Germany's Naval Policy

Germany is being credited with a new naval policy, in the form of a long distance blockade of Great Britain by means of submarines, upon which it may be assumed, the Kaiser expects President Wilson to look on complacently, and perhaps rather in as many survivors as can be rescued.

Lord Boreford has been giving his views about what Germany might have done at the outset had she scattered her cruisers over the oceans, and destroyed commerce everywhere on our world-wide trade routes.

Meanwhile the Germans are doing their best to blockade Norway and the destruction of that country's shipping tonnage already amounts to one-seventh. If this policy is continued it is scarcely possible that Norway can avoid war.

East and West in the War

Unfavorable weather on the western front has prevented more active work on the part of the French and British for a week past.

On the eastern front all goes very well. Rumania maintains her position in a satisfactory manner.

Rumanians. In the Dobruja sector the campaign is still a problem. Mackensen, the German leader there, does not seem to wish to be tempted towards the interior, and some are speculating upon Odessa as his object.

Among many arguments directed against hereditary legislators and the principle of primogeniture, which by law and custom alike, is so strongly entrenched in the social life of England, has been the somewhat sweeping and over-confident assertion that first-born children are apt to be in some respects inferior to the other children of the same family.

The prospect for a long life in the case of a first born, however, seems to depend upon his having a number of brothers and sisters, for few examples are recorded of an only child living to an advanced age.

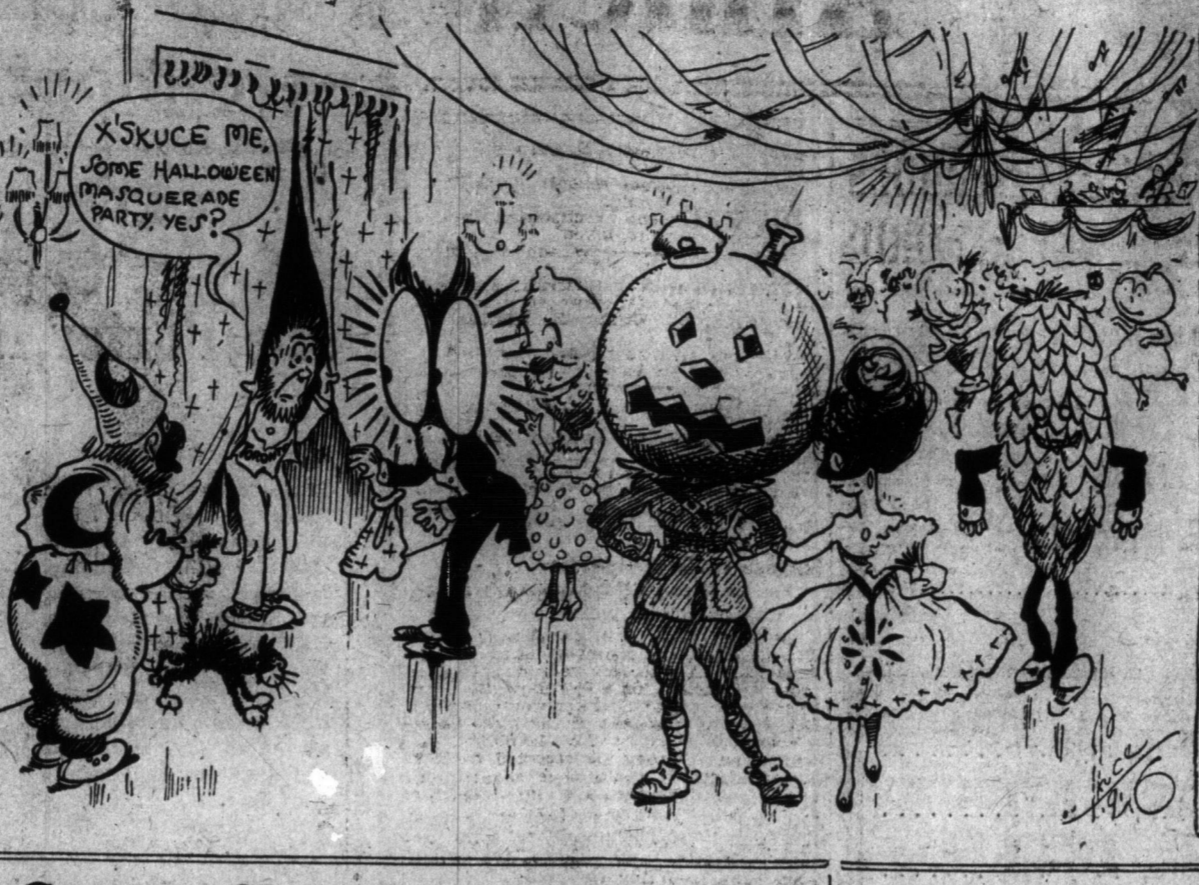

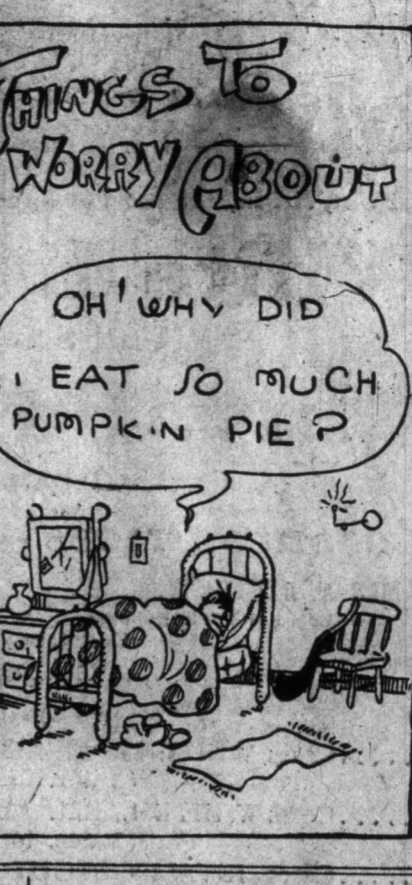

ELECTION MAKES MARKET ERRATIC

Trading at New York Keeps Standard Shares Under Restraint.

METAL ISSUES ACTIVE

American Zinc Stocks Rise Six Points—Paper Also Advances.

New York, Oct. 30.—The conflicting and erratic course of today's trading suggested adjustment of speculative contracts, preliminary to the approaching election. The susceptibility of the market to international conditions was also evidenced by a decline in the forenoon on the occurrence of another episode involving the U-boat controversy.

Standard shares were under more or less restraint, rails yielding at from 1 to 2 points at most levels, while some of the minor members of that group manifested a revival of last week's strength and activity, Rock Island advancing 3-5 to 36, the best figure of the year.

U. S. Steel also reflected the diverse opinions current regarding the quarterly statement to be issued tomorrow. For some inexplicable reason forecasts dealing with this event were more conservative than the estimates and views of the previous week.

Metal issues made up a goodly part of the day's large and diversified business. China-Copper being most conspicuous in its particular class by reason of its ascent to the new record of 63 1-2.

Another disturbance in Wall street on submarine scares affected the Toronto market somewhat yesterday. The latter trading and brought some selling which would otherwise not have been in the market.
