## Barbarous Celebrations.

LONDON, Nov. 5. News has been received from the West coast of Africa of the death of Chaca, the Govern .. r of Whydah. The funeral was to be celebrated by the massacre of a uative, after which the king had announced his intention of holding the annual celebration in memory of his father. The celebration will last four months, during which 200 captured chiefs will be beheaded. The English have refused to attend the celebration.




