b. That no cow will be entitled to a premium, unless the judges are satisfied, she shall have produced a Calf oritor after the first of January preceeding, or be evidently with Calf at the time of the show
5. That Brood Mares shall be disquallied unless their Colts are brought forwadd with them, to enable the judge more a curately to determine the merit of the Anilial as a Bruod Mare.
6. That no persons be qualified to recelve premiums on Cows, Heifers, Steers, Sheep or Geldings; except Farmers.
7. That no person obtaining premiums on Male Aninials shall refuse the use of such Animal to a reasonable, number of applicants, at a moderate charge, vis:-Stalions fit for the Saddle-inot over Treelve Dollars. Fit for Draft-not over Four DoDars. Bulls and Rime-not over Half a Dollar each.
8. That in future there shall be only one annual District Cattle Show to be held in September, except for Fat Ainlmals which are to be shown in the winter.
9. That all Animis entered in the same clase, shall be kept together on the show ground, not allowing other stock to intermix in order that the judges may be able tocompare, and more sccurately determine the comparative merit of each.

You are to decife which is the best Animal, or lot of Animals in each class, having regard in forming yourjudgment to excellonce and $\mu$ utility of form, quantity of flesh, lightness of offal, propensity to milk or fatten, and early maturity; sloo, in Sheep, to quantity and quality of wool. Having signed your adjudication, you are not to mention your decislon until announced to the Committee, you are not to disclose the opinions of each other, provious to your report, and the deciaion of the majority shall be concluaive, you ahall withhold any premium when there shall not appear to be sufficient merit in the Animal or Its offspring, you shall number the lots in each class, in the order of the comparative merit.

IT. N. B.- When Judges are appointed to the inspection of other than live stock the inetructions to be altered so as to be applicable to that particular inspection; according to the general conditions of the Society. by which the Judges are to be governed in their adjodicattons.
