Co-operation in India.

One of the greatest roads in India is the East Indian railway. This railway has a curious method of investing a percentage of the wages which it pays its hands, which is found to work both to the advantage of the railway and the employes. Wages are very low in India, but through this method many of the amployes have become rich. All of the hands who receive over thirty rupees or \$10 a month have to pay 2 per cent. of their earnings into a certain fund. They can pay as much more than 2 per cent. as they pleasa. The road receives the money, pays interest on it, and upon their leaving the service honorably, gives them back double the amount they have paid in with interest. This seems incredible, but I am assured it is so. An English clergyman told me that he knew a railroad employe who went in at \$10 a month and who will soon take out \$5,000. This method was entered into at the time the railroad was built. The managers were hard up for capital, and they wished to bind their hands to them. The company is now prosperous and keeps up the same system.—Frank G. Carpenter.


