After having been much talked of, the resignation of Mr. Daniel Manning, Secretary of the American Treasury, has at last been placed in the hands of President Cleveland. And it has been accepted, too, though with sincere regret, there need be no doubt. Mr. Manning has been one of the few men who, after appointment to office, have developed the ability of the special kind required beyond even the expectations of their friends. It does not, therefore, surprise us to learn that he leaves the National Treasury to take the chair in a better position than that of the Western National Bank, in New York, where his turn for handling matters financial will still be available. The capital of the new bank would not look large for this wooden country—only three millions—but we doubt not that the place is expected to prove not unworthy of an ex-manager of the nation's finances. It is remarkable that a valued subordinate of his in the treasury, Mr. John A. McManis, who had his "pull" for the position, has not been named. Instead of that, it went down, and the "lamb" was deemed to be a tremendous aggregate. If a great rise there is to come, it will not come until the public, who have been expecting it, have first been cleared of the burden of debt. After that, the rise will be in order.

The report of the Directors and the statement for the broken period ending 31st December, 1885, were read. The whole of the \$400,000 of stock offered for subscription has been taken up. The operations of the corporation, extending over about seven months, show that after writing off all preliminary expenses, paying a dividend at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum and taking their property on hand at its actual cost, there remains a net profit of \$13,754.31.

The meeting resolved that shareholders shall have the option of paying an additional 20 per cent. on their stock (\$10 on each share). Payments to be made on the 1st of any month.

Mr. J. C. Copp and Mr. W. G. Cassels were appointed auditors for the ensuing year. The resolutions proposed by the following gentlemen were unanimously adopted: Mr. G. R. R. Cockburn, DONALD MACRAE, HENRY M. PELLATT, E. SPRAYDON, H. W. NELSON, J. P. CLARK, and FRED WYLD.

At a subsequent meeting of the Directors Mr. Geo. R. R. Cockburn was elected President, and Mr. Horace Tracy was elected Vice-President.
