RECIPROCAL DEMURRAGE.
 Present Arrangement Favors Carrying Companies.
 J. H. Duthie, manager of the Crescent Coal and Coke Company, has issued a circular on the subject of the collection of demurrage on car service charges. On June 1, 1905, he appeared before the railway commissioner and presented arguments to show that charges collected by the carrying companies were excessive and contended that the imposition of demurrage charges by the railways had never been legally authorized. As a result, the commission decided that the charges which the companies sought to impose were excessive and that modifications were necessary, and issued an order modifying existing conditions, but at the same time this order makes car service a legal charge. This order, Mr. Duthie claims, is absolutely in the interest of the carrying companies.
