MINUTES OF THE THIRTEENTH SESSION OF THE MONTREAL ANNUAL CONFERENCE.

Held in the Stanstead Methodist Church, Commencing.

June 4th, 1896.

The THIRTEENTH SESSION of the MONTREAL ANNUAL CONFERENCE of the Methodist Church assembled, according to appointment, in the Methodist Church at Stanstead, Que., Thursday, June 4th, 1896, at 9 o'clock a.m.

Rev. John Armstrong, President of Conference, occupied the chair. Hymn 80 was sung.

The 3rd chapter of Ephesians was read by the Secretary of Conference, Rev. F. G. Lett.

Revs. S. G. Bland, B.A., and W. H. Emsley offered prayer. Part of the 85th Hymn was then sung, and Wm. Sawyer, Esq., and Rev. W. J. Hunter, D.D., led in prayer.

The prayer-meeting was continued until 10 o'clock.

The President then called for the names of the laymen reported as elected by the district meetings.

The roll was then called, and 137 ministers and 31 laymen responded to the call.

The ballot for President having been taken, the Rev. J. T. PITCHER. was elected on the first ballot.

The retiring President called Mr. PITCHER to the platform, and greeted him with a few appropriate words of congratulation. In reply Rev. Mr. PITCHER expressed his gratitude to the Conference for the mark of its confidence, of which he would endeavor to prove himself worthy.

The ballot was then taken for Secretary, the result being no election; but Rev. A. Lee Holmes, M.A., having received the highest number of ballots, the Secretary was instructed on motion to cast a ballot for Mr. Holmes.

The Secretary nominated as Assistant Secretaries, Rev. W. H. Sparling, B.A., Rev. Wm. Philp, B.A., B.D., and J. H. Knox, Esq.; Rev. C. D. Baldwin as Journal Secretary. The Conference confirmed the nominations.

The Rev. J. Lawson was reappointed reporter for the Christian.

It was ordered that Rev. R. Corrigan, B.A., B.D., take charge of Conference register and sign railway certificates.

It was on motion resolved that the Rules of Order, as found in our Book of Discipline, govern the Conference in so far as they apply.

The Special Session of the Thirteenth Montreal Annual Conference was opened in the Stanstead Methodist Church, on June 2nd, 1896, at 9 o'clock a.m., the Rev. John Armstrong, President of the Conference, in the chair. Hymn 430 was sung, the 17th chapter of John's Gospel was read by the Secretary, and Revs. Geo. Rogers and Geo. McRitchie led in prayer. The roll was called and 88 ministers answered to the call.

OBITUARIES.

WILLIAM BRIDEN.

The late Rev. Wm. Briden was born May 15th, 1827, at St. Albans, about twenty miles from London, England. His parents were members of the Established Church, and he was baptized and confirmed therein. When about fourteen years of age he began to attend Methodist services. He soon became deeply convinced of sin and of his need of a Saviour. For six months he mourned for sin, until at length, while praying alone in a field where he had sought retirement, he found the sweetest relief in the good old Gospel way-by faith, as a sinner, in the atoning love of The new life within him began to manifest itself at once in While yet a mere youth, he was frequently called activities for others. upon for help in social meetings in the way of exhortation and prayer. Lowliness of mind was always a marked feature of his character, and on account of his own estimate of his unfitness, he hesitated to take any public or prominent part in Church work. He was often urged to enter the ministry. When eighteen years of age he came under the pastoral care and influence of one of the most remarkable men ever known in the ministry of the Methodist Church in England, the Rev. Thos. Collins, and derived much benefit from the counsels and instructions of that soulsaving man of God. He became a local preacher, but still hesitated to give himself up to the full work of the ministry. He could not, however, put away the impression that it was his duty to do so. At length he resolved to go away from home among entire strangers, and if there work was thrust upon him, and the way opened before him, he would take it as an indication of a divine call. In London, as in St. Albans, his gifts and graces were recognized as marking him for a preacher of the Gospel. For four years he served circuits in England, as a hired local preacher. In London he met Rev. J. Ryerson, who was seeking recruits for the work in Canada. He offered himself, and was accepted. He came to the Conference in Belleville in 1854, and was received into our ministry, and thenceforward for forty years he was a faithful, successful and beloved Methodist preacher. He occupied thirteen circuits after his ordination, on eleven of which he stayed a full term of three years. It is an additional testimony to the acceptability of this good brother, that nearly all his stations were in the immediate vicinity of each other, the last being Princess Street, Kingston, where his health failed. He was a good preacher, and his sermons were sensible, sound and interesting. They led many sinners to Christ, and comforted and strengthened the Church. Extensive revivals frequently occurred under his ministry. He was a

good pastor, diligent as a visitor, and beloved always by the children and young people, as well as by those of maturer years. In an unusual degree

he was beloved by his brethren in the ministry.

He was a man of great energy and strength of character, of firmness and faithfulness to what was right, but at the same time was peculiarly gentle, kindly, amiable and brotherly, in all his ways. He was quiet and unassuming in his demeanor, but never dull-always bright, good-natured and considerate of others. There was not a trace of envy or jealousy in his disposition. He never worked for himself, nor against anyone else; was always satisfied with his stations, and did his work "as unto the Lord." In 1894, he was transferred from the Bay of Quinte to the Montreal Conference, and stationed in the city of Kingston. In about three months, through valvular disease of the heart, he was compelled to retire from public life. It was to him a very painful He still felt himself young and strong, and was expecting some additional years of happy toil. He loved his work, and hoped to be able to resume it. Although appearances sometimes flattered him, he steadily declined in strength until the month of November, 1895. Long before that, however, he had calmly accepted the fact of incurable disease, and, trusting in God, patiently awaited his appointed time. Hearty acquiescence in the will of God was his uniform state of mind. It appeared in all his conversation that he was thankful, trustful and happy. At his comfortable home in Kingston, surrounded by the kindest relatives and friends, he entered into eternal rest on November 2nd, 1895, and in the sixty-ninth year of his age. At his funeral the Rev. R. Whiting, a brother Englishman, and the first minister whose acquaintance he had made on this side of the Atlantic, gave pleasing and affecting testimony to the value of his character and labors.

ALEXANDER SHORTS.

Alexander Shorts was received on trial for the ministry of the late Methodist Episcopal Church, on recommendation by the Napanee Quarterly Board at the Conference held at Sydenham, May 30th, 1865, and travelled for twenty-three years, when, owing to failing health, he was compelled to superannuate. His first appointment was Roxboro' Mission, Augusta District. His latter years were spent as a superannuate, fulfilling a roving commission as a gospel missionary among the residents and summer tourists of the Thousand Islands. He succeeded in building two churches, and in establishing services at different points, which he kept up as regularly as his health would permit.

Brother Shorts was a good man, without apparent ambition for Conference offices or honors, or apparent desire for easy and affluent fields. He was easy to station, for he sought nothing and shunned nothing, always content to serve another year, no matter where, so long as he might glorify God and save souls. His fields were generally hard but he invariably made them better; and he went to the hardest of them with a light heart, singing a song of hope and trust. He loved the Church to the extent that (whether wisely or not) he literally laid all his property upon

her altar, leaving himself crippled in his declining years. But God's promise was made good in his behalf. He who feeds the ravens when they cry, and in whose hand are the hearts of the children of men, when age and sickness and the shadow of death crept on apace—He, blessed be His holy name, enabled our dear brother to say, "I have all and abound." He was a man of strong faith, deep humility and great kindness of heart. Although not scholarly, his expositions of Scripture were always racy and often refreshingly original. He was ingenious and sometimes almost eccentric in his methods and devices to lead men to God—hence his gospel tent services from circuit to circuit, and his gospel boat carrying the glad news of salvation to the cottagers among the Thousand Islands.

About two years ago his health completely failed, and tumors developing threatened a speedy termination of his life. He came to Brockville, secured surgical skill and kind treatment, and started for his home at Thurso, Grindstone Island, in good hope of being able to resume work with opening spring. His malady soon broke out anew, however, and he knew the end was near. Through untold suffering and patient hope he passed home to his Lord on May 17th, aged fifty-five years. He left a widow, a son who is a Methodist minister in the United States, and two young daughters. His only pang in all his pain was the thought of leaving his family with so little provision for their future comfort. He was wise in soul winning, and will have many stars in the crown of his rejoicing.

GEORGE S. WHITMORE.

The late George S. Whitmore was born near Pembroke, Ont., in the year 1868, and was converted to God in early life. Believing that God had called him to the Christian ministry, he entered Belleville College, and after passing the necessary examinations, was received on probation for the Methodist ministry, and stationed at Calabogie, Pembroke District. But his bright prospects of a useful career were cut short by sickness, which developed into consumption. He lived near to God, and at all times could say, "The Lord's will be done." While visiting friends in Ottawa, he was called suddenly to his reward on the 27th day of October, 1895.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

REPORT OF THE SUSTENTATION FUND COMMITTEE.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FUND.

1. The name of this Fund shall be, "The Sustentation Fund of the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church."

2. The one object of this Fund shall be to supply those fields in our Home Work which are now, and shall hereafter be, known as "Domestic Missions," or "Dependent Circuits or Stations," so that ministers and preachers duly appointed to those fields shall be regular claimants on the Fund, and shall be entitled to supplemental grants therefrom, whenever their "total income" from other sources shall actually fall below the following scale of minimum allowances. viz.:

For a single preacher on probation, \$300 per annum; for a single ordained minister, \$400 per annum; for a married minister in full connection, \$500 per annum, with \$25 for each subsequent year, until his allowance reaches \$600 per annum.

N.B.—The term "allowance" or "allowances" shall be understood as including only the items of ministerial support, viz., salary, board and fuel, exclusive of, and in addition to, any necessary charges for house rent, horse-keeping, travelling, removals and circuit incidentals.

Note.—That in regard to the distribution of the money contributed to this Fund, the Committee shall have discretionary power to make grants to ministers with families, even when the minimum allowance, \$600, is exceeded.

3. The income of this Fund shall consist of moneys raised within the bounds of our Conference, by collections and subscriptions on all the various Circuits and Missions, excepting the Indian and the French.

4. The general management of the Fund shall be entrusted to a Sustentation Fund Committee, composed of one minister and one layman, elected by each annual District Meeting, and a ministerial secretary-treasurer elected by the Conference on the nomination of the Committee; and this Committee shall transact the necessary business thereof at each Annual Conference, in accordance with the following regulations:

(a) With a view to raising the income needed, the Committee shall annually make a careful estimate of the prospective aggregate deficiencies on dependent fields, and suggest the amount desired from each District, in order to meet such deficiencies.

(b) In making grants from the Fund, the Committee shall have strict regard to the aforementioned "Scale of minimum allowances." No claim shall be entertained which has not been recommended by the annual District Meeting; and all Quarterly Boards presenting claims for recommendation, shall declare their inability to meet their "net deficiencies."

(c) Should the income of the Fund in any year prove insufficient to meet the claims thereon, then the grants shall be so distributed as to make up the allowances of claimants to the same percentage according to the aforementioned "scale," but should there be a surplus over the claims, as per said "scale," it shall be carried forward, and included in the income of the year next following.

(d) A report shall be presented by the Committee to the Conference annually, while in session, including a summary of business transacted, an audited statement of receipts and disbursements, and any suggestions deemed necessary to the interests of the Fund, said report, as adopted by

the Conference, to be published in the Minutes.

5. That no application from any Circuit or Mission be entertained by the Committee, unless that Circuit or Mission has made the most earnest

efforts to secure, at least, ten cents per member.

In order to obtain greater support for this important Fund, the Financial District Meetings are requested to arrange for the holding of platform meetings, and the appointment of deputations to advocate the claims of the Fund on all the Circuits and Missions.

The Committee regrets that with the amount placed at its disposal, it has been able to pay but 12 per cent. of the constitutional claims, as against 16 per cent. last year. In view of this fact, and of the growing demands upon this important Fund, taking, as it does, the place of a Home Mission Fund, we recommend its claims be strongly advocated by our ministers on their circuits and missions.

On motion, it was resolved that the Secretary-Treasurer, previous to the Financial District Meeting, be instructed to send an appeal to every minister and probationer stationed within the bounds of the Conference, setting forth the needs of the Fund, and urging a more hearty response to the appeal.

That the Secretary-Treasurer be Rev. Geo. Rogers for the coming year.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER OF THE SUPERANNUATION FUND OF THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE.

Your Treasurer is pleased to submit the following report. The Circuits and Missions in the thirteen districts in the Conference are required to pay to the Fund \$8,710. Of this amount \$621.50 was paid before the first of May, and \$8,125.74 during Conference, making a total paid by the Circuits and Missions of \$8,747.24. Two hundred and twenty-three ministers and probationers paid \$1,035.42 before the first of May. They have paid during Conference \$3,753.72, making a total paid by the ministers of \$4,789.14. The grand total raised by the Conference for the Fund this year is \$13,536.38. Your Treasurer is pleased to report that the Circuits have paid \$30.49 more than the assessment laid upon the Conference. Your Treasurer's expenses have been \$3 during the year.

But while your Treasurer is able to thus favorably report the Circuits as more than paid, he is sorry to report that two ministers in full connection have been unable to pay their personal subscription to the Fund.

Your Treasurer would with diffidence urge upon Chairmen of Districts the great necessity of seeing to it at the May District Meeting that probationers who are recommended to be advanced in their years of standing have paid an equal number of full personal subscriptions to the Superannuation Fund, and that probationers recommended to be received into full connection have paid four full payments to this Fund.

Your Treasurer would beg to remind the brethren that according to Discipline the half of their personal subscription should be paid to the Financial Secretary at the Financial District Meeting.

We would, for accuracy and correctness in keeping the accounts, recommend that all remittances be made through the disciplinary channels, viz., through Financial Secretaries to the Conference Treasurer, and thence to the General Treasurer in Toronto.

Will the brethren, so far as possible, settle in full with the Financial Secretaries before coming to Conference, and thus secure accuracy and expedite the closing of the accounts with this Fund early in the sessions of Conference.

MODE OF EXAMINATION FOR THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE.

Candidates for our Ministry and Probationers shall be examined by means of papers prepared by the respective Examiners.

There shall also be an oral examination if required.

In addition to the usual thorough Theological Examination of Candidates before the District Meeting, the Chairman shall examine each candidate as to his studies and general reading for the year, with a view to giving advice as to his course and method of study. No candidate shall be allowed the year of probation until the studies for that year are completed.

The examination of candidates shall be held in each district, under the supervision of the Chairman and the Examiners resident on the District, on the third Wednesday in April in each year, and at such places as the Chairman shall appoint. All papers shall be sent by the Examiners to the Chairman in sealed envelopes, not later than the first Wednesday in April in each year. The answers to the papers shall be sent by the Chairmen to the respective Examiners, who shall forward to the Secretary of the Board the valuation. The Secretary shall prepare the certificates, and forward them to the Chairman of the District, to be presented by him to the May District Meeting. The Secretary of the Board shall send the Chairman of each district the name of any candidate or probationer who may have taken part of the subjects in any given course, and the standing he has attained, but shall not issue the certificate in any year's course until the candidate or probationer has completed it; and further, the standard qualification for young men recommended to be received into our Conference as probationers shall not be lower than fifty per cent. of the marks on the preliminary course of study in the aggregate, and thirty-three and one-third per cent. in each subject. Also, a standing of thirty-three and one-third per cent. shall be required in order to pass in each subject of the subsequent course, and the Conference directs that existing regulations relating to the time and manner of examinations be imperatively observed, and more especially that it be deemed absolutely peremptory that the examinations be held on the same day throughout the whole Conference, and that all the young men in any district writing on any given subject write at the same hour. The maximum time for each paper shall be two hours. No supplementary examination shall be allowed between the regular time of examinations and the close of Conference. iner is expected to send at least one copy of each examination paper to the chairmen of districts.

It is further recommended that in future each paper sent to the Examiners shall be endorsed by the Chairman of the District or his deputy. In case of a paper failing to reach a chairman, some other examiner shall set a paper if practicable.

Candidates and probationers shall be known only by figures or letters

to the Examiners.

In the adjustment of work of probationers passing from the former course of study to the new, the following principles will be observed:

1. Probationers hitherto responsible for the 1st, 2nd or 3rd year of the

former course shall be required to complete the same.

2. Work done in the 4th year of the old course shall be credited, when identical or in kindred subjects, for corresponding subjects in the 4th or 5th year.

3. In cases where probationers have completed the former course of

study, nothing further shall be required of them.

4. The Secretary of the Examining Board shall take each case in his register and enter in each the items to debit under above principles, consulting, when any special case of complication arises, with the Principal of Wesleyan Theological College, Montreal.

5. The said officers shall have final authority under above provisions to make adjustment in each case subject to appeal to the Board of Exam-

iners at its next annual meeting.

6. The Secretary shall notify each probationer of his obligations under the above provisions.

7. The Examining Board of 1894 shall furnish whatever papers are necessary in passing from the old to the new curriculum.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES TO THE CONFERENCE.

We desire to acknowledge the goodness of Almighty God for His continued favor to this Institution. As the years go by the wisdom of its originators becomes more apparent. We believe there still exists a need for schools where parents who wish to provide their children with the advantages of a higher education may do so, under wholesome religious supervision.

In the past year several necessary alterations have been made in the

building and improvements in the grounds.

The Bugbee Commercial College has been equipped with all necessary conveniences for that important department. The teachers have been faithful and efficient, and have thus contributed largely to the standing the College now holds among the educational institutions of the Province.

We cannot speak too highly of the untiring zeal and devotion to the interests of the College by Principal Flanders, and Mrs. Flanders as lady principal.

Again we ask the co-operation of the ministers of the Conference in securing an increased patronage.

PRINCIPAL FLANDERS' REPORT.

To the Ministers and Laymen of the Montreal Conference.

Dear Brethren,—Good health, freedom from accidents and a buoyant cheerfulness have been the almost unvarying experience of the teachers and students of Stanstead College during the year now closing.

I cannot speak too highly of the efficiency and faithfulness of the ladies and gentlemen of our staff of teachers, and am pleased to report the re-engagement of nearly all of them for another year. Through the changes which arise we are receiving as new teachers Miss Winona Pitcher, B.A., an honor graduate of McGill University, and the second daughter of the honored President of Conference; and Miss Henrietta Shaw, a graduate of McGill Normal School, and youngest daughter of the much esteemed Principal of the Wesleyan Theological College.

In the course of the year we have registered in all departments 158 students. Of these the young ladies number 72, young men and boys 86. The students residing in the College have reached in number 65, the

majority being young men and boys.

For the government examinations now in progress we have prepared forty-eight candidates in the following classes: Grade I. Model, 9; Grade II. Model, 11; Grade I. Academy, 10; Grade II. Academy, 5; Grade III. Academy 13.

It has been our earnest ambition in preparing these students to maintain the enviable position in the Province which was won by the College in the examinations of last year. It is worthy of note that our Grade III. Academy or "AA" Class is the largest and strongest ever presented.

In the undergraduate department five students have been in attendance, and exceptionally good work has been done. In order to appreciate this

fact fully it must be borne in mind that the students who study with us in this department are usually poorly prepared, and yet our results compare not unfavorably with those of McGill. In the remaining departments the number of students who have registered is as follows: Commercial Department, 27; Musical, 45; Elocution, 16; Fine Art, 5; Physical Culture, 55. Total, 148.

It is a significant fact that no less than 12 Roman Catholics have

studied with us at various times during the year.

Attention has been given to the religious life of the young people. Attendance upon public worship and Sunday School has been systematically enforced. Within the College a young ladies' meeting has been held on Tuesday evenings, and a meeting for the boys and young men on Sunday morning, while a service for all has been maintained on Thursday evenings.

It would be most ungrateful in me if I failed to speak in strong terms of appreciation of the warm sympathy and hearty co-operation which have been afforded me in my work by the gentlemen of the Advisory and Executive Committee. Stanstead College is specially fortunate in having the benefit of the wisdom and experience of strong men, whose devotion to her interests is unceasing, and whose counsel and advice are invaluable to the Principal.

As one having a near view of the situation, it is a sincere pleasure to speak encouragingly of the outlook and to acknowledge a growing

hopefulness.

Given the continued blessing of Heaven and the hearty co-operation of the ministers and laymen of the Montreal Conference, the future of the Institution cannot but be satisfactory.

VISITORS' REPORT.

We made our official visit to Stanstead Wesleyan College on the first day of May. We are pleased with the healthful tone of the Institution and with the improvements recently made in the main building. These add greatly to the convenience and comfort of all. The rooms are well kept and comfortable. The grounds have been made very attractive by newly-planted trees and shrubbery. Good discipline has been maintained in the Institution, and the teaching is thorough in all departments, but more room is needed for the Primary department. The position taken by the College in the academic work of the Province, as evidenced by the last governmental examination, was in the highest degree satisfactory. We found teachers and pupils in good health, and ambitious that the results of the approaching examinations should give proof of even better work than last year.

On the occasion of our visit we found the friends of the College rejoicing that Miss Pitcher, B.A., Professor of Mathematics, had agreed to postpone her intended course of study in Germany, and remain in the College another year.

A visit to the Bugbee Commercial College, with its new and attractive apartments, gave us special satisfaction. Under the direction of its most competent instructor, in both theory and practice, the pupils of the department are being fitted for positions of usefulness and honor. Among the subjects taught are phonography, telegraphy, typewriting and penmanship. We were pleased with the specimens of work shown. Several of the best typewriting machines in use are in this College.

Rev. Dr. and Mrs. Flanders are to be congratulated on the success thus far attained. But while the College is doing its best work, and the outlook is inspiring, let not the friends of the Institution withold any measure of generous support or interest. As the munificent bequest of the late Mr. Massey is not yet available, there is urgent need of money in order to keep the property in repair and make the necessary improvements.

The Treasurer's report for the year ending 31st May, 1896, shows the endowment to be \$18,412.40, and special endowment, \$980.16. These have yielded \$1,021.80 interest, which has been paid to the Principal of the College.

WESLEYAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE, MONTREAL.

To the Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church.

The undersigned respectfully submit the following brief report of the last year's work and of the present position of the Institution.

Number of students in Arts, full course, 8 (others as partial students take more or less work in the University); in Divinity leading to the Licentiate's Degree, 24; for the Degree of B.D., 21; for the Conference Course, 18. Total enrolled, 71.

Rev. Principal Shaw, D.D., LL.D., lectures in Systematic Theology, Greek Testament and Church Polity; Rev. J. C. Antliff, M.A. (Edin.), D.D., in Apologetics, Hebrew and Homiletics; Rev. Prof. Richardson, B.A., B.D., Acting Registrar, in Greek and Latin, and Rev. Prof. Harris, M.A., B.D., Bursar, in Church History and English. Rev. Prof. Patton, B.D., is still pursuing a Post-Graduate Course in Oriental Literature, in Leiden, Holland.

The College is prepared to afford students facilities for meeting the Conference requirements, in the new course for probationers, or for pursuing the three years' course leading to licentiate's standing, or the University Course in Arts in McGill, or the higher course in Divinity leading to the Degree of B.D. Copies of calendar containing full information as to curricula, etc., may be obtained from the Acting Registrar.

The Endowment Fund is now \$75,000, current expenditure about \$6,500, total debt on current account (only liability) is \$4,000. The Boarding Department covers its need with the income of about \$4,000. The need is urgent for enlargement of buildings for increased accommodation in dormitories, lecture rooms and convocation hall. It is probable that this need will be met from the generous bequest of the late H. A. Massey, Esq., of Toronto, for the "Douglas Memorial Hall."

The effort of the Rev. Prof. Harris, M.A., Bursar, to further increase the Endowment Fund, is being continued, and all its proceeds are sacredly placed in new investments. In the meantime the Institution is conducted with rigid economy in finances, and with regard to thoroughness and efficiency in educational work.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF VICTORIA UNIVERSITY TO THE ANNUAL CONFERENCES OF THE METHODIST CHURCH.

The Board of Regents have much pleasure in presenting to the Annual Conferences, and through them to the Church over which they preside, a brief report of the important work which has been committed to their care. The interest of this work centres, of course, in its financial and educational aspects, both of which have been the subject of careful consideration and no little anxiety.

The estimates of income and expenditure made last year had anticipated a deficiency of \$8,000 on the year's work, the income being estimated at over \$24,000, and expenditure at over \$32,000. The treasurers, Geo. A. Cox, Esq., and Rev. Dr. Potts, were able to report that this had been

reduced below \$6,000, partly by increase in fees due to a larger attendance of students and partly by a special Income Fund contributed by friends at the solicitation of Dr. Potts, intended to cover the annual deficiency for the next five years. Every item of expenditure had been carefully guarded during the year, and in this way the accounts were kept \$500 below the estimates. The annual deficiency is due entirely to the fact that the necessary endowment has not yet been reached. The original estimate for the endowment was \$400,000, producing \$24,000 a year. The productive endowment is about \$260,000, yielding less than \$14,000 annual income. The munificent bequest of the late Mr. Massey will go far to meet the difficulty thus far experienced. The total expenditure for the year is reported at \$33,023.82. The income has reached \$27,112.62.

The report of the educational work of the year should give encouragement to all the friends of the Institution. The attendance of students has again advanced, the net registration for the year being 253, divided as follows: Arts, 227; theology, 128; less registered in both faculties, 102; net total, 253. The strength of the staff has not been changed, numbering eleven professors and lecturers in arts, and six in theology, three taking work in both faculties.

The students of Victoria have secured very creditable results in the examinations of the year, obtaining their full share of the honors, scholarships and other prizes of the University. The largest prize in the gift of the University, the Exhibition Scholarship of \$750 a year for two years after graduation, to be used in study in Europe, has been won this year by a Victoria man, Mr. A. M. Scott.

A special feature of the work of the year has been increased attention to the subjects of the curriculum which give a Christian character to our higher education. This important matter is attracting the attention of our most thoughtful Christian men, and the question is anxiously asked, How shall we make our education truly Christian while yet unsectarian? The provisions of the Federation Act secure the following elements of religious knowledge as a part of the curriculum in Arts: The Evidences of Natural and Revealed Religion, Biblical Literature, Church History, the Greek Testament, and Christian Ethics. The department of Biblical Literature includes the English Bible, Biblical History and Introduction. The work is placed in the third and fourth years of the course. Of the sixty-eight Victoria students enrolled in those years, sixty are taking these subjects as part of their curriculum.

The report of the Faculty of Theology shows a remarkable advance in the educational status of our rising ministry. Of twenty-nine students of Victoria this year presented for ordination, no less than nineteen are graduates in Arts, three being also graduates in Divinity. This is a result probably not surpassed in the religious and educational history of the Continent.

We commend to your loyal support and prayerful interest this important work of the Church, believing that the highest Christian intelligence is more than ever necessary to the upbuilding of the kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CHURCH PROPERTY.

Your Committee on Church Property beg leave to recommend as follows:

MONTREAL DISTRICT.

St. James Church.—That permission be granted the Trustees of St. James Church to sell the church property on St. Catherine Street, either in whole or in part, for the liquidation of the debt.

That permission be renewed the Trustees of St. James Church to sell the Temple Building for the liquidation of the debt.

Douglas Church.—That permission be renewed the Trustees of Douglas Church to sell a vacant lot, proceeds to be applied on church debt.

Mountain Street Church.—That permission be renewed the Trustees of Mountain Street Church to sell vacant land, proceeds to be applied on debt.

Mount Royal Avenue Church.—That permission be granted the Trustees of the said church to sell the church property, proceeds to be applied to the erection of a new church.

Montreal Centre (French Mission).—That permission be renewed the Trustees of the French Church on Craig Street to sell the church property, proceeds to be applied to the erection of a new church.

Rawdon.—That permission be renewed the Trustees of the Rawdon parsonage property to sell the same, proceeds to be applied to the erection of a new parsonage.

Montreal, West End.—That permission be renewed the Trustees of West End Church to sell a house on church property, proceeds to be applied on church debt.

BROCKVILLE DISTRICT.

Lansdowne.—That the resolution passed last year giving permission to the Trustees of Lansdowne parsonage property to sell their old parsonage be understood not only to designate the parsonage but also the land connected therewith.

That permission be granted the same Trustees to sell the lot south of the parsonage consisting of 60 x 100 ft., proceeds to be applied to parsonage debt.

PERTH DISTRICT.

Easton's Corners.—That permission be granted to the Easton's Corners Trustee Board to convey the part of street owned by the said Board to the municipality of Wolford, provided that John B. Arnold convey the part of the street owned by him to the said municipality.

PEMBROKE DISTRICT.

Renfrew.—That permission be given to the Renfrew Trustee Board to sell church and parsonage property, proceeds to be applied toward building a new church and parsonage.

NIPISSING DISTRICT.

North Bay.—That permission be granted North Bay Trustee Board to sell parsonage property, proceeds to be applied to securing new parsonage.

That permission be granted Trustees of church property at Nipissing Junction to sell the property, consisting of part of lot 5, concession 24, of township of Hinsworth.

OTTAWA DISTRICT.

Ottawa, McLeod Street.—That permission be granted the Trustees of McLeod Street Church to sell their church property, proceeds to be applied to the new church being built.

QUEBEC DISTRICT.

French Mission,—That permission be granted the Trustee Board to sell one-quarter of an acre of land in their possession, not conveniently located for church purposes, proceeds to be applied to the purchase of one acre of land in a convenient locality.

Richmond.—That permission be granted the Trustees of parsonage property to sell the same, proceeds to be applied to the payment of mortgage on the said property and to the liquidation of debt on the Richmond Church.

WATERLOO DISTRICT.

Pigeon Hill.—That permission be granted the Trustees of Pigeon Hill Church property to sell lot No. 355 of St. Armand West and apply the proceeds as here stated: \$100 to be invested for the benefit of the Pigeon Hill burial ground belonging to the Methodist Church, \$35.00 to be given to the Bedford parsonage, \$27.00 for sundry expenses, and \$50.00 to be given to the Church and Parsonage Fund.

Farnham.—Your Committee recommend that the Trustee Board of the Farnham Church property be advised to effect a loan at the lowest possible interest for a period of five years, more or less, to the amount of the present debt, mortgaging the property for the same, thus relieving the present burden.

REPORT OF STATISTICAL COMMITTEE.

The members of the Committee on Statistics beg to report as follows: Received on trial during the year, 2,300, a decrease of 839. present total membership is 37,360, being a decrease of 455.

The number withdrawn is 485.

The number lost by letters of removal, deducting those received by letter, is 458.

The rite of baptism has been administered to 2,480 children and 201 adults, being a total of 2,681, showing a decrease of 182.

The burials attended are 1,472.

We regret to report a decrease in connexional funds as follows:

Missionary Fund, \$742.56; General Conference Fund, \$80.70; Union Church Relief Fund, \$10.90; Contingent Fund, \$5.22.

There is a slight increase in the remaining connexional funds.

Whereas, it is both desirable and important that strictly accurate statistical returns be secured from the circuits, districts and the Conference; and whereas, the returns from the districts and the Conference cannot be accurate unless the circuit schedules are correct; and whereas, the Discipline provides for the appointing of auditors on the second day only of the District Meeting; therefore

Resolved, - That we most strongly recommend as a prudential measure that two ministers be appointed to examine the Circuit schedules on the first day of the District Meeting, and that these report to the Auditing Committee on the second day; and further, we suggest that financial secretaries be prepared to check the connexional funds as they are read from the schedules in the annual District Meeting.

SABBATH SCHOOL COMMITTEE REPORT.

Your Committee reports with pleasure an encouraging return from the Sunday Schools.

The increase both in the number of scholars and the sum raised for

school purposes indicates greater activity in the work.

We observe a marked improvement in the contribution of the schools

for connexional funds.

Not only have we \$100 more for missions, but the new appeals on behalf of the Sunday School Aid and the Educational Funds have met with an encouraging response; but the appointment of a General Secretary for young people's work calls for more vigorous financial support. We believe that in order to maintain the prosperity of our Church it is highly important to inspire the minds and church-life of our young people with connexional principles. This can be best secured by inducing an abiding sympathy with the Sunday School Aid and the Educational Funds, one of which expresses the solidarity of interest in Sunday School work for the Church of the future, while the other appeals to the young to provide for the fullest equipment of their own future pastors. We commend to our schools these funds for a more liberal support.

The Home Department gives as yet a small return. If we are to realize the true idea of the Sunday School in the whole Church studying the Bible, there must be a development in this department. The daily Bible readings connected with the lessons should be read in all our families. A more consecutive reading of the Scripture in public worship, and a constant study of the contents of the lessons in the homes, would make the work in the school itself much more fruitful. We would again emphasize the need of the more intelligent, as well as the more reverent,

study of the lesson text by the teacher.

There is cause for regret in the scarcity of teachers' meeetings for the study of the lessons, and we suggest that where practicable circuit Bible classes be held. And to these classes let those be welcomed who are qualifying to become teachers. As an incitement to such work the utilization of the examinations of the American Institute of Sacred Literature might prove effective. In this connection we heartly recommend the adoption of the motion of Mr. Chas. Morton referred to us:

"That in view of the great importance of Sunday School work, educationally, as well as religiously, and in view of the expressed readiness of the staff of the Wesleyan Theological College, Montreal, to make their Institution helpful in the furtherance of this work and the training of the students and Sunday School workers, we, as a Conference, express our cordial approval of such a policy, and the hope that representatives of our Sunday School interests throughout the Conference will aid in carrying it into effect, as it may be developed by the Methodist Sabbath School Association of Montreal."

In order to make permanent in the memory of the children the essential facts of the lessons, with the history and location of the events, as well as the more important passages, we would suggest examinations of a simple character, by questions requiring short written answers, and would request the Book Room to prepare suitable papers. This course supplementing a quarterly review and a quarterly pre-view, would much increase the permanent value of our work.

There are many schools reported as closed during part of the year. While recognizing special difficulties in some cases, we would urge that the utmost efforts be made to maintain the schools in working order summer and winter.

Finally, we recommend that each pastor see that this report be read to all Sunday School workers in his circuit.

EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE REPORT.

Your Committee have pleasure in reporting that the young people of our Church, in their efforts to glorify God in Christian life and work, continue to enjoy the Divine blessing.

We have carefully tabulated and examined the statistics furnished us

in the schedules, and present the following results:

The total number of senior Epworth Leagues and other young people's societies reported to us is 151, an increase of 31. Of these organizations we have: Epworth Leagues, 24; Epworth Leagues of Christian Endeavor, 104; affiliated young people's societies, 6; unaffiliated young people's societies, 17. The total senior membership is 6,067, an increase of 655. The number of junior Leagues reported is 36, and the junior membership, 1,700, an increase of 250. The total number of organizations, junior and senior, is 187. The total membership, junior and senior, is now 7,767; increase, 905. The moneys reported are as follows:

For local purposes, \$1,797.90; for General Epworth League Board, \$207.29; for Missions, \$785.00; for Educational Fund, \$124.10; for Superannuation Fund, \$19.35; for all other purposes, \$2,025.43. Total

income, \$4,959.07.

This is a gratifying financial showing, for while the total is \$561.86 more than was raised last year, the reports show that the amount spent on local society purposes for running expenses, etc., is \$409.23 less than was so spent last year. Our Leagues are spending less money upon them-

selves, and giving more to Missions and kindred causes.

We would mention, also, the gratifying increase in the offerings contributed to the General Epworth League Board, though we regret to say that some 70 of our Leagues and societies have not contributed to this fund during the year. Will pastors kindly see to it that every Epworth League and young people's society shall take up this collection early in the autumn, and that the money be forwarded to the Financial Secretary of the District.

We are glad to report that a very successful and profitable Conference Epworth League Convention was held at Brockville last September, and that conventions have also been held in most of the Districts. District Leagues now exist throughout the Conference, with the exception of Huntingdon, Nipissing, and Sudbury Districts. We are in hope that our General Secretary, Rev. A. C. Crews, will be in a position to spend a considerable time with us during the coming year, and that still greater progress will be the result.

We would respectfully urge all pastors to cultivate a close intimacy with the young people's societies, that this important department of our work may have grandest success. From a communication from the General Secretary, we quote the following: "The Literary Department is being made a source of great interest and power to the League. Our Reading Course has commended itself to the young people, and a very satisfactory commencement has been made. About four hundred sets of the books have been sold during the past year, and a number of Reading Circles have been organized. We would most earnestly recommend that pastors use their influence in the formation of these Reading Circles wherever practicable. And in connection with the Literary work of the Leagues we would suggest that through special sermons by the pastors and lectures provided for by the authority of the Leagues, provision be made for the helpful guidance of our young people in the matter of reading and intellectual culture. The Epworth League stands for the development of a strong and intellectual type of spiritual life and an aggressive missionary zeal among our young people. We commend to your thought the Students' Missionary Campaign, furnishing as it does an admirable opportunity of banding our young people together in prayer for and study of missions, and further, as tending to encourage support of the work of our General Board of Missions."

Permit us in closing to call attention to the comprehensive and helpful Epworth League Handbook prepared by our General Secretary. Every pastor and League worker should have a copy of this work.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

Your Committee beg to report as follows:

After making careful inquiry into the subject of Sabbath observance, we rejoice that the efforts being put forth by our brethren are bearing fruit, and that in certain localities the tide of desecration is being stayed. Still we have here a giant evil which, under various forms, is sapping the spiritual life of our membership.

We would call especial attention to the widely-prevailing custom of Sunday cheese and butter-making in this province, and urge our brethren

to deal firmly with those engaged therein.

We deprecate the opening of post-offices on the Lord's Day, and call upon our people to refrain from posting or receiving mail matter on Sundays. Sunday pleasure driving, or driving with horse or bicycle, social visiting, Sunday excursions, trains and street-cars should be studiously avoided by all Christians.

Brotherhood and military parades, when accompanied by bands of music, and unnecessary Sunday funerals, ought to be discouraged, as they are apt to interfere with our regular services and mar the sanctity of the day.

Further, we recommend our ministers to emphasize, both in and out of the pulpit the extreme change to which one's spiritual life is exposed by pursuance of any practice which in the slightest degree tends to transgress the fourth commandment.

Owing to misrepresentations by certain parties, we would recommend our ministers to carefully explain the reasons for the change of the Sab-

bath from the seventh day to the first day of the week.

We acknowledge receipt of memorials from the ladies of the W.C.T.U., also from Rev. John Nichols, of the Presbyterian Church, asking for co-operation in the formation of a Lord's Day Alliance for the Province of Quebec. This has our hearty approval, and we recommend that an influential committee be appointed by this Conference to act in conjunction with similar committees appointed by other bodies.

TEMPERANCE REPORT.

Your Committee remember with gratitude, that from the days of the Wesleys to the present, our Church has had an intelligent and hearty sympathy with the great Temperance Reform. Our attitude as a church has been and must continue to be one of uncompromising hostility to the

liquor traffic until it shall cease to exist in our midst.

We recommend careful home training in the principle of total abstinence from all intoxicants. We remind our Sabbath Schools of the pledge that so many have taken, and we hope that all members of the schools be so pledged, and that full returns of all so pledged be made to the Annual Conference. We are glad that our Epworth Leagues and young people's societies in connection with the Church have special departments devoted to this great and growing cause, and we trust that they will continue to give special prominence to temperance work. We would also urge our representative men to insist that temperance instruction authorized by law be duly recognized in all our public schools. Our ministers will not fail to bring the claims of total abstinence before their congregations frequently as occasion may demand.

Your Committee heartily commend those newspapers that at great financial sacrifice exclude from their columns the advertisements of the liquor interests, and deplore the fact that so many otherwise respectable periodicals have not yet seen their way clear to declare in favor of total

abstinence and prohibition.

The important judgment recently rendered by the Imperial Privy Council on the question of jurisdiction regarding prohibitory legislation having reaffirmed the authority of the Dominion Parliament alone to pass a law for the total prohibition of the liquor traffic, and also maintaining the Local Option legislation of Ontario and confirming the right of municipal councils to enact prohibitory by-laws in the Province of Quebec; it is of the highest importance that in the approaching general elections to the Dominion Parliament and in all provincial and municipal elections, Methodist electors support by their influence and votes such candidates as are known and avowed prohibitionists and who can be depended upon to loyally support prohibitory legislation regardless of

party exigencies—candidates practising total abstinence principles to always have the preference.

We recommend the friends of Temperance to continually press upon the representatives the duty of enacting the utmost measure of pro-

hibitory legislation within their power.

That this Conference deeply deplores the

That this Conference deeply deplores the fact that the sale of intoxicating liquor has been so long permitted within the precincts of the House of Commons at Ottawa. The facilities thus officially provided by our Government for the supply of liquor ought not to have the countenance of a Christian people. We earnestly hope that the parliament about to be elected will at once abolish the unseemly and unnecessary phase of the liquor traffic.

That this Conference reaffirms its declaration in favor of the plebiscite on the question of prohibition as affording a grand opportunity of disseminating temperance and prohibition instruction, and of registering the will of the people of Canada on this great question apart from all political

party complications.

We exceedingly regret that the subject of prohibition has received such scant consideration by the parliaments of Canada.

During the thirty sessions of the House of Commons that have been held since Confederation, in only one has there been introduced and

passed any prohibitory legislation.

We deem it but fair to remind our people that while neither of the two great political parties now before the country has declared in favor of prohibition, one has entirely ignored the question, while the other has put the matter of taking a plebiscite on the question of prohibition as a plank in its platform, and on the hustings the leader has promised that in the event of his accession to power and a declaration in favor of prohibition be the result of said plebiscite, his administration will enact a prohibitory law in regard to the liquor traffic.

We reaffirm the paragraph of the Conference report of 1893, which reads as follows: "That we as a Conference declare that in view of the magnitude of the evils of intemperance, so apparent to all and the great barrier to the extension of Christ's kingdom, which the liquor traffic undoubtedly is, no Government having the power to prohibit the traffic, and neglecting to do so, is worthy of the support of Christian electors."

Tobacco.

That while not desiring to interfere with the personal, conscientious judgment of any man, it is the solemn conviction of this Committee that the best qualification for faithful and efficient service in the cause of Christ cannot be attained by persons who indulge in the use of tobacco in any form.

For this reason as well as others, we earnestly appeal to all our own members to abstain from its use.

Your Committee recommend that the Conference comply with the request of the Dominion Alliance to send four delegates to the annual meeting of the Alliance Council, and that the delegates be Rev. John Webster, Rev. C. D. Baldwin, Mr. G. M. Webster, Mr. Arthur Chown.

That it be an instruction of this Conference to its ministers to read this report in their congregations next Sabbath.

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE FRENCH WORK

The terms of our appointment are extensive. We are instructed "to examine fully into the French work and to report to the next Conference." In obedience to our instructions we beg to present the following report for your consideration, inasmuch as it embodies the results of our investigation into the history of the French work so far as accessible to us.

The first mission with which we are connected as a part of our present work among the French was begun in 1855, when the Rev. Francois Pepin was appointed to the city of Quebec. From the organization in 1855 till 1862 (seven years), there are found no return of members or contributions to any fund. In 1862 the membership return was twenty, which would lead to the conclusion that the returns in former years were defective. This pioneer mission was continued until 1867, when we infer from the records, it was discontinued, but left a membership numbering twelve. Between the years 1855 and 1874 we have records of the establishment of nineteen additional missions, the existence of which was varied. In 1874 we have at the time of the union, by which the Methodist Church of Canada was organized, 6 missions, 6 missionaries, eighty members who contributed \$83.15 to the Missionary Fund, and the grants that year amounted to \$5,005.45.

In the year 1875 these missions were formed into a French District, to the chair of which the late Rev. John Borland was elected, which position he held until 1881, when the late Rev. William Scott was called to fill the position. During the years of Mr. Borland's occupancy of the chair the number of missions increased from six, when the district was organized, to eleven, in 1877, but in 1881 there was a diminution of the number by two, so that when Mr. Scott assumed the duties of chairman there were nine missions under his care, with eight missionaries, 379 members, and givings \$478.55. In so far as the number of missions is concerned, it may be remarked that 11 is the largest number in operation during the years of our French work, and that number was reached in the year 1877, already mentioned, and again in 1880.

In the year 1883 the late Rev. L. A. Beaudry was chosen as chairman, and came to the office with 6 missions, 6 missionaries, 285 members, giving, as per records which cover only the contributions of Montreal and Waterloo Districts, \$58.30.

In 1884 there are returned 10 missions, with 9 missionaries and 199 members, and contributions of \$384.06, being an increase of 4 missions and a decrease of 89 members. In 1886 the French Missions were again incorporated with the English work, and each became an integral part of the district within the boundaries of which it was located. At the date of their return to their former status there were 9 missions, 8 missionaries, 271 members, who contributed \$349.34 to the Missionary Fund.

From that year to the present date no change has been made in the management of these Missions, and our last returns of 1895 give us 7 missions, upon which we employ 7 missionaries. There are 264 members, with a total givings for all purposes connected with the Missions of \$1,000.49.

On several, if not on all, of these Missions there are Sabbath Schools

under the direction of our missionaries, but the report of our Sabbath School work as given in our Minutes of Conference is not sufficient in details for us to give satisfactory statements regarding them.

COST OF OPERATION.

The data within our reach do not enable us to give in minutiæ the expenses, but from the year 1875 to the present date the amount expended annually for evangelistic work, as distinguished from the educational, may be placed at an average of \$5,000.00 including the work of colporteurs. There is no appreciable difference in the cost of the two methods, viz., a French district with its separate autonomy, and the present system.

RESULTS.

Your Commission would here again claim your sympathy for this work on account of the almost insurmountable obstacles in the way of the rapid evangelization of the French-Canadian people. It is from the very nature of the work exceedingly slow in its progress and apparent results. To number our French Israel without an intimate knowledge of the silent opposition to that work, and also its equally silent advance, gives an unfair and disheartening view of the work done by our brethren in that department of our Mission work. While our numbers afford little to cheer, taken by themselves as given in our statistics, yet we know that by their toil the church at large is enriched. Oftentimes it is the churches of the English-speaking people at home, but more frequently the churches in some place far remote from the humble mission where your missionary has patiently toiled amid discouragements and often with scant sympathy, whose only visible reward was the emigration of those to whom he had been a torch-bearer to guide them into the sacred experience of the new birth with its unspeakable joy. This his trial, however, adds strength to the work of Christ in some other part of the Lord's kingdom on earth. Divine forces, as silent yet as irresistible as the growth of the forest, are at work among this people, and though we assume not the role of the inspired seer, yet we try to "discern the signs of the times," and in them we see indubitable evidence of the steady emancipation of the French-Canadian people from the smothering, stifling, influence of Rome upon their intellectual and moral life

It may be that an important part of our duty is to patiently stand waiting ready to reach out the hand of welcome and sympathy to such as long to break the bonds of Rome and quietly lead them into the

light of evangelical truth.

One feature in this mission work demands our notice here. It is said we have an itinerant ministry. We will say this work of French evange-lization has not only an itinerant ministry, but the work itself partakes largely of the same characteristic, and it is necessary to its success that it should do so.

This fact, properly interpreted, reveals to us, not the want of ordinary judgment in the selection of the fields on which to sow the seed, as might appear at first glance, but the aggressive zeal and evangelical spirit of the workers. As the doors were opened they entered, and when

the people of one city refused to receive them they shook off the dust of the city as a testimony against them and went to another. For this they had the best authority.

When the work accomplished by our missionaries, colporteurs and teachers is compared with that of the agents of the other churches occupying the same field we have no cause to disparage our work, much less to abandon it. Proportionate success has been given to our efforts by the Head of the Church, as compared with that of sister churches. We approve of our present methods, which consist of colportage, to spread the Word and create a spirit of inquiry; of schools, to educate the young and lay foundations for permanent characters; and the preaching of the Word, by which souls, through the Spirit's power, are brought into light and peace. Earnest, consecrated and patient toil is the chief requirement to secure success. We discover no tokens of success in one method, nor signs of failure in another, which justify us in preferring one of the methods already tried to the other. Here, as in the Church of Christ universal, fervent desire and holy zeal will adapt themselves to surroundings and do faithful work, and in reference to our French work accomplish the will of the Master, so we may again sing,

> We'll labor on at Thy command And offer all our works to Thee.

REPORT OF MEMORIALS COMMITTEE.

Your Committee report as follows:

Re Memorial from Quarterly Board of the St. James Church, Montreal: Whilst convinced that such agency would advance the interests of the work of French evangelization, your Committee, because of the existing urgent claims upon our missionary income, would recommend that the Memorial be not adopted at this time.

Re Memorial from the Nipissing District, your Committee would recommend the adoption of the Memorial, amended as follows:

Whereas, there exists with many in our Church a conviction that in view of the extent and increasing importance of domestic missionary operations, the time has arrived for the severance of this department of our missionary work from the Foreign work:

Your Committee would therefore recommend:

That a Committee be appointed to inquire into the various phases of this important question in order to ascertain concerning the advisability of such a course being adopted.

Your Committee would recommend:

That the other Annual Conferences be requested to appoint similar committees empowered to co-operate in dealing with this matter, and instructed to report to their respective Annual Conferences of 1898, so that if required suitable legislation may be enacted by the General Conference of that year.

Re Memorial from Huntingdon District, your Committee recommend: That the Conference urge upon all our Circuits and Missions the necessity of carrying out the provisions made respecting parsonages and furniture as stated in Discipline, chap. II., sec. 1, paragraphs 253 and 254, and sec. 3, paragraph 255.

Re communication from the Prisoners' Aid Association, your Committee recommend the appointment of a Standing Committee to deal with this important matter.

THE STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee beg to report as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the reception of 2,300 new members during the year, it regrets that, owing to a large number of removals and withdrawals, it has to report a considerable net decrease.

2. It rejoices that the agitation in some parts of the Conference during the past three or four years has not weakened the loyalty or service of the people, nor diminished the strength and influence of the Church.

3. It recognizes the value of special services as an important agency for leading human lives to the initial step of a Christian course, and as thereby contributing in part to the increase of membership, but it deplores (1) the excessive use of this agency to the relative subordination of the ordinary means of grace and the faithful culture of Christian life; and (2) the undue dependence for this work on the non-resident or professional evangelist. It is persuaded that the present condition of the Church needs chiefly the preaching of the truth in the power of the Spirit, faithful pastoral work and a systematic prayerful study of the Word of God by the whole Church.

4. It would recommend the appointment of a small committee to prepare a circular to be sent to every circuit and mission in the Conference during the ensuing year, asking the following questions: (1) What is the state of religion in the homes of your congregation, especially with reference to family worship? (2) What is the proportion of non-churchgoers to the population under your charge? It recommends that the answers to these questions be submitted to the District Meetings as a basis for discussion on the state of the work.

5. Touching the memorial of St. James Church from Montreal District re Evangelistic work, it recommends that because of financial and other considerations the request be not granted, that is, that the Conference do not take such steps as are necessary to secure the services of the Rev. Thomas Cook; but that it hereby express its hearty approval of and sympathy with any proposal to invite a connexional evangelist of the British Wesleyan Conference to labor for a time in connection with our Church.

MINUTES OF MEETINGS OF THE LAY ASSOCIATION OF THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST CHURCH.

HELD AT STANSTEAD, JUNE 5TH AND 6TH, 1896.

The meeting was called to order by the Vice-President, Mr. F. S.

The draft of Constitution was read and adopted, and the Executive Committee were ordered to print and distribute copies of the same to all lay members of Conference.

It was resolved that, in view of the deep interest taken by Methodist laymen in the missionary enterprises of the Church, it is the opinion of this Lay Association that when the Financial District Meeting provides that local arrangements in connection with the Missionary Anniversary services be made, such arrangements should be made by the local Missionary Committee, or in the absence of such a committee, by the Quarterly Official Board of the circuit or station.

That, if any legislation is necessary to give effect to this resolution, the Conference be, and is hereby, requested to secure the same.

Considerable discussion ensued upon the desirability of the District Meeting electing only such members as will attend Conference, and also upon the want of notice of such election when made. It was resolved to ask the Conference to instruct the district secretaries to notify all laymen of their election immediately after the District Meeting rises.

Resolved,—That in view of the necessity of suitable persons being elected to the Conference and to the various committees of Conference, by the District Meetings, the Executive Committee be ordered to prepare and formulate a series of suggestions to be sent to the secretary of each Quarterly Board in the Conference.

The need of great care in recommending young men for the ministry

was pointed out, and met with hearty approval.

Resolved, -That the Lay Association most heartily endorses the resolution presented to the Conference this morning concerning the need of better qualifications of all Methodist students and Sunday School workers in Sunday School lines. It is earnestly hoped that the Conference will make provision for the appointment of some person to take charge of a course of lectures in the Wesleyan Theological College, with this end in

Resolved,—That the Conference be requested to place at least the President of this Association upon the Committee of Arrangements for the next Conference.

Resolved,—That this Lay Association expresses its condemnation of the system of extending invitations to pastors, as tending to increase the difficulties of the Stationing Committee, and in its results seriously affecting the spiritual interests of our Connexion. We strongly recommend that such invitations be not recognized by the Conference or the Stationing Committee.

Resolved,-That all the business of the Association, including a copy of the Constitution, be submitted to the Conference for its information, and such action as may be necessary.

The election resulted in the choice of Hon. Judge Deacon, Pembroke, President; W. H. Lambly, Esq., Inverness, Vice-President; Mr. Charles Morton, Montreal, Secretary-Treasurer; Messrs. Wm. Hanson, Montreal; William Gliddon, Ottawa; James Knox, Montreal; H. W. Perrett, Pembroke; and W. W. Dalgleish, Huntingdon, Executive Committee. All of which is respectfully submitted.

CONSTITUTION OF THE LAY ASSOCIATION OF THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST CHURCH.

1. This association shall be called "The Lay Association of the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church."

2. Its objects are thus defined:-

(a) To promote the interests of the Methodist Church.

(b) To disseminate a knowledge of the duties, responsibilities and

privileges of Laymen.

(c) To promote among its members, unity, social acquaintance, mutual helpfulness, and a more intelligent knowledge of their duties, so that they may be in a better position to co-operate with the Ministers of the Church.

3. The Association shall be composed of :-

(a) Active members, consisting of the Lay members of Conference.

(b) Associate members, consisting of all official members of the Church, who, however, will not have the right to vote, nor to make or second motions, but will have the right to discuss any questions brought before the Association.

4. The membership fee shall be 25 cents per year, from all Lay Delegates to Conference who are members of the Association, and payable before said delegate is entitled to the rights of active membership.

5. The Officers of the Association shall be a President, a Vice-President,

and a Secretary-Treasurer.

6. The management of the Association shall be vested in an Executive Committee, composed of the Officers of the Association and five other active members of the Association. Five members of the Executive Committee shall form a quorum.

7. The election of Officers and other members to the Executive Committee shall take place yearly, by ballot, at the annual meeting of the Association, held on the Friday afternoon following the opening of Conference, and if practicable, immediately on the rising of Conference.

8. During their term of office the Executive Committee shall have full control of and be responsible for the management and finances of the Association. It shall have power to fill any vacancies which may occur in its number.

9. The President shall have power to call meetings of the Executive Committee at any time, to prepare business for the annual meeting, and

any subsequent meetings held during the Session of Conference.

10. The Constitution shall not be altered or amended except at an annual meeting, and notice of any proposed alteration or amendment shall be given to the Secretary-Treasurer in writing, at least two weeks before the day of meeting. The proposed alterations or amendments must be posted in the Conference Church at least one day before the annual meeting.

11. Amendments to proposed changes, of which notice has been given,

shall be in order without previous notice.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

RULES OF ORDER.

The Rules of Order will be those laid down in the Book of Discipline and governing the General Conference of the Methodist Church.

DUTY OF OFFICERS.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Association and Executive Committee, and shall perform such other duties as by custom devolve upon a presiding officer. In his absence the Vice-President shall preside; and in the absence of the Vice-President a pro-tempore Chairman shall be appointed on nomination, the Secretary putting the question.

DUTY OF SECRETARY.

The Secretary shall keep a full and just record of the proceedings of the Association and of the Executive Committee; shall give notice of the meetings of the Association, and of the Executive Committee; shall conduct such correspondence as may be required; and shall have his records present at all meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee.

DUTIES OF TREASURER.

The Treasurer shall receive and hold in safe keeping all moneys paid to the Association; shall invest, deposit, or expend the same as the Executive Committee shall order; and shall keep an exact account of his receipts and expenditure, with vouchers for the latter; he shall present an abstract thereof to the Association.

DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The Executive Committee shall have power to fill all vacancies in their own body; shall have in charge the general interests of the Association; shall make all necessary arrangements for its meetings; and shall do all in their power to render it a useful and honorable institution. Five of the members shall form a quorum for business. The President shall have power to call a meeting whenever the interests of the Association may seem to demand it.

Two Auditors shall be elected at each annual meeting, for the purpose of auditing the accounts of the Association. These Auditors shall hold no other office in this Association during their term of office.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON COMMUNICATION FROM LAYMEN'S ASSOCIATION.

Your Committee, to whom was referred the communication from the

Laymen's Association, beg to report:

1. That the recommendation concerning local arrangements for missionary meetings be adopted, so far as it does not interfere with proper pastoral oversight.

2. That the District Meeting be urged to regard the suggestion for care in the election of representatives on the different Conference Com-

mittees.

- 3. That it be an instruction to the secretary of the laymen's meeting of the district "to notify all laymen of their election immediately after the District Meeting rises," and that all ministers and laymen that desire a billet during Conference shall notify the secretary of the Billeting Committee.
- 4. That the President and Secretary of Conference, and the pastor of the church where the Conference is to be held, together with the President and Secretary of the Laymen's Association, be a Committee on Conference Programme; and that the secretaries of districts meet the day before the Ministerial Session of Conference to tabulate the business and other information coming up from the District Meetings, for the use of the Conference.

5. That action on the "extending of invitations to pastors" be deferred until the next annual session of the Conference.

ALMA COLLEGE.

Moved by Rev. F. Chisholm, seconded by Rev. W. Blair, B.A., and Resolved,—That we regard with great pleasure the progress of this flourishing ladies' College situated at St. Thomas, Ont., and sympathize fully with it in its great and noble work, giving to the young ladies of our fair Dominion the advantages of the higher collegiate education. For its pure and elevated social and religious influences, for its healthy religious atmosphere and for its thorough intellectual discipline it is eminently worthy of the confidence and patronage of our people.

SUPERANNUATION FUND REPORT.

Moved by Dr. T. G. Williams, seconded by Dr. S. P. Rose, and Resolved,—That this Conference requests the Board of the Superannuation Fund to send a printed statement of the Annual Report of said fund to this Conference, so that each member may have a copy in his possession, on the first day of the meeting of the Annual Conference in each year.

GENERAL CONFERENCE FUND.

The following recommendation by the Special Committee on the Report of the Board of the Superannuation Fund, was adopted by the Conference:

"Your Committee would therefore recommend that the respective circuits of this Conference be urged to contribute more liberally to the collections for the General Conference Fund, in order that the present large liability may be reduced."

MANITOBA SCHOOL QUESTION.

Moved by Rev. Dr. Hunter, seconded by Sidney Stephens, and Resolved,—That the Rev. Drs. Ryckman, Griffith, Williams, Shaw and the mover, together with Messrs. W. A. Morehouse, W. W. Dalgleish, His Worship R. W. Steacey, L. J. Day and W. W. Williams, be a committee to which shall be referred the mandement of the Romish hierarchy and the utterances of the prieathood relating thereto, and also all matters connected with the Manitoba school question for consideration, and report, if deemed advisable by the Committee.

The following resolutions were submitted by the Special Committee on above subjects, and adopted by the Conference.

RESOLUTION I.

That while we accord to our Roman Catholic fellow-citizens, lay and clerical, the same liberty of speech on all questions, religious, secular and political, which we claim for ourselves, we enter our earnest protest against the baseless assumptions of the Roman Catholic hierarchy as voiced in the "Mandement" of the bishops of this province, and in a sermon recently preached by Bishop Lafleche, of Three Rivers, and in which the former claim for the Roman Catholic Church a place of supremacy and superiority in all things above the state or the civil government under which we live, and whose protection we enjoy; and the latter teaches the dangerous and disloyal doctrine that no Catholic can be good and true who does not in his political capacity look at any and every subject from the standpoint of Roman Catholicism above all other standpoints. Adopted by unanimous vote.

RESOLUTION II.

That the Conference regards the attitude of the hierarchy as inimical to the welfare of the Dominion, inasmuch as it insists upon the obedience of its adherents to the command of the Church in supporting a political party which, in consideration of such support, will be pledged to wield the power it may possess in the interest of the Church and to the detriment of good government in this country. Adopted by unanimous vote.

RESOLUTION III.

That we regret the unwisdom of such politicians as would imperil the peace, prosperity and liberties of the Dominion by attempting to impose upon the Province of Manitoba a school law which is repugnant to a large majority of the people of that province, and which has not been asked for by a majority of the Roman Catholic population.

AMENDMENT TO RESOLUTION III.

Moved in amendment by J. M. Oxley, seconded by Rev. Dr. Shaw,— That we deem it unwise for this Conference to compromise itself by dealing on the eve of a general election with a political question on which the laity of the Church is widely divided, considering that such a course is adverse to the highest interest of the Church, and tends to the perpetuation of religious strife so inimical to the welfare of the country.

AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDMENT.

Moved in amendment to the amendment by Rev. Jas. Elliott, seconded by Rev. S. G. Bland,—That as in the matter of the Manitoba school question, the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council has declared on the one hand that the Province acted in its constitutional right when it abolished state-aided Separate schools, and on the other that thereby a grievance has been inflicted on the Catholic minority, we, the members of the Montreal Conference, hereby express our conviction that the question can be wisely settled only by conciliation and compromise, and recommend that the best influence of the Methodist Church be used to bring about said adjustment in the spirit of the Golden Rule.

The amendment to the amendment was lost. The amendment was lost; yeas 14, nays 142. Resolution III. was adopted; yeas 144, nays 16. The Report as a whole was adopted.

INTERNATIONAL ARBITRATION.

Moved by Rev. E. B. Ryckman, D.D., seconded by Wm. Sawyer, Esq.: Whereas we believe the spirit of Christianity to be adverse to the settlement of international disputes by appeals to physical force involving all the horrors of war, and to be in favor of an amicable and judicial decision upon all international differences of interests and policy; and whereas leading public men both in Europe and America are advocating a permanent court of arbitration on all Anglo-American questions; therefore resolved, that we, the ministers and laymen of the Montreal Conference, record our profound conviction that the interests alike of the Church, of the State, and of the race, would be best served by the general substitution of arbitration for war. It would be to us a matter of greatest satisfaction should those nations to which God has given the highest places of power and influence—Great Britain and the United States of America-lead the way in creating and promoting humane and Christian sentiments on this subject until the nations shall learn war no more and universal peace shall prevail.

MEMORIAL re ARMENIANS.

Moved by Rev. W. J. Hunter, D.D., seconded by W. H. Lambly, Esq. Whereas the Christian world has been shocked by reliable reports of the political and industrial position of the Armenian population; and

Whereas one of our greatest national needs is the settlement of

our unoccupied lands by honest and thrifty people;

Therefore be it resolved, That we memorialize the Dominion Government to extend an invitation to the Armenians to settle within the Dominion, and to assign them a district for this purpose;

And that the Secretary of Conference be instructed to forward this

memorial to the proper authorities.

Re EVANGELISTS.

Resolved,—That this Conference, in harmony with paragraph 181, page

101, Book of Discipline, provides as follows:

1. That a central committee be appointed by the Conference, on nomination of the President, to prepare a uniform method of examining evangelists who seek work within the bounds of our Conference, especially as touching three matters—character, doctrine and methods of work—the first and second to be similar to the requirements for the standing of a Local Preacher, and the third to be determined by the report of the Committee on Evangelistic Work presented to this Conference. The Chairman and Financial Secretary are authorized to give effect to the provisions of the Central Committee for their respective Districts, and report each case that comes before them to the Central Committee for their final action in accrediting such evangelists.

2. That evangelists licensed by the Committee be required to communicate with this Committee for a renewal of their licenses within one month prior to the expiration of the year, dating from the granting of the license, thus harmonizing this method with the Discipline relating to the minis-

ters and local preachers in our Church.

3. That no evangelist of the Methodist Church shall conduct evangelistic services on any circuit or mission in the Montreal Conference without an invitation or the expressed concurrence of the superintendent of such charge; and we desire in the clearest way to affirm our conviction that all evangelists in our Church must be subject to the authorities of the Church, and conform to our usual customs.

SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON THE NEEDS OF THE WORK.

Moved by the Rev. H. Meyers, seconded by Rev. G. G. Huxtable, and Resolved,—That we recommend that on the first day of the special ministerial session of the Conference, a special committee of five, nominated by the President, be appointed to inquire into the needs of the work and report the number of candidates recommended to be received on trial.

BIBLICAL STUDY.

Moved by Rev. James Elliott, B.A., seconded by Rev. S. P. Rose, D.D.,

Whereas the time and energy devoted to Biblical study under authority of Conference have been abundantly justified by results

this year; be it therefore resolved, That three morning hours be set aside at next Conference for such study and exposition; that the subject for consideration be the Sermon on the Mount; and that the Revs. F. G. Lett, W. Sparling and C. E. Bland be the Expositors.

INDEX TO CONFERENCE JOURNAL.

Moved by Rev. F. G. Lett, seconded by Rev. J. B. Saunders, M.D., and

Resolved,—That Rev. William Philp, B.D., be requested to prepare a suitable index to the Conference Journal completed last year.

COMMITTEE ON MINUTES.

Moved by Judge Deacon, seconded by Rev. Rev. D. C. Sanderson, and Resolved,—That a committee of three be nominated by the Chair to take into consideration during the year the publication of the Mirates of Conference, as to number, method, etc.

BILLETING ARRANGEMENTS FOR 1897.

Resolved, -That each member of Conference, ministerial and lay, be

required to pay a billeting fee of \$2 as heretofore.

Resolved,—That it shall be the duty of the Financial Secretaries to collect the billeting fee from delegates who attend the Annual Conference from their respective districts, and pay the same over to the Secretary of the Billeting Committee; that each minister purposing attendance shall notify the said Secretary on or before April 1st, and that each lay delegate who expects to attend the Conference shall notify the said Secretary immediately upon receipt of notice of his own election; and that the Secretary of the laymen's meeting of each district shall notify the lay delegates immediately after their election.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS.

DISTRICT JOURNALS, ETC., TO BE DEPOSITED IN LIBRARY OF WESLEYAN
THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE.

It was Resolved,—That the following resolution, passed at a former Conference session, be retained in the printed Minutes as a standing resolution: "That the Librarian of the Wesleyan Theological College be requested to take the custody of completed District Journals and other church documents of valuable historical interest, to be deposited in the Library of said Institution, and to be accessible at all times to members of this Conference.

MINISTERS CHANGING CIRCUITS.

It was on motion, Resolved,—That ministers changing circuits be responsible for the supply of circuits they are leaving for two Sundays after the rising of Conference.

Re DEGREES.

In relation to the recognition of Academic titles, the Board of Examiners recommends:

1. That all degrees from Canadian universities and theological colleges be recognized in the Conference records.

2. That continued recognition be given to all degrees recognized in the Minutes of 1891.

3. That in the case of foreign degrees, on the same being reported to the Board of Examiners, recognition shall be given by not less than a two-thirds vote of the examiners present at the Annual Meeting. Action may be delayed by the Board calling for further information, or for production of the calendars of the colleges concerned, or of the diplomas, and the Board shall have discretionary power to deal with each case on its merits.

4. Diplomas shall in no case be recognized from so-called "Correspondence Colleges," which have no provision for lectures and for instruction of resident students.

STANDING OF PROBATIONERS.

Resolved,—That the number of years spent on probation be published in the Minutes of Conference, the standing to be given when the studies corresponding to the years credited shall be completed.

REV. JOHN ARMSTRONG.

Moved by Rev. Dr. Ryckman, seconded by Judge John Deacon, and Resolved,—That the Conference recognizes the faithful service rendered by the Rev. John Armstrong, the President, during the past year, and desires hereby to convey to him an expression of appreciation and gratitude for his wisdom in council, his impartiality in administration, his abundant labors, and the unfailing kindness and courtesy which have characterized all his intercourse with his brethren. The Conference assures the ex-President of its cordial respect and affection, and of its earnest desire and prayer that his years of service may yet be prolonged, and that the evening of his life may be serene and happy in the favor of God and of the Church, which he has so long and efficiently served.

The Minutes were read and confirmed; and at 1 o'clock p.m., on the 10th day of June, 1896, the Conference sessions closed with the benediction, pronounced by Rev. John Armstrong, the ex-President.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

The ministers of the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church assembled in the village of Stanstead in its thirteenth annual session, send cordial greetings to the churches under their care. "Grace and peace be multiplied unto you in the knowledge of God, and of Jesus Christ our Lord."

In considering the state of the Lord's work among us, we are impressed with a widespread want of recognition of the exalted position and responsibilities of the Church of Christ. We believe that no man can, even conscientiously, hold aloof from the Church without great, possibly fatal, spiritual loss; and that he who without conscientious cause neglects or despises the fellowship of the people of Christ separates himself from Christ. We believe it impossible to overestimate the relation between the two—a relation so intimate and vital that in the New Testament the Church is described as the body of Christ.

Clearly then the Church is designed to be the manifestation of Christ, His chosen witness and revelation. To-day it is often the darkest veil to Him. No pleading with unrepentent men is more common than the appeal to disregard, to overlook the Church. No pleading can be so shameful and suicidal. If the Church does not shame men, convince of sin, rebuke this complacency, it is not likely that anything will. Brethren, let us face the situation. We cannot hope that people will look away from the Church. Christ has placed His Church here to be looked at, to be most keenly and critically examined. In the first ages the Church stood the test. Christ will soon rule this country and this continent when that test can be endured, also, by the Church of to-day.

While considering the Church we cannot refrain from expressing regret ever a hindrance to the Church's attainment of the ideal that sometimes exists in the division between the temporal and the spiritual interests of the Church. Our trustee boards in too many instances furnish comparatively few class-leaders, few Sunday School teachers, few who take part in the love-feast and prayer-meeting. We recognize gratefully the business sagacity, the generosity, the self-sacrificing solicitude of many of these brethren in regard to the financial interests of the Church, but the trustee board or the quarterly official board is not constituted after the New Testament pattern in which reference to the spiritual interests of the Church will not awaken keen interest and earnest discussion. The men who were chosen by the apostolic Church to take charge of the funds were required to be men full of the Holy Ghost and of faith.

The same spirit, we may add, should animate those who contribute to the musical part of the service. We gratefully recognize the value of this element in public worship, and the devotion of those who consecrate their talents and time to this end. We believe also that no artistic cultivation on the part of choir or congregation can be too great. But we would caution against the very real danger of losing sight of the spiritual aims of the musical service, and of reducing it to mere esthetic entertainment. Mere sensuous pleasure, however refined, must not be confounded with

spiritual worship; and the musical service fails that is not auxiliary to the preaching of the Word, and that does not lift the heart of the worshippers to God.

Nothing we conceive will contribute a greater quickening impulse to the Church than a class-meeting revival. The class-meeting requires to be informed with a new spirit and aim. More previous preparation on the part of the leader, more study of the Scriptures and of the problems of Christian experience, will reach depths in the soul-life rarely touched by the ordinary method. The class-meeting should be not merely for the expression of faith and desire, but for the discussion of the needs and duties of the Christian life, carefully guarded from degenerating into a mere intellectual debate. We would suggest the great advisability of leaders consulting together about methods, and bestowing in short a preparation and study on this work such as is claimed by Sunday School teaching and preaching, rather than leaving the direction of the meeting to the chance circumstances of the hour.

Joyfully and with deep thanksgiving we recognize a deepening interest in the Word of God, a closer study of it, a keener desire for preaching that shall open up the treasures of wisdom and knowledge therein. Many are studying who were once content, formally and perfunctorily, to read. A large share of this closer study we believe due to improved Sunday School methods and conventions, well seconded, of late, by our young people's societies. As preachers, we are conscious of our own short-comings in this respect, and earnestly aspire to be a teaching as well as an awakening and converting ministry. We desire to be fellow-students with you of that book out of which fresh light is yet to break to searching hearts, and in which we find not only the record of the Divine education of the race in the past but guidance for all the problems and perplexities which gather about us in this restless and eager age of transition.

In regard to missions the providence of God is imperatively calling us to a larger liberality. In this Conference attention has been drawn to the significant fact that more candidates for the ministry are seeking admission to this Conference than can be given fields of work. This Conference is being compelled to decline the services of men who declare that they are called of God to preach the Gospel, and whose call the Church has approved. What is the influence but that in thus raising up men beyond our own needs God is pushing the Church into larger missionary operations? Unless we are either to deny that God has called these men or to drive them into other churches, we must recognize that God is summoning us out of our abundance to furnish preachers for the regions in which fields are white and harvesters are few. Many of these brethren are willing, even eager, to enter missionary work to send them forth means largely increased missionary gifts. Dare we oppose the will of God ?

Affectionately we commend these considerations, beloved brethren, to your thoughtful attention, praying that to us as a people there may be given wisdom to know the signs of the times and what our Israel should do.
