordwich, where good congregations are in attendance, and there is a promise of good permanent success.

WIARTON.—We are pleased to report progress in the several departments of our work. Oxendon Church has been built at a cost of \$500., \$450. of which have been provided for. Colpoys Church has been painted outside and inside, and otherwise improved at a cost of \$100. Wiarton Church has been completed, and shed erected with school room over, at a total cost of \$400. Numerically we report a small increase. Financially we have done well considering the monetary depression.

CLINTON—Reports the successful dedication of our new Church, largely increased congregations, and flourishing Sabbath School in town. Revival in numbers and interest at Holmesville; prayer and class-meetings improving, and a new appointment taken up on London Road with fair prospects; justify gratitude for the past and hope for the future. To work this ground efficiently, a second preacher should be employed.

HAMILTON.—We report progress in every department of our church operations. Our congregations are considerably increased, our membership has more than doubled; financially we are growing, and with present prospects, we will, in a few years, develop into a self-supporting station. Our social means of grace are well sustained, and prove seasons of great spiritual profit. Pew-holders are more than twice as many as at the beginning of the year. Our Sunday collections are 50 per cent. better than a year ago. Our Sabbath-school is in a healthy condition, and promises to be a constant feeder to the church. The "Temperance Reform Club" organized about the middle of January, is doing a good work; most of our church members are members thereof, and many of them are zealously affected in *this good cause*. Our members are living in peace, and many are earnestly striving for the higher life—"perfecting holiness in the fear of the Lord." On the whole, we occupy a van-

tage ground to-day never before possessed by us, in Hamilton; and by past success and with present prospects, we are encouraged to labor on at God's command, until the Master shall say "it's enough, up higher now come."

DEREHAM—has been making progress. The congregations continue good. An appointment has been taken up at Dereham Centre, and a society formed of 13 members; the Free Will Baptists leased us their church for 10 years, rent free.

INGERSOLL.—The congregations have considerably improved during the year. Generally we live in peace, if not in great prosperity, and are not without hope of better days. We see cause for encouragement in the Sabbath School department.

PUTNAMVILLE—The congregations continue good, a fresh appointment has been taken up with fair prospects, but our membership has considerably lessened.

ST. THOMAS.—This mission has been passing through very trying circumstances. After a year of anxious toil the Pastor reports: we are now in a more healthy state than we have been since our first year's operation, as a mission. The pruning knife has been applied with judicious vigor, which we hope will result in good to all concerned. Financially, with an exception or two, the doings of our friends will compare favorably with any other part of our mission field. The Quarterly Receipts are in advance of any of the past three years. The congregations during the last six months have considerably improved. During the special meetings, believers were quickened, and a few souls were added to the church. The Sabbath School is in a fairly prosperous condition, and the workers in that department have reason to "thank God and take courage." A closer union with the GREAT HEAD, and a more enduring fellowship with each other, are what we especially need, while we unite to pray, "O Lord revive thy work."

LAMBETH.—It affords us pleasure to be able to report that we have realised of late, some degree of prosperity. The congregations at Delaware and Lambeth are good. We have suffered by removals, but we hope the Lord will raise up others to take their places; we thank God that already the ranks are filling, several having joined the church lately, and bid fair to become pillars in the temple of our God, to go no more out.

COLCHESTER.—We have had seasons of great refreshing. The Master has visited us. A few precious souls have been given us for our hire. At Bethel a society has been formed, and a S. S. organized, which promise a prosperous future. A new appointment has been taken up at Colchester Station, under favorable auspices. The congregations are generally well sustained. The Church Property has improved to the amount of about \$200.

WINDSOR.—In the earlier part of the year, several souls were saved by divine grace, and we were looking forward expecting greater prosperity. But while men slept the enemy came, and our church was soon burnt to the ground. The friends went to work like true men, and to-day we have a splendid brick church built on the ruins of the former one. We have also erected a commodious Parsonage.

TALBOTVILLE.—When we called unto the people saying, "Seek ye the Lord while He may be found, call upon Him while He is near, then the Redeemer came to Zion, and unto them that turned from their transgressions, to give unto them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; that they might be called the trees of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that He might be glorified."

NEWBURGH, U.S.—Through all our difficulties and darkness, the Lord has graciously led and brought us thus far, and our people are enabled to put their trust in Him. A few persons have been converted during the year, some of whom united with us, so that after allowing for those whose names were taken from our list, we report an increase of four members.

WEST CAPE, P. E. I.—Some of the regular services have been seasons of blessings. Our congregations are large, the attention to the Word close and discriminating. On the whole, we think our work has become more consolidated, and trust that with the improvement of the times, faithful and united labor, and judicious legislation on the part of the Conference, this station will rise.

WHEATLEY RIVER, P. E. I.—Many have been the seasons of refreshing which we have realized while waiting upon God, and our hearts have been gladdened in witnessing the conversion of a few precious souls. The Wheatley River and Rustico congregations continue good. At Wheatley

SUMMERSIDE, P. E. I.—We have held some special meetings, but the effects produced by them were apparently small. School, and we hope that ere long many therein may be brought to call the Redeemer blessed.

LITTLE PRAIRIE, U.S.—A new appointment has been taken up at La Grange, and a Society formed of nine persons, as a result of the Divine blessing attending special efforts, through which several were led to renounce their evil ways, to seek and to find the Lord. At the commencement of the year, the financial liabilities awakened considerable concern, which resulted in a special effort being made to meet them. We have collected from the old subscription list \$326.50, and by our effort this year, \$407.10, making a total of \$733.60. We hope soon to free ourselves from debt, and that being done, to pass into a Self-sustaining Circuit. May that time hasten.

BURLINGTON, U.S.—We are thankful to report that peace and brotherly love continue to dwell with us. The class meetings are seasons of refreshment. We believe there is spiritual life and power in the societies; all are working together harmoniously.

LONDON 2ND.—We have an increase of 13 approved members over last year. The Sunday Schools have prospered well. There has been raised, in addition to Quarter Board and Church expenses, more than \$800. If the Conference agree to the proposed change, and allow the labors of two men for the next year, doubtless the future will be increasingly bright.

THE REVISED CONSTITUTION OF THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE BIBLE CHRISTIAN CHURCH IN CANADA.

I. This institution shall be designated the "Bible Christian Missionary Society, in Canada."

II. The object of this Society is to excite and combine, in a plan more systematic and efficient than has been heretofore accomplished, the exertions of the societies and congregations, (and others who are friends to the extension of the Gospel) in the support and enlargement of Missions, which are carried on under the sanction and direction of the Conference of the Bible Christian Church in Canada.

III. Every person subscribing and paying annually the sum of two dollars and upwards, and every benefactor presenting a donation of twenty dollars and upwards, shall be deemed a member of this Society, and entitled as such, to a General Annual Report.

IV. All Bible Christian Missionary Societies which have already been formed, or which may be formed for the several Districts into which the Bible Christian Connexion is divided, shall be entitled "Auxiliary Bible Christian Missionary Societies" for the District in which they have been, or may be formed. All Bible Christian Missionary Societies already formed, or hereafter to be formed in the particular Circuits of any District, shall be entitled "Branch Bible Christian Missionary Societies," for the Circuits in which they are or shall be established. And Sabbath School, and Juvenile Annual Offerings are also earnestly recommended, where exertions of that nature are likely to be advantageous.

V. The Superintendent of each District shall be ex-officio, secretary and treasurer of the Auxiliary Society of his District: and every pastor of a Circuit shall, by virtue of his office be Secretary and Treasurer of the Branch Societies, of the Circuit over which he presides.

VI. The money raised in any Circuit for the Bible Christian Missions, by Branch Societies, or other local associations, and all other money, in whatever way collected for the same object, shall be regularly paid once every three months, or oftener, into the hands of the Treasurer of the Auxiliary Society, for the District in which the said Circuit is situated, with the deduction only of such sums as may have been disbursed for the incidental and local expenses of the Branch Society. And the Treasurer of every District Society shall remit to the Treasurers of the General Society every three months, or oftener, all sums so received by him from the various Circuits in his District, deducting only therefrom the necessary incidental expenses incurred by the Auxiliary Society.

VII. The Secretary of every Branch Society, or other local associations, shall forward annually to the Secretary of the Auxiliary Society of his District, a list of all the benefactors and subscribers during the preceding twelve months, with an account of their respective contributions. And the Secretary of every District Auxiliary Society shall also forward annually to the Secretary of the General Society, a similar list of all the subscribers and benefactors in all the Circuits of his District, an abstract of the accounts of the Auxiliary Society, showing its gross receipts, its local payments, and its remittances to the General Treasurer.

VIII. All benefactors of twenty dollars and upwards, and all subscribers of two dollars and upwards annually to any of the Auxiliary, or Branch Societies in connection with this Institution shall be deemed, in right of such benefaction or subscription, members of the General Society.

IX. All persons who collect to the amount of twelve dollars and upwards, annually, for this Institution, or for any of the Auxiliaries, Branches, or Associations, shall also be members of the General Society, and entitled to receive a copy of the Annual Report.

X. An annual public meeting of the members and friends of this Society, at such time and connected with such religious services as may be deemed expedient, shall be held at the place appointed by the Committee. At this annual meeting the officers of the Society shall be appointed.

XI. A General Committee shall be annually appointed by the Conference, to whom shall be entrusted (in the intervals of the annual assemblies of that body) the superintendence of the collection and disbursements of all money received for the Missions which are now, or may hereafter, be carried on under its sanction, and by the ministers in connection with it. And the Committee so appointed shall possess and exercise all the powers now possessed by the Missionary Committee and Board.

XII. The Superintendents of Districts shall require regular quarterly communications to be made by each of the Missionaries, on their respective Districts, to the Corresponding Secretary of the Society, giving information of the state and prospects of the several Missions on which they are employed.

XIII. It shall be the duty of the General Missionary Committee to furnish the General Treasurers of the Society with a schedule, setting forth the number of missions and mission schools, the place of location, and the amount appropriated for their support respectively, and the sum total of appropriations for the current year.

XIV. This Constitution shall not be altered, but by a general meeting of the Society, on the recommendation of the Conference and Committee.
