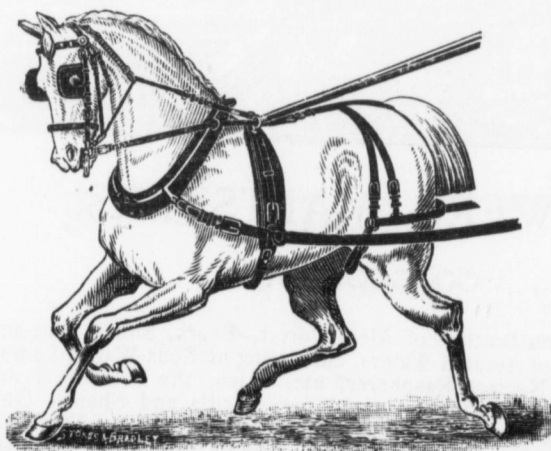

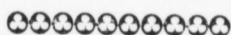

A Representative Assembly was first granted to this Colony in 1832, under the Governorship of Sir THOMAS COCHRANE. By the Constitution nine Districts were established, returning fifteen members, who were to hold their seats during Her Majesty's pleasure. In 1838 the members of the Assembly were elected for four years, and this term has been adhered to since that date. In 1854, upon the granting of Responsible Government, the number of members was increased, at the instance of the Imperial Government, to thirty. In 1874 the membership was further increased to thirty-one, by the addition of one member to the number of those representing the District of Twillingate and Fogo. In 1882 the number of members was increased to thirty-three, by the erection of St. George and St. Barbe into Districts, with one member each. In 1885, after the publication of the Census of 1884, a partial re-distribution

State correctly the Christian name and Surname of person to whom the Order is payable.

Should any alteration be made in the name of the person in whose favor an Order is drawn, a new Order will have to be issued and commission be paid thereon.

Unpaid Money Orders are legally void at the end of one year ; nevertheless, if any valid reason is adduced for delay in presentation, payment will be made upon application, subject to certain conditions.

To Postmasters.

Obtain from the presenter of a Money Order (whether he or she be the right owner or not) satisfactory information as to the christian name, surname and address of the person by whom drawn. In the case of a firm, the name of the firm and address will suffice. When an Order is presented through a bank, the Order being properly signed, must also be crossed with the banker's name.

Parcels not exceeding eleven pounds weight may be transmitted by post between places within the Colony (except to and from places with which postal communication is maintained by couriers carrying mails on foot), on payment of eight cents per pound weight, or two cents per quarter pound, and a further charge of two cents per quarter pound weight, or a fraction of a quarter pound above one pound. Such parcels shall not exceed three feet six inches as the greatest length, or six feet in length and girth combined, the girth being measured round the thickest part of the parcel. No parcel will be accepted which weighs more than eleven lbs., or that is not sufficiently paid; the postage upon all parcels must in all cases be paid in advance, by means of ordinary adhesive postage stamps. Such parcels may be registered, the fee therefor being three cents.

United Kingdom.

Parcels may be transmitted by Parcel Post to the United Kingdom (and through the United Kingdom with countries having a Parcel Post with the United Kingdom, of such weight, and at such special rates, as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Governor in Council), not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, nor three feet six inches in length, or six feet in length and girth measured together—the girth being measured around the thickest part of the parcel. The rate of postage on such parcels, which must in all cases be pre-paid, will be as follows: On parcels not exceeding three pounds in weight, twenty-four cents—this being the minimum charge; on parcels over three pounds in weight, up to seven pounds, forty-eight cents; over seven pounds and under eleven pounds, seventy-two cents—eleven pounds being the maximum weight. Parcels transmitted through the United Kingdom to countries with which the United Kingdom operates a parcel post system will be subject to the rates of postage chargeable by the United Kingdom on parcels to such countries,

The insured parcels will have all the safeguards of the registration system, and, subject to the following regulations, compensation will be paid if they are lost or damaged in the Post.

Compulsory Insurance.

It will be compulsory for the senders of parcels containing coin, jewelry, or any other article of gold or silver to insure the contents for at least part of their value.

Any uninsured parcel found in the United Kingdom to contain such articles will be compulsorily registered, the addressee being charged with a fee of 8d. stg. The same rule will be enforced in this Colony in regard to parcels from the United Kingdom.

None of the above regulations apply to parcels for the Dominion of Canada and the United States.

Dominion of Canada.

Parcels may be accepted at any Post Office in Newfoundland for the Dominion of Canada, subject to the conditions herein stated. The rate of postage being 15 cents per pound or fraction of a pound weight to all parts of Canada. No parcel can be forwarded if over seven pounds in weight, or if it measure more than two feet in length by one foot in width or depth.

United States.

Parcels are accepted for transmission to the United States subject to the following rates :—

Not exceeding one pound 12 cents.
For each pound or fraction of a pound 12 cents.

No parcel may exceed eleven pounds in weight, three feet six inches in length, or six feet in length and girth combined.

No parcel may contain a letter, post card, or any writing (by hand or otherwise, of the nature of personal correspondence), publications which violate the copyright laws, poisons, explosives, inflammable substances, liquids, or articles which easily liquify, confections and pastes, live or dead animals (except dead insects or reptiles, when thoroughly dried), fruits, vegetables, lottery tickets, circulars or advertisements, all obscene or immoral articles, or any article that may in any way injure or destroy mail matter or injure the official handling the same.

Registration.

Parcels may be registered at the following rate of fees, that is to say :

Inland or local rate, 3 cents ; to the United Kingdom, 4 cents ; to Canada and United States, 5 cents.

To all other countries the registration fee will be the same as the single rate of postage.

General.

No parcels shall be posted in a letter-box, but must in all cases be taken to the Post Office and presented at the wicket, where forms will be supplied and information given.

All foreign parcels received at the Post Offices in this Colony must be sent to the General Post Office, St. John's, to be made up in mails.

GENERAL DIRECTIONS TO THE PUBLIC.

Letters.

Register all valuable letters.

Always communicate to the Postmaster the loss or delay of letters, &c.

Letters for Canada should be addressed to the Province as well as the Post Office.

Letters for the United States should be addressed to the State as well as the Post Office.

Address letters, &c., legibly, and be careful to discriminate between places of the same name.

A letter once posted becomes the property of the person to whom addressed, and must be forwarded according to its directions. On no application, however urgent, can it be delivered back to the writer or to any other person.

Letters containing gold or silver money, jewels, or anything liable to Customs' duties, cannot be forwarded by post beyond the Colony. In the Colony they *must* be registered. Always seal letters containing anything of value.

Letters addressed to mere initials will not be delivered unless addressed in care of a resident or to some box in the Post Office.

Letters bearing mutilated stamps, or stamps so soiled and defaced as to make it impossible for the sorting clerks to decide whether they have been used before or not, will be sent to the Dead Letter Office for adjudication.

Unpaid and insufficiently paid letters and mailable matter, both local and foreign, will be charged, on delivery, with double the amount of postage unpaid.

Re-directed Letters.

Letters re-directed to places in Newfoundland, Great Britain, Canada and the United States, without being taken out of the Post Office, are not liable to any additional postage.

Request Letters.

Letters addressed to persons in Newfoundland, when sent in envelopes having written or printed thereon a request from the sender that

the letter, if not delivered at the office addressed within a certain time specified in the request, may be returned to his address as requested, will be returned to the sender at the expiration of the time specified.

Newspapers.

Always fully pre-pay newspapers, or such will be taxed double the amount insufficiently paid. Unpaid newspapers will not be forwarded.

A newspaper must have no cover, or a cover open at both ends, which can easily be withdrawn. It must contain no enclosure. It must have no writing thereon but the name and address of the person to whom it is sent.

Newspapers over four ounces are charged at book rate.

Books and Circulars.

A book packet must be left open for inspection, it must not contain any enclosure, nor must it exceed twenty-four inches in length, nor twelve inches in breadth or depth. The limit of weight of a book packet addressed to any place within the Colony, Great Britain, Canada, or the United States, is three pounds. Postage—one cent per two ounces. Circulars—one cent each under two ounces.

Patterns and Samples.

Bona fide patterns and samples of merchandize, not exceeding twenty-four ounces in weight, when posted in Newfoundland for places within Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one cent per two ounces weight, properly labelled, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection.

Packets of patterns and samples, addressed to any place in Newfoundland, can be registered on affixing thereto stamps of the value of three cents, in addition to postage stamps representing ordinary postage rate.

The limit of weight to Great Britain and British possessions is 5 lbs., the United States, 12 ounces, and all countries in Europe, 8 ounces—postage, two cents for the first four ounces, and one cent for every additional two ounces.

No article liable to Customs' duty can be sent as sample or pattern to a Postal Union country.

Registration.

Every letter and packet intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor. On no account should it be dropped into the letter-box. The registration fee must be pre-paid on registered letters addressed to the Government Departments in St. John's, and also on registers sent by the Government offices to the Outports. The registration fee on letters and parcels to places in Newfoundland is three cents, including official registration; to Great Britain, four cents; to Canada and the United States, five cents.

Letters containing coin, &c., will be forwarded in the Colony only (charged with double registration fee if posted without being registered). Always obtain a receipt for registered letter or packet.

Matter which cannot be forwarded by Post.

Any explosive, dangerous or destructive substance, liquids, or anything likely to injure the mails or the person of any officer or servant of the Post Office. A glass bottle, or glass in any form (except eye-glasses, microscopic slides and spectacles, when properly put up), matches, leeches, or fruit.

Letters containing gold or silver money, jewels, or anything liable to Customs' duty, cannot be sent out of Newfoundland.

The examination commences punctually at 10 a. m., and closes at 4 p. m., when all papers will be called up, and if not completed the candidate will be declared to have failed.

In all cases of failure the candidate will be examined *de novo*.

If failed in Seamanship, he will not be examined for six months.

If failed three times in Navigation, he will not be re-examined for three months.

Subsidized Mail Steamers, in connection with the Colony, shall pay on the horse-power, at the rate of eight cents for each horse-power.

No Steamer shall pay more than forty-eight dollars at one time.

All Coasting vessels which may take Pilots to pay one-half of the above rates of Pilotage in proportion to their tonnage.

The above scale of Pilotage shall be payable on the Register Tonnage of all such vessels, as ascertained before going out of the harbor.

Three Sail in sight—Yellow Pennant close up to yard.

Four Sail in sight—Yellow Pennant midway between yard and parapet of Block House.

Five Sail in sight—Same as four, with addition of a Ball placed immediately above Pennant.

Six Sail in sight—Same as three, with addition of a Ball placed immediately beneath Pennant.

Seven Sail in sight—Same as four, with addition of a Ball placed immediately beneath Pennant.

A Blue Pennant and Blue Burgee, when hoisted together, show that a Sail has passed the Narrows, going either North or South.

When a Merchant's House-flag is hoisted on the South Staff it denotes that a vessel belonging to said merchant is South of Cape Spear ; and, when hoisted on the North Staff, it shows that said vessel is in sight of the Block House.

When a Square White Flag with a Red Ball in the centre is hoisted either on the North or South Centre Staff, it denotes that a Steam-tug is required.

The International Code of Signals is also in use at the Block House, and the recognized House Signals of the different merchants.

24 cents per ton up to and including 500 tons.

12 cents per ton additional on every ton over 500 tons up to and including 1,000 tons.

6 cents per ton additional on every ton over 1,000 tons up to and including 2,000 tons.

Not more than \$240 in any one calendar year, or oftener than once in three months.

Vessels arriving for repairs, coal or supplies, pay one-half of above rates.

Labrador, bank and coast fishing vessels and coasters pay no dues whilst engaged in these fisheries or trade. Should any such vessel proceed on any other than a fishing voyage, to any place outside the colony, such vessel shall be liable to pay once in each calendar year (but not oftener than once in three months) the rate of six cents per ton.

St. Pierre Lights.

A *Revolving Light* on Galantry Head, giving white flash, lasting 8 4-10 seconds, followed after an interval of 9 6-10 seconds by a second white flash, lasting 8 4-10 seconds, then, after an interval of 12 6-10 seconds, by a red flash, lasting 8 4-10 seconds, another interval of 12 6-10 seconds, followed by the first white flash. Height, 210 feet above the level of the sea. Distance visible, 18 miles. The light is hidden at the northward by the high land of St. Pierre. Latitude $46^{\circ} 45' 43''$ N.; Longitude $56^{\circ} 9' 52''$ W. Tower square, 36 feet high, painted white.

The *South Channel* entrance to St. Pierre harbor is marked by two small fixed lights. One is white, illuminating three-fourths of the horizon; it is placed on the rocks at Pointe au Canne. The other is red, and is placed on the plain at the north of the town. The White light is 36 feet above the sea level, and is visible six miles. The Red light is 65 ft. above the sea level, and is visible three miles. The line connecting these two lights marks the middle channel. The Red light is so placed that as soon as it is seen on the left of Cape Aigle, vessels coming from Columbiar, in beating into the N. E. entrance, will be clear of the Cape Rodrigue Shoals.

Pointe a Leconte Light, situate on the west point of the Island of Dogs, 62 feet above the level of the sea, visible 7 miles. The light shows white between the bearings (from the tower) of S. E. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. and S. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. This white sector of the light marks the South-east passage, so as to permit vessels which keep within this cove to avoid the Bataille shoal on the right and Cape Noir and Bertrand Rocks on the left. It shows red from S. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., westward, to N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., and should be avoided by vessels entering by the S. E. passage. It will enable them when they have quit- ted the white cove to come to anchor in the Roadstead or in the Barachois, by following the line of white light from Pointe aux Canons and of the red light from the interior of the town.

Pointe Plate (Langlade) Light; 1st order dioptric, visible twenty miles. Latitude $46^{\circ} 48' 54''$ N.; Longitude $56^{\circ} 24' 10''$ W. Light Tower painted in black and white bands alternately.

Cape Blanc (Miquelon) Light; revolving; showing 10 seconds in each minute; visible 16 miles. Shows white from North through W. to S. W., covering the Seal Rocks with a red sector of light. It also lights the entrance to Miquelon Roads, showing 230 yards north of the Chatte Shoals, which are thus left in darkness. The lighthouse is painted in alternate horizontal bands, black and white. Lat. $47^{\circ} 05' 57''$ N.; long. $56^{\circ} 24' 10''$ W.

For Willow Grouse (Partridge) and other Grouse, or for eggs of the same, Jan'y 12th to Sept. 15th in any year. (Sale permitted Sept. 15th to January 12th.)

For Curlew, Plover, Snipe, or other wild or migratory birds (excepting Wild Geese), or the eggs of the same, 12th January to 15th Sept.

For Caribou, 1st February to 15th July, both days inclusive, and from 1st October to 20th October, both days inclusive, in any year.

For Moose or Elk, for ten years from the 1st January, 1896.

For Otters or Beavers, 1st April to 1st October, in any year.

For Rabbits and Hares, 1st March to 15th September.

For Herring—Seining—from 15th March to 25th April next following. Except as regards vessels prosecuting the Bank Fishery, which are allowed to take sixty barrels per voyage for bait. Inbarring prohibited between 25th April and 1st October next following.

For Herring—Inbarring from 25th April to 1st October next following.

For Salmon and Trout, in any lake, river or stream, 10th of September to 15th January next following.

NOTE—License to kill Caribou.—Two stag and one doe, \$40; three stag and one doe, \$50; five stag and two doe, \$80. First class good for four weeks; second class good for six weeks; third class good for two months, each from date of license. A first class license is issued to any officer of any British war ship stationed on Fishery Protection Service, free of charge.

SYNOPSIS OF LEGISLATION, 1899.

CAP. 1.—An Act respecting a Marine Court of Enquiry.—This Act confers on Marine Courts of Enquiry the power to inquire as to the conduct of any master who has failed to render assistance in cases of collision. It further provides that the said Court shall have power to cancel certificate of master, mate, or engineer, (a) if through his wrongful act any ship has been lost, or loss of life has occurred; (b) if he is incompetent, drunk, or cruel; (c) if in case of collision he has failed to render all practicable assistance or to stay by other vessel until she has no further need of assistance; (d) if he has refused in case of collision to give the master of the other vessel particulars of his own. Section 6 provides that no enquiry shall be held into matters once reported on. Section 7, that where investigations commenced in United Kingdom, enquiry not to be held by Marine Court. Section 8, that Board of Trade can order re-hearing.

CAP. 2.—An Act for Codifying the Law relating to the Sale of Goods.—This is an Act of sixty sections which codifies into law the various conventions of trade as laid down by decisions of the Courts from time to time, such as, a contract for sale of future goods operates as agreement to sell; where prices not fixed they must be reasonable; that it is an implied condition of contract that the seller has a right to sell, &c.

CAP. 3.—An Act to amend Chapter 4, of the Consolidated Statutes, and for other purposes.—This Act provides that the section of cap. 4 providing for vacation of seats shall not apply to any person who shall accept any acting appointment when such acting appointment shall not be held for a longer period than six months. Provided that no person shall hold an acting appointment for a longer period than six months or more than one acting appointment for a longer time in the aggregate than six months during the continuance of any General Assembly, except in the case provided for by sub-section 14, which is added, as follows: "Any person who shall accept an acting appointment to any office in place of the holder of such office during his temporary absence from the Colony or during his illness"; the Act further indemnifies Hon. C. Dawe, Hon. Michael Carty, Mr. Alan C. Goodridge and Mr. Robert Watson, from what might be considered breaches of cap. 4, of Con. Stat.

CAP. 4.—An Act to protect the Goods of Lodgers against Distresses for Rent due to the Superior Landlord.—This Act provides that if distress is levied by landlord on goods of a lodger the lodger may serve the landlord or bailiff with declaration that the landlord's tenant has no right in goods, but the lodger shall pay to the superior landlord any rent which he may owe to his immediate landlord. To this declaration the lodger shall attach an inventory of his goods, &c. If, after this proceeding, superior landlord shall levy distress on lodger's goods, lodger may appeal to stipendiary magistrate who shall make order for recovery of goods, but the magistrate may inquire into the truth of the declaration.

CAP. 5.—An Act relating to Crown Lands.—This Act declares that lands hereafter applied for shall be surveyed and fees paid within one year, that lands already applied for shall be surveyed within two years,

and that no priority shall exist in respect of lands not surveyed and on which fees have not been paid. It provides that for the establishment of pulp mills the Governor in Council may grant after one month's notice in the *Royal Gazette*, license to cut timber over not less than five nor more than one hundred and fifty square miles, the licensee paying a premium of \$5 per mile and an annual rental of \$3 per mile. The licensee must further expend \$20,000 on buildings and machinery. The licensee is not to exclude any person from cutting wood on the land so licensed for *bona fide* purposes of the fishery. Any similar licenses issued previously may be exchanged for licenses under this Act. It further provides that to obtain a mining grant the applicant must mark the place he applies for by placing at each of its four corners a wooden post not less than four inches square and twenty-four inches above ground. The extent of the square of land applied for shall not be more than 320 acres. After placing the posts, and not more than two months thereafter, notice in writing shall be given to Minister Agriculture and Mines of intention to apply, with diagram and description of the land, and upon the payment of ten dollars, the person filing the notice shall receive a lease good for one year, and if he wishes it shall then, on payment of \$20, receive a lease for ninety-nine years, subject to a rental of \$20 for first year, \$30 per year for next five years, \$50 per year for next five years, and \$100 per year for remainder of term. A lessee may, if he chooses, commute rent by a single payment, or may obtain a grant in fee simple upon paying not less than \$6,000. Where more than one apply for same location it shall be granted to the first erecting boundary posts and applying within two months thereof for a grant. Mining leases entitles the holder to all minerals on his location. Minister of Agriculture and Mines is to have free access to all mines and to books of account relating thereto. On the Treaty Coast the rental of mineral lands is to be one-fifth of those printed above, and holders of licenses on that part of the Island must apply within one year for a new lease, when previous payments shall be accepted so far as they may go.

CAP. 6.—*An Act to authorize certain payments under the Road Service of the Colony by Cash Notes, and for other purposes.*—This Act authorizes the Governor in Council to issue to the various Road Boards Cash Notes to the amount of their grant, which shall be paid for labor on the Roads. These Notes are declared to be a legal tender.

CAP. 7.—*An Act to amend Chapter 110 of the Consolidated Statutes, entitled "Of Copyright."*—This amendment merely provides that the fee for registering a Copyright in a Photograph shall be \$0.25.

CAP. 8.—*An Act to amend the Election Law.*—This Act directs that no person in the employment of the Government or a Department of Government shall be eligible to hold any office or to act as candidate's agent in any election. The provisions not to extend to a district judge, stipendiary magistrate, clerk of the peace, deputy land surveyor, surveyor of lumber, fishery warden or constable.

CAP. 9.—*An Act to amend Chapter 28 of the Consolidated Statutes, entitled "Of the Registration of Births, Marriages and Deaths."*—The purpose of this Act is merely to facilitate the Registrar of Births, Marriages and Deaths in obtaining accurate returns.

CAP. 10.—*An Act respecting Companies.*—This is an assimilation of the law of this colony in relation to companies to that of Great Britain. It provides for the constitution, incorporation and registration, management and winding up of companies, liabilities of shareholders, powers of court, &c. It provides for its application to existing companies, which must register under the new law within six months from the passing thereof (19th July, 1899).

CAP. 11.—*An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals from this Colony.*—Under this Act a warrant for apprehension of fugitive criminals may be issued by a Stipendiary Magistrate in St. John's on an order from Governor, in other places on complaint; but the Governor to whom the issue of such warrant must be communicated may order release. If Stipendiary Magistrate apprehending a fugitive criminal do not receive an order from Governor in a reasonable time he shall discharge such criminal.

CAP. 12.—*An Act for providing for Notice of and Enquiry into Accidents occurring in certain Employments and Industries.*—This Act directs that notice of accidents on railways, gas works, electric works, harbor works, pulp mill, factory or mine, building construction or repair, shall be given to nearest Stipendiary Magistrate. It provides for a court of investigation and assessment of damages for the person entitled thereto.

CAP. 13.—*An Act to amend the Judicature Act, 1889.*—Under this Act the power of making rules shall vest in any four of the following persons: The Judges of the Supreme Court, the Chief Clerk and Registrar of the Supreme Court (being a Barrister), and two other Benchers of the Law Society, to be appointed by the Chief Justice.

CAP. 14.—*An Act to provide for the Inspection of Boilers.*—This Act provides for the appointment under the Minister of Finance and Fisheries of an Inspector, who shall report upon the state of every marine, machine shop, factory, locomotive or other boiler in use in the colony. In case of dispute between the Inspector and owner of boiler a Stipendiary Magistrate may, upon application by either party, appoint three skilled persons to examine such boiler and report, and their determination shall be final.

CAP. 15.—*An Act respecting the Administration of Local Affairs.*—Under this Act Governor in Council may prescribe sectional divisions to which the Act applies, and rules and regulations respecting boards elected. Boards elected under this Act hold office for two years.

CAP. 16.—*An Act respecting the Law Society.*

CAP. 17.—*An Act to amend the Law relating to Sealers' Wages and Supplies.*—This Act provides that no sealers shall be liable for supplies to a greater amount than his share of the proceeds of the voyage, and that all actions taken by any supplier to recover any amount due by a sealer for supplies shall be brought within six months after the advance of such supplies.

CAP. 18.—*An Act for the Preservation of Deer.*—Under this Act no elk or moose can be hunted before 1906—penalty, \$200. Cariboo may not be hunted from 1st February to fifteenth July, or from 1st October to 20th October in any year. No one, not licensed under this Act, shall kill more

than three stags and one doe cariboo. Persons not domiciled may not hunt cariboo without a license, which may be issued by a stipendiary magistrate, a warden, or Minister of Marine and Fisheries, on payment of \$1.00 and the fee for the particular license taken. The fee for license to take two stag and one doe shall be \$40. To take three stag and one doe, \$50, and five stag and two doe cariboo, \$80. First license is good for four weeks, second for six weeks, and third for two months. Non-domiciled guides are not to be employed except licensed. Fee for such license \$25. No guide or member of a hunting party shall kill cariboo except as part of the number specified on the license. Export of cariboo carcase or skin is prohibited except to licensee, who may export what he may have killed under his license, entering the same at the Custom House for exportation. Pits and snares for cariboo are not allowed under penalty of \$50, nor are they to be hunted with dogs or with hatchet, or any contrivance other than fire arms.

CAP. 19.—*An Act relating to Light Dues.*—This Act provides that vessels entering shall pay once a year dues at the rate of twenty-four cents up to 500 tons, twelve cents additional per ton from 500 to 1,000, and six cents additional on every ton over 1,000 up to 2,000. No ship shall pay more than \$240 in one year. Ships entering for repairs or supplies shall pay half rates, and Labrador, coasting and fishing craft shall be exempt. The Act makes provision for measurement of ships in accordance with rules of Merchant Shipping Act, and also provides for removal of obstructions from Lights and compensation if necessary.

CAP. 20.—*An Act relating to advances made by Public Commissioners on account of Public Works and Services.*—This Act permits Governor in Council to authorize any Relieving Officer, Chairman of Road Board, &c., to advance from any monies under his control to any person upon an agreement regularly signed that he will give work or services in return. On refusing to make such return the person receiving the advance may be prosecuted before a stipendiary magistrate.

CAP. 21.—*An Act relating to the Harbor Grace Water Company.*—This Act provides for reduction of interest paid from five per cent. to four per cent., and gives power to lease water power for machinery.

CAP. 22.—*An Act to amend Chapter 130 of the Consolidated Statutes, entitled "Of Licenses for the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors."*—This Act provides for a Licensing Board in St. John's, to consist of a Stipendiary Magistrate, the Inspector-General and Superintendent of Constabulary, and other persons to be appointed by Governor in Council.

CAP. 23.—*An Act to amend the Acts relating to the Municipal Affairs of the Town of St. John's.*—This Act fixes the indebtedness of St. John's to the Government at one million dollars. In future compensation for land for alteration of streets shall be charged to Municipality.

CAP. 24.—*An Act to amend the "Education Act, 1895."*—This Act provides for appointment of Assistant Superintendents of Church of England and Methodist Schools and two Superintendents of Roman Catholic Schools. It also, in reference to the Council of Higher Education, directs that seven

members shall be a quorum. Moneys granted for educational purposes shall be expended according to directions of Audit Act. Educational payments shall be made through office of Colonial Secretary.

CAP. 25.—*An Act to amend the Law relating to Trial by Jury.*—This Act provides for special juries in criminal and civil cases and directs the mode of drawing.

CAP. 26.—*An Act to provide for the payment of Debentures lost or destroyed.*

CAP. 27.—*An Act respecting the Preservation of Game.*—This Act fixes the date for shooting grouse, &c., the 15th day of September.

CAP. 28.—*An Act to amend the Customs' Act, 1898.*

CAP. 29.—*An Act to amend the Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, entitled "An Act to provide for the Exchange of Debentures for Debentures lost or destroyed."*—This Act alters the form of Debenture provided under amended Act.

CAP. 30.—*An Act to amend the Act 60 Vic., cap. 20, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the St. John's Street Railway Company, and for other purposes."*—This Act extends the time for completion of St. John's Street Railway to 1st July, 1900.

CAP. 31.—*An Act to amend the Act 61 Vic., cap. 8, entitled "An Act respecting Salaries."*—This Act increases the Governor's salary to \$10,000.

CAP. 32.—*An Act respecting certain Retiring Allowances.*—By this Act retiring allowances are given to Rev'd Dr. Milligan, \$800; Jas. J. Wickham, \$800; C. Prowse, \$250; Sarah Stentaforde, \$180.

CAP. 33.—*An Act to continue the Encouragement of Agriculture.*—This Act authorises a loan of \$100,000 for encouragement of Agriculture, to be expended in bonuses on clearing land.

CAP. 34.—*An Act respecting the Public Revenue, the raising of Loans authorized by the Legislature, and the Auditing of the Public Accounts.*—This is the Audit Act, which has been somewhat amended.

CAP. 35.—*An Act to authorize the Coinage of One Hundred Thousand Dollars in Silver.*

CAP. 36.—*An Act to amend the Revenue Act.*—This Act imposes ten per cent. additional on the duties collected under Revenue Act, 1898. It provides that an excise duty of one cent per lb. shall be paid on all oleomargarine manufactured, and of twenty-seven and a half cents on tobacco manufactured; it also makes other less important changes in the tariff.

CAP. 37.—*An Act to authorize the raising of a sum of Money by Loan, for the Public Service of the Colony.*—This Act authorizes a loan of \$146,100 for erection of light houses, beacons, fog alarms, public wharves, public buildings, repairs and improvements, &c.

CAP. 38.—*An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of Money for defraying certain expenses of the Public Service for the financial years ending respectively the Thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the Thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and the Thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred, and for other purposes relating to the Public Service.*—This Act is the usual Supply Act, covering votes for public service, roads, legislation, &c.





# Game Laws of Newfoundland.

UNDER DEPARTMENT OF MARINE AND FISHERIES.

.....  
**ABSTRACT.**

**CARIBOU.**—Close season is, from 1st of February to 15th July, and from 1st October to 20th October, inclusive; that is to say, Caribou or Deer may be hunted upon and after 15th of July till 1st of October, and from 20th day of October till 1st February following. Penalty for violation of above, \$500, or imprisonment.

No person not usually resident in the Colony, shall kill or take Caribou without having first procured therefor to himself a license. Licenses shall be of three kinds: entitling the holder to kill and take two stag and one doe; three stag and one doe, and five stag and two doe caribou; these hold good for four weeks, six weeks, and two months, respectively, and the fees therefor are Forty, Fifty and Eighty dollars. Provided, nevertheless, that no resident or officer of any British war-ship, stationed on the coast of this Island for fisheries protection shall be compelled to procure or pay for such annual license. Guides not domiciled in the Colony are subject to license (\$25.00).

No venison allowed to be exported as an article of commerce; and any person exporting, or carrying with him for private use, any venison, or the heads, antlers, or skins, must clear the same at the Custom House.

Dogs, pitfalls, snares and traps, or weapons, other than fire-arms, are prohibited.

**GROUSE OR PARTRIDGE.**—Willow grouse, partridge or ptarmigan, curlew, plover, snipe, or other wild or migratory bird (except wild geese), cannot be shot between January 12th and September 15th; nor shall any person be allowed to have in his possession, give away, barter or sell, or expose for sale, any willow grouse, partridge or ptarmigan, after the 22nd day of January, under a penalty of \$100.

**WILD RABBIT OR HARE** between March 1st and September 15th, under a penalty of twenty-five dollars.

**OTTER** between April 1st and October 1st.

**BEAVER**, close time to 1st October, 1900.

**GAME FISH.**—The following is the law for the preservation of game fish: No trout, char, white fish, land-locked salmon, or grisle, or any freshwater or migratory fish, can be caught, taken or killed in any lake, river or stream in this Colony, from the 15th September to January 15th in each year, under a penalty of \$10 for each fish.

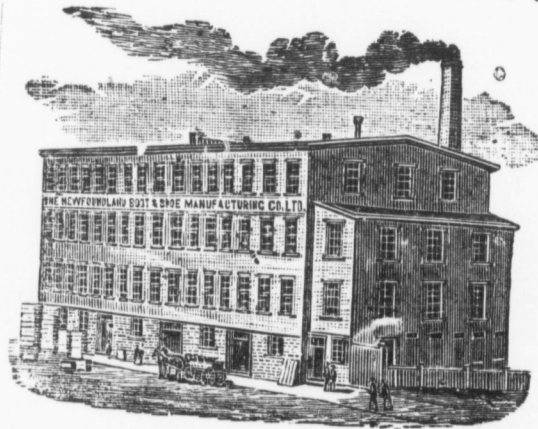

## **SHEEP PRESERVATION!**

**T**HE following Sections of the Acts 47th Victoria, Cap. 7, and 50th Victoria, Cap. 9, for the Preservation of Sheep, are published in consolidated form for the information of the public:—

1.—It shall be lawful for the duly qualified Electors resident within an area or District within this Colony to present to the Governor in Council a Petition or Requisition in the form prescribed in the schedule to this Act, or as near thereto as may be, setting forth the limits or boundaries within which such area or District is comprised, and the names of the towns, harbors or settlements included therein, and praying for a Proclamation prohibiting the keeping of Dogs within such area or District.

2.—Such Petition or Requisition shall be sent to the nearest resident Stipendiary Magistrate, and shall be by him (after examination and certificate as hereinafter provided) furnished to the Governor in Council.

3.—Upon receipt of any such Petition or Requisition containing the signatures of not less than one-third of the Electors resident within any such area or District, certified as aforesaid, the Governor in Council shall issue a Proclamation or Public Notice prohibiting the keeping of Dogs within such area or District.

4.—From and after the day prescribed in and by such Proclamation or Notice, it shall not be lawful for any person resident within such area or District to keep, or to have in his possession, or under his control, any Dog within the area or District to which such Proclamation or Notice shall relate, under a penalty not exceeding Fifty Dollars, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding Three Months. This prohibition shall not apply to any person or persons travelling or passing through such area or Districts and having a licensed Dog or Dogs in his or their possession, charge or control, and not at large.

5.—It shall be the duty of all Police Constables to kill all Dogs found by them in any area or District in which the keeping of Dogs is prohibited under this Act, except Shepherd Dogs or Collies, and those excepted under the next preceding section, and all such Dogs not so excepted may be killed by any person whomsoever. And it shall be lawful for any person to destroy any Dog kept in contravention of the provisions of this Act.

\* \* All penalties under this Act may be sued for and recovered in a summary manner before a Stipendiary Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, and all fines shall be paid to the person who shall give information of the offence and prosecute the offender to conviction.



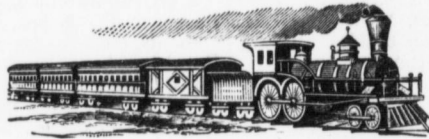
