It is impossible to imagine that the varied resources of this great length of seasibore would not afford a considerable traffic. He has found gold and silver at two places on the east main coast and upon what he named the Ottawa Islands off Mequito Bay, a thick band of lead-hearing limestone as Richmond Gulf and mexhaustible deposits of fine mangeniferous iron ore on a number of the islands near the coast beyond Whale River. Indications were also found of copper, zinc, molybdenum, asbestes and other useful minerals. 


