"The patriot that charming lines— Told of things that they don't understand— He knows— we may apply the lines to the Patriot, for he evidently knows nothing at all about the matter."

We should not have noticed the silly paragraph in the Patriot at all, but it is perfectly notorious that every one connected with the Courier is a staunch member of the Church of England, and, therefore, not at all likely to take the journal "a vehicle of infidel lies," it appears necessary that we defend ourselves by supporting Mr. Gliddon.

Mr. Gliddon, or the Sun for him, says that the "Book of the Dead" and the Pyramids date respectively 1500 years before Abraham, and 2000 years before Moses. According to the Septuagint Chronology, the Deluge occurred 3246 years B. C.; but the same authority places the birth of Abraham at 1070 years after the Deluge, and we conclude that period, and the additional years before Moses, give room and verge enough for the erection of the Pyramids and the "Book of the Dead."

What is the proper question before you?
