We cannot allow space for further extracts from this curious letter, but can express our own opinion that there is no more chance of war, or even of unpleasant feeling, between England and the United States, than there is of our being nominated Dalai Lama by the Thibetian hierarchs. The idea of England or France making common cause with Russia or Austria against the United States in any matter arising out of the Hungarian insurrection, is just as ridiculous as the assumption of the New York Courier & Enquirer, that England is bent on encouraging a rebellion in South Carolina against the Federation. As for the other matters, Cuba, Reci-

procity, Central America, and the imprisonment of British subjects, the latter is the only one likely at all to lend of to unpleasant consequences.
