



FIRST MEETING POSTPONED.

WASHINGTON, D.C., Sept. 8. It is now practically certain that the first meeting of the league of nations will not be held in Washington in October as originally planned. The exact date depends upon the action of the United States senate in regard to ratification of the peace treaty containing the covenant which creates the league. Should the senate ratify the treaty in time to premit delegates to arrive for a meeting in November it probably will be held then but if the discussion is much protracted the meeting time is expected to go over until some time in January 1920 Premiers Lloyd George and Clemenceau have promised to attend first nesting if domestic conditions warrant their absence from home. Lord Robert Cecil is regarded as certain to be one of the British delegates.
