



This is a notable coincidence. eventy-one were children, only 10 were bore 70 years of age. There were 8 deaths om pneumonia, 8 from bronchitis, 7 from phtheria, 2 from scarlet fever and 1 from phoid fever.

At St. Michael's there were 55 interme At St. Michael's there were 55 interments, an increase of 14 compared with May last year. Twenty children were interred and only 11 oid people. The following were among the causes of death: Phthisis 5, bronchitis 3, paeumonia 2, typhoid fever 1. Of the 9 interments in Prospect Cemetery 6 were children. The ages of the others were 26, 45, 70. One death was ascribed to diphtheria and 1 to scarlet fever. On the whole last month's returns were more satisfactory than any recorded this year.
