# THE GREAT PITTSBURGH DISASTER

## One Hundred Men Entombed in a Shaft at Pittston, Pa.

### BELIEF THAT ALL HAVE BEEN KILLED

#### Men From Neighboring Collieries Now Working for Dear Life.

#### Full Staff of the Mine Were at Work, Including Superintendent Langan, Foremen and Bosses, When the Cave-in Occurred—Pittston People Thought it Was an Earthquake—Harrowing Scenes at the Mouth of the Shaft—Many Efforts to Reach the Imprisoned Men Were Futile—The Suspense is Terrible to Grief-stricken Wives and Children—A Parallel to the Avondale Calamity.

Pittston, Pa., June 28.—At 7 o'clock this morning the city of Pittston, nine miles from here, was thrown into the wildest excitement by the news of a disaster at the mine, which had become more extensive, and that the search party had been secured of the unfortunate men. With no delay, however, they again went down to the foot of the shaft with other men, and again made heroic efforts to get what information they could, but again baffled and discouraged they repeated their story of defeated effort.

A Third Attempt.  
For a third time, at 7 p.m. to-day, with renewed vigor, and still more men, they went beneath the surface into the pit, and tried by the counter-gangway to reach, by a circuitous route, the unfortunate prisoners. After a journey of nearly a thousand feet, they met obstructions innumerable, the force of the concussion having created disastrous havoc, brittle work, pillars, air conduct, doors, cables and other rock having been piled promiscuously so as to interfere with all efforts that could be made by any human beings. Then, to add to the trouble, a congested condition of gas had occurred so as to endanger any efforts to reach anyone near the imprisoned miners. They again ineffectively tried the same resource to relieve and recover the men.

Working Against Great Odds.  
General Manager John B. Law, who has been ill for several days, made his appearance to give instructions. Special messengers called to the shaft all of the company workmen, all having been alerted that the mine was still caving, thereby making it practically impossible to continue the labor without propping up the way as the rescuers went in, and soon the shaft was under charge of Foreman Eagan of the Phoenix mine, Messrs. Maloney of the Raven shaft and McMillan of the Barnum shaft. Much progress was made in this work, and soon the imminent danger was prevented, and at least 50 men were pushing their way to the foot of No. 2 plane, the scene of the extensive cave-in.

The encouragement of those who feared the explosion had ended the life of everything in the mine, was sent up that the men were running about, the fact of these men being rescued, and the relief of the men and boys below. From them we received the first information of the number of men in the shaft. It is thought that not less than 100 workmen have suffered a most horrible death.

John Riker, a runner boy; Jacob Adam and Frank H. Sheridan, company men, were next brought to the surface, and confirmed Gill's story.

Journeymen to Their Graves.  
It appears that several days ago the officials discovered that the rock between the fifth and sixth veins had commenced "working," and to prevent an accident, all day Saturday and Sunday night the full complement of 400 men and such others as could be pressed into service were at work pilaring and propping the sixth vein, so as to ensure the safety of the workmen who were to go to work on Monday. Saturday night the regular night force was working at a point about 800 feet from the shaft at the foot of No. 2 plane at a point under what is known as the Flats, a little east of the Coxton Railway yards. The force was under the supervision of Superintendent Langan and his assistant, Michael Lynott. Orders were given about midnight that as many men as possible should be sent down to assist in this dangerous work. In accordance with this order, between 12 and 1 o'clock this morning about 30 additional workmen left their homes and journeyed to what now seems their grave.

Death May be Awaiting.  
The new force of men enlisted in the work were placed at a point beyond that of the night hands, and the terrible news brought to the surface by the four men who likely will be the only ones to live to tell the tale of the disaster was that all of these 150 or more men had been caught and either crushed to immediate death or imprisoned to perish a death most horrifying. Upon learning this discouraging news the excitement became more demonstrative.

Mine Bosses Also Imprisoned.  
It was found that all the mine foremen, superintendents and bosses who had gone to supervise the work were with those who were imprisoned. This gave the work at relief no systematic head, but the rescuers, providing themselves with safety lamps, hurried into the mine carriages and were lowered 100 feet or more on the mission of relief. # SIR CHARLES WILL HANG ON

## Government May Meet the House and Put Themselves on Record.

### MANY URGING A FIGHT TO A FINISH

#### Birmingham Will Take the Position on the Rideau Canal.

#### The Party Organizer Back in Ottawa Again—Resumed in Montreal that the Liberal Party Will Push the Fast Atlantic Service Scheme—Tarte Wants to be Minister of Railways—How the Elections Are Viewed in Great Britain According to the U. S. Press Correspondents.

Ottawa, June 28.—(Special)—The question of the date when the Government will resign office seems from present appearances to have been postponed, and instead of Mr. Laurier being as near the Premiership to-day as he doubtless supposed yesterday, he is further away from it. Three or four days ago your correspondent announced that the resignation of the Ministry would follow the completion of certain routine business which it was thought would take until the end of this week. Pressure from all quarters, coupled with the uncertainty respecting the results in certain ridings and the prospective changes by re-counts, point to the importance of the Government not throwing up the sponge until it is absolutely positive that Mr. Laurier has a majority. When questioned on the subject to-night the Premier was not very explicit, but said that the Government would not hold on as long as the Mackenzie Government did when they were defeated. The general elections of 1878, took place on Oct. 17, and the Ministry resigned on Oct. 18, a period of 29 days. A well-informed authority said yesterday it was a mistake to suppose that the constitutional practice required the immediate dissolution of a Ministry if defeated in the general elections. On the contrary, the vast majority of precedents were entirely the other way. Immediate resignation, he said, was a modern invention, and a reference to the text books shows this to be the case.

Members-elect and ex-members are expected to meet in Montreal to-day, to the number previously stated as being in the city may be added Messrs. McLaughlin, from North York, Col. Tyrwhitt, M.P., G. H. Macdonell, Major Carpenter, M.P., Rufus Pope, M.P., and others. It is expected that a fight to a finish policy.

## THEY WILL APPEAL TO ROME

### Leading Quebec Liberals Will Make a Protest to the Pope

#### Against the Manner in Which the Influence of the Hierarchy is Being Used in Canada—Mr. Laurier Said to Be One of the Prime Movers—How a French-Canadian Accounts for the Victory.

Montreal, June 28.—(Special)—The World correspondent learns that the leading Liberals of the province contemplate sending a delegate to Rome with a view to have a decision from the Vatican regarding clerical influence in this country. It is also stated that Hon. Wilfrid Laurier is not a stranger to this movement, which will no doubt create a stir in ecclesiastical circles. Little has been heard from the leader of any other creed or nationality in Quebec Province since Mr. Conroy was sent to Canada by Pope Leo XIII. to propagate the doctrine of the Roman Catholic Church. Only a term implies here in Canada and still be considered a good Catholic. However, Hon. Mr. Laurier's friends declare that the action of Mr. Lafche and other members of the Roman Catholic clergy during the recent electoral campaign renders an appeal to Rome at the present time an absolute necessity.

A French-Canadian gentleman, speaking to the writer yesterday, said: "The Liberal party is in a desperate straits. We have never had a French Premier at Ottawa since the Confederation, and when the situation became ripe for action we took advantage of the opportunity to elect a comparatively high official in Canada. If you had a brother in serious danger, and when the doctor said that you would die unless you were moved to a certain place, would you not do so? You would naturally save your brother, and that is just what we have done. With Mr. Laurier as Premier the Roman Catholic Church has had justice in at least as certain a manner as it has ever had in this country. It is stronger than our religion, and the church is not likely to suffer."

# WHAT IS MR. LAURIER DOING?

## Winning Papers Wrangling Over the Position of Manitoba

### Free Press Says Liberals Are Bound to Remedy the Grievance.

#### But Objects to the Statement of the Tribune, That It Would Serve Manitoba Right if That Province Has Separate Schools Fastened on It—Some Views in the West—High John Starts for Ottawa.

Winning, June 28.—(Special)—The Free Press editorially replies to the statement in the Winnipeg Tribune, that now that Manitoba has returned a majority of Conservatives, it will serve the province right if it has separate schools fastened on it. The Free Press thus concludes: "It would be just as well that our 'anti-coercion' friends should frankly face the situation as it really is. Mr. Laurier is bound, just as Sir Charles Tupper was bound, to remedy the grievance of the minority here. He will do this as he promised, and as he is bound to do. There never was any doubt about it, and Manitoba politicians will save their own credit by admitting this and by ceasing to pretend that the province has become a culprit by the result of the late election, to be punished by the infliction of separate schools."

A despatch from Prince Albert last night states that with the polls so far heard from in Saskatchewan, Mr. Laurier leads by about a hundred. However, even seven more ridings away, are yet to hear from, which may take several days. These polls are certain to give Conservative majorities, and a despatch thus concludes: "Laurier people practically concede Saskatchewan to Mr. McKay on the number of votes cast. This however, is improbable. Mr. Craig, the Independent candidate, lost his deposit, receiving only 200 votes out of a possible 2000."

High John Macdonald left for Ottawa Saturday to straighten up matters in his department before he makes way for his successor. He will return to the city in a week or ten days, and will renew the practice of his profession. He will sit for Winnipeg, where the Parliament, Baroness Macdonald accompanied High John east.

There is still a doubt regarding the election in Selkirk, reports being conflicting and doubtful. Scrutiny is being made at one or two polls, and a judge will likely be called upon to give an independent representative.

Quite a number of Winnipeg people had been invited to give their views on the election there taking place on Tuesday.

Robert Niles, dentist, is dead, and a well-known citizen. It was the body of W. F. Henry, commission merchant, of Winnipeg, was sent east on Saturday for interment at Toronto.

# MURDERED MAN IDENTIFIED

## James Mullin of Fios Township Was Killed for a Few Dollars.

#### He Was Looking for Work on the Railway and is Now Believed That Christian Hanson, a Swede, Will Hang for the Averted Crime—His Trial for Murder on July 14.

Ferry Sound, June 27.—The preliminary investigation before Judge McCurry into the circumstances of the murder at Segun Falls on June 11, was concluded here to-day, and the prisoner, Christian Hanson, a Swede, was committed for trial. The murdered man was proved to be James Mullin, from the Township of Fios. He was on his way to the railway, looking for employment, and was evidently perfectly with the few dollars that he had about him. He left a family of eight at home, the youngest an infant 4 months old. County Crown Attorney Johnson appeared for the Crown. The trial will take place here July 14, at the High Court, before Mr. Justice Ferguson.
