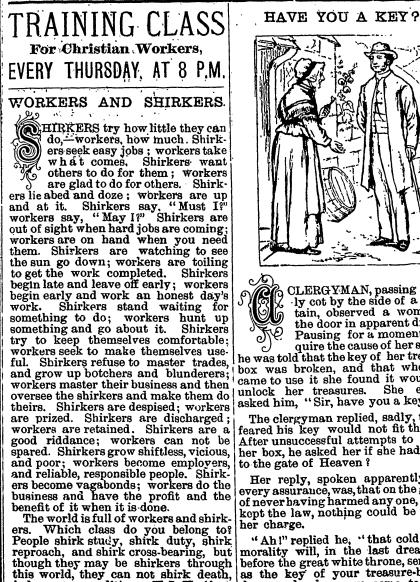

There were some who preached that if men kept the law they should be saved. This St. Paul denied. "By the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in his sight," "A man is justified by faith, without the deeds of the law (Rom iii. 20, 28). Thus we see clearly how it is stated that there is no salvation by the works of the law. What, then is the remedy for sin ? The Apostles sets it before us with equal plainness: "Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified" (Gal. ii. 16).

Dear friend, keep clear the all-important fact that your acceptance be-fore God depends not upon your repentance, your prayers, your feelings, nor even upon your faith. These are all necessary in their place. But your acceptance does not depend on them. It is altogether outside of yourself. You are accepted solely and entirely in the finished work of Christ. "Ye are complete in Him." This is a sure foun-"Ye are dation. Keep your eye fixed on Jesus He is the only key.
