A MARYLAND FARMER.—The Easton (Mary-land) Star says that Colonel Edward Lloyd, of that county, with his own screants—numbering near four hundred, some nine or ten farms, about 6,000 acres of land, including timber-land—raises annu-ally between 30,000 and 40,000 bushels of wheat, and a much larger quantity of corn, besides vari-ous other valuable products. Everything through-out his extensive operations is conducted in the most systematic manner, and the greatest care is taken to keep everything in the most perfect order —each farm being under the charge of an intelli-gent officer. Besides these extensive operations in Talbot, he has a plantation carried on in the State of Mississippi, worth several hundred thou-sand dollars, and his annual income from his estate here and lis plantation in the south, cannot fall short of \$150,000—six times as much as the in-come of the President of the United States. His residence is one of the most splendid in this coun-try, being the homestend of the Lloyd family sinco-their first settlement in Maryland.—Baltimore Sun.
