RUSSIANS HATE THE BRITISH

The Czar's Minions Control the Chinese Foreign Office in the Matter of Concessions.

BRITISH CONTRACTOR GOT A JOB

Out When the Time for Staying Papers Came the Russian Influence Stopped It.

Montreal, Nov. 17.—(Special.)—Mr. Robert A. Ross, consulting engineer, reached home today from Japan and British India, where he had been looking after concessions for an English syndicate. He says the Russian influence at Peking has been all-powerful, but regarding the Japanese alliance he believes it requires Asiatic people to handle others of the same race. The Russians, he states, simply run the "Tsung-Li Yamen, or Foreign Office, and he gave an instance of this. A certain concession had been granted. The concessionaire being a Britisher, and the papers being all ready to be signed, a member of the Tsung-Li Yamen said: "You are a British subject. Now if you sign a Frenchman, a German or an American to get it. It will be all right, but if Russia learns that you are British, sufficient pressure will be brought to bear upon us to prevent the matter being closed."

GREAT DAMAGE TO SHIPPING.

The Storms on Newfoundland Coast the Past Week Caused Great Havoc.

St. John's, Nfld., Nov. 17.—The storms of the last six days have caused extensive damage to shipping in this region. The schooner Bonaire, at anchor at Burin, Plover Bay, and will prove a total loss, with her cargo of fish. The schooner, with four men on board, was driven ashore and her cargo, consisting of 40 fishermen, has been missing for two weeks. Before the policeman could get to the sidewalk, O'Grady sent a second bullet after Small, and it went crashing through the plate glass window at the side of the hotel door.

Knocked O'Grady Down.—At the risk of his own life the policeman closed in on O'Grady. In a wrestle to seize the revolver the excited knooked O'Grady down. While the two men were struggling on the sidewalk the revolver was seen flying through the air. It fell into the hands of a man in a safe position on the sidewalk until he wrenched the weapon from O'Grady's hand.

BRAKEMAN CUT TO PIECES.

William Couturier Was Thrown Under the Wheels on the Intercolonial Near Leeds.

Quebec, Nov. 17.—A shocking accident happened last evening about 9 o'clock near St. Henry, in the town of Leeds, on the Intercolonial Railway. William Couturier, employed as brakeman, was standing on top of a freight car, when, either in consequence of a sudden jolt, made by the engine or a misjudged step, he fell between two cars. The train passed over his body, literally cutting him to pieces. A widow and two children are left to mourn his loss. He was 25 years of age.

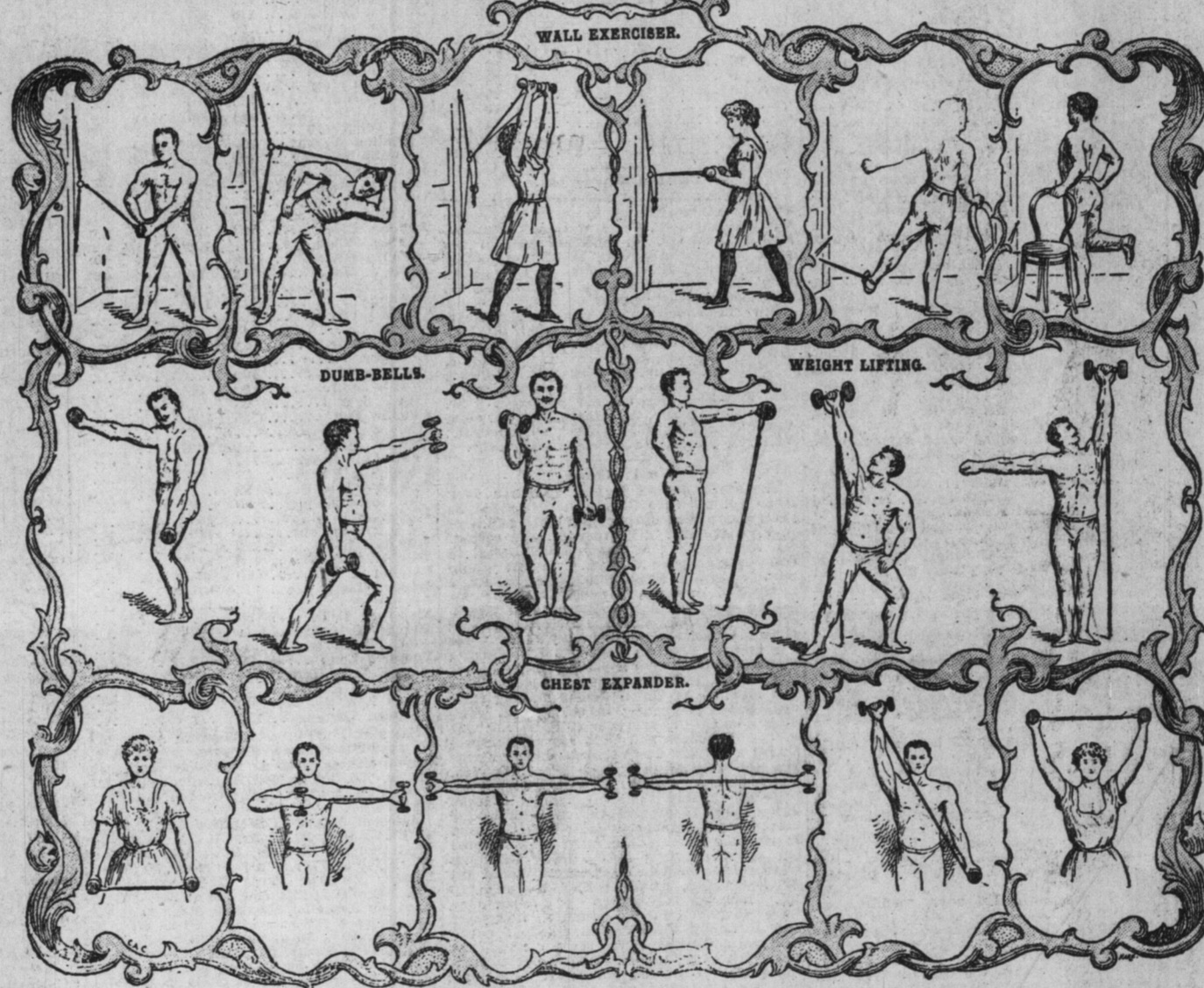
