' 662 10 0 Leaving a balance of ..... £379 15 1 This balance, together with the Pew Rents, will, with economy, probably be sufficient to meet all demands till the New Cathedral is ready for occupation. The lot formerly purchased for building a Parsonage off Sherbrooke Street, being, under existing circumstances, less eligible for that purpose than when it was originally acquired, has been sold at an advance over its original cost of $\pounds 325$ . This sum it is proposed to apply towards the purchase of a lot within the block on which the New Cathedral now stands, with the ultimate view of building a Rectory thereon. JOHN DYDE, W.
