NOTES AND NEWS.

UNITED STATES.

A very remarkable revival of religious
feeling is taking place in Foxboro, Mass., no fewer
than eighty converts having joined one
church.

The Iowa Legislature has passed a bill
prescribing maximum rates for railroad
freight and fare. The Senate has yet to
concur in an amendment of details.

An Arkansas man is travelling around
