



## **British Drive Off** Attacking Huns

Germans Again Use Poisonous Gases-Threat of Invasion of Switzerland if Italy Goes to War—Enemy Submarines Are Active

London, May 3—A British official statement dated May 3 says:
"At 7 p. m., May 1, the Germans attacked Hill No. 60, southeast of Ypres, and last evening they attacked in the neighborhood of St. Julien. These attacks were both repulsed. We lost no ground, and we inflicted heavy casualties on the enemy in spite of the fact that he again used poisonous gases emitted both from tubes in the trenches and from especially manufactured shells.

"A German aeroplane yesterday afternoon was chased by one of our machines to within rifle range of our trenches, and then brought down by our fire."

mon sound at night and the people have become accustomed to the noise.

"On April 3, at 9 p. m., two loud reports were heard which shook the windows of the houses near the shore due to the firing of the ten-inch guns at Granton, which lies between Leith and Queensferry. The next day it was made known that two German submarines had been destroyed, two only of the crews having been saved. They swam ashore and were pulled from the water exhausted at Granton. The local newspapers were officially informed of what had taken place, but forbidden to publish anything about what had happened.

This is the third letter received by the paper from a correspondent in Leitin connection with destruction of submarines. The first, published about month ago, stated that a submarine had been caught in a steel net at the Fort Bridge, and the second that a submarine had been sunk off Burnt Island. The correspondent has access to official in formation which cannot be questioned. The first two stories were later unofficially confirmed in a despatch from Toronto in which an arrival from Scot land related practically the same facts.




