

Synod of Hamilton and London

OF THE

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA.

At Woodstock, and within Knox Church there, the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety five, at half past seven o'clock p. m., which day and place, the Synod of Hamilton and London, of the Presbyterian Church in Canada met, and after sermon by the Revd. J. R. Battisby, Ph. D., of Chatham, the retiring Moderator, from Judges, first chapter and third verse, was duly constituted by prayer.

The Clerk then called the roll of all the ministers and elders within the bounds, members of Synod, as attested by the Presbytery of Clerks.

Dr. Cochrane presented the report of the Commission appointed to visit Wingham with a view to adjusting certain difficulties that had arisen between Mr. McQuarrie and Mr. Gordon. It was to the effect that a judgement had been arrived at satisfactory to all parties. The report was received and the thanks of the Synod tendered the Commission.

THE BUXTON FUND.

Dr. Battisby, convenor of the committee on the Buxton Fund, presented the following report:—

To the Synod of Hamilton and London ;

Your committee by leave to report as follows:

- 1. That since the last meeting of Synod, the late Rev. Wm. King received, up to the date of his death, the sum of \$165.19.
- 2. That since his death, the sum of \$55 has been deposited to the credit of your committee in Chatham.
- 3. Your committee would also ask that, as their work as a committee is finished, the annuitant being dead, Synod would now receive the books and all papers connected with the investments. in order that Synod may carry out its own decision. in handing over said investments to the aged and infirm minister's fund. Your committee would also ask to be discharged.

BRANTFORD LADIES' COLLEGE.

Dr. Cochrane presented the annual report of the Brantford Young Ladies' College, giving details as to the work of the institution, the pupils in attendance, and the constant efforts put forth by the Directors to increase its efficiency.

On motion by Dr. Fletcher, seconded by Dr. Fraser, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

That the report of the Ladies' College be received and adopted.

Further, the Synod expresses its gratification at the high standard of efficiency maintained in all the departments of the college, and at the large attendance of students.

The Synod especially congratulates the Board of Directors on the superior attainments, ability and success of the present teaching staff, and also notes, with its highest approval, the careful attention given to religious instruction.

The Synod confidently commends the college to the cordial sympathy and generous support of the church at large, as an institution unsurpassed for its religious influence, pleasant surroundings, home-like comfort and thorough culture.

COMMITTEE TO NOMINATE STANDING COMMITTEES.

The Moderator nominated the following to compose the committee to nominate standing committees:—Ministers, Dr. Fraser, convenor; Messrs McTavish, Talling, Aylward, Manson, Panton, Martin, McRae and Johnston; Elders, Messrs. Hunter, Sutherland. Wilson, Nichol and Stewart.

MR. MUNRO'S MEMORIAL.

The memorial of Mr. Munro, submitted at last Synod, and which was then laid upon the table, was next considered.

After discussion, the following motion of Mr. Alexander Henderson, duly seconded, was carried by a majority, namely,—

That the memorial of Mr. Munro laid on the table at last meeting of Synod be taken up.

Mr. Munro was then heard until the time of adjournment at noon.

The Synod then adjourned to meet again at 2 p. $m_{\tilde{\nu}}$, the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

THIRD SEDERUNT.

At Woodstock, and within Knox Church, the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety five, at 2 p. m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted by the Moderator, Dr. W. A. McKay, at his request, leading in prayer.

The minutes of the former Sederunt were read and sustained.

REVS. J. FRASER CAMPBELL AND DR. ROBERTSON.

Mr. Fraser Campbell, missionary in India. was heard in reference to the pressing necessities of that great land for additional missionaries, and Dr. James Robertson followed urging the claims of the North West and British Columbia.

On motion of Dr. Fletcher, duly seconded a hearty vote of thanks was tendered to Rev. J. Fraser Campbell and Dr. Robertson for their earnest addresses.

, SECOND REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON BILLS AND OVERTURES.

The committee on Bills and Overtures presented a second report as to the order of business for the afternoon, as follows:

- 1. Appoint Synodical Committee on Augmentation, as instructed by General Assembly.
 - 2. Mr. Hamilton's motion anent Manitoba school question.
- Communication from Diocese of Niagara anent religious teaching in public schools.
- 4. Overture from Presbytery of Paris regarding graduates supplying mission fields.

Mr. Alex. Henderson moved that the Munro case should be taken up before entering upon the consideration of these matters, which was carried.

The Synod then proceeded to consider the Munro case according to this decision.

It was then moved by Mr. George Cuthbertson, and seconded by Mr. A. F. Tully, as follows: That the Synod, having heard Mr. Munro at length with reference to his memorial and complaint against the Presbytery of London, find no cause for further proceeding in the matter, and therefore resolve to dismiss the petition. The motion was carried unanimously.

On the judgement of the court being announced to Mr. Munro by the Moderator, he protested and appealed to the next General Assembly for reasons to be given.

Messrs. A. Henderson and A. F. Tully were appointed to defend the judgement of the Synod at the bar of the Assembly.

AUGMENTATION.

The Synod then proceeded to consider the instructions of the last General Assembly in reference to augmentation, as follows:

That Synods in the Western section of the Church be instructed to appoint Synodical Augmentation Committees, who shall review the grants asked by the Presbyteries of the bounds, and shall take measures to stimulate interest in the augmentation scheme among the congregations of the Synod.

Dr. Laing moved, seconded by Mr. Cockburn, that the Synod proceed to appoint a Synodical Committee, in terms of Assembly's instructions. After further consideration, the following resolutions were submitted: Moved by Mr. A: F. Tully, seconded by Dr. Hamilton; "that each Presbytery shall appoint one of its members as a member of the Synodical Committee on Augmentation, and report to the Synod at the Sederunt to-morrow morning."

Moved in amendment by Mr Straith, seconded by Dr. Fletcher, that Presbyteries be instructed to appoint a minister and layman from each Presbytery, on the Synods Augmentation Committee, and report to-morrow morning; and that for the future Presbyteries be instructed to nominate a minister and layman yearly to act on this committee.

On the vote being taken, the motion was carried by a majority, and Presbyteries instructed in accordance therewith.

THE MANITOBA SCHOOL QUESTION.

Dr. Hamilton moved as follows: "This Synod views, with deep concern, the present opposition between the resolution of the Dominion Government and the Legislature of Manitoba regarding the educational act of 1890, and hereby expresses its sympathy with the position taken by the representatives in the Manitoba Legislature, against any interference by the Central Government with the educational matters of the Province." The motion was seconded by Mr. Turnbull. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Cockburn, seconded by Mr. W. J. Day, "that the resolution now before the Synod be remitted to a committee consisting of the mover and seconder (Dr. Hamilton and Mr. Turnbull) and Drs. Laing, McMullen, McKay and Lyle, ministers, and Messrs. George Rutherford and D. H. Hunter, elders, to bring in a deliverance at a future Sederunt. Dr. Hamilton withdrew his motion in favor of Mr. Cockburn's, which was unanimously agreed to.

DIOCESE OF NIAGARA-RELIGION IN SCHOOLS.

A communication from the Diocese of Niagara asking the co-operation of the Synod to obtain certain religious teaching in the public schools, was read and considered. On motion the communication was handed to the committee on the Manitoba School Question, with instructions to report what action they deemed proper, at a future Sederunt.

OVERTURE ANENT SUPPLY OF MISSION FIELDS BY GRADUATES AND OTHERS.

An overture from the Presbytery of Paris, was read, (for transmission to the General Assembly), in reference to the supply of mission fields by graduates and ministers from other churches.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the synod adjourned to meet again at 7.80 p. m., the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

FOURTH SEDERUNT.

Knox Church, Woodstock, the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety five, at 7.30 p. m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted by the Moderator, the Rev. Mr. Henderson, of Attwood, engaging in prayer.

The minutes of last Sederunt were read and sustained.

REPORT ON THE STATE OF RELIGION.

The report on the state of religion was presented by Dr. McIntyre, of Beamsville, in the absence of Mr. W. G. Jordon. On motion of Dr. McIntyre, seconded by Mr. G. C. Patterson, the report was received, and it was agree to take up the recommendations scriatim. The following were unanimously adopted, and the report as a whole thereafter adopted, and the thanks of the assembly tendered the convener and the committee for their diligence.

- 1. That Presbyteries be advised in their conferences on the state of religion, to consider the best means of keeping the subject of family religion before the people of our church.
- 2. That pastors and sessions be strongly urged to press upon their people the need and importance of regular family worship.

REPORT ON SABBATH SCHOOLS.

- Mr. W. M. McKibbin presented the report on Sabbath Schools. On motion the report was received, and the recommendations taken up seriatim. Thereafter, on motion by Mr. Tully, the report was adopted, with the recommendations as a whole as follows:
- That the attention of pastors and Sabbath School officers be called to the need of greater diligence and care in reporting their schools to their respective Presbyterial Committees.
- 2. That Sabbath School teachers be counselled to meet as regularly as possible for joint study of the lessons.
- That Sabbath School teachers and parents be advised to be, if possible, yet more mindful of the practical training of the young in the duty of giving for the furtherance of the Lord's cause.

Thanks were tendered to Mr. McKibbin for the preparation of the report.

SYSTEMATIC BENEFICENCE.

Mr. E. H. Sawyers presented the report on Systematic Beneficence. On motion by Mr. Sawyers, seconded by Mr. W. S. McTavish, the report was received. The following recommendations were afterwards adopted.

- 1. That ministers be urged to preach on and explain the nature, duty and privelege of systematic and proportionate giving.
- 2. That when Presbyterial conferences are held, due prominence be given to this important subject.
- 3. That the committee have permission, on their own financial responsibility, should they see the way clear, to supply congregations desiring them, with tract No. 2, by Thomas Kane, of Chicago, on systematic beneficence.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned to meet again to-morrow morning at 9.30 a.m., and the Moderator pronounced the benediction.

FIFTH SEDERUNT.

Knox Church, Woodstock, the seventeenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety five.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment and 9.30 a. m., and was duly constituted by the Moderator.

The minutes of last Sederunt were read and sustained.

PRESBYTERY RECORDS.

The committees appointed to examine the records of the Presbyteries of Hamilton, Paris, London, Sarnia, Chatham, Huron, Maitland, Bruce and Stratford, reported that they had examined these records and found them corefully and correctly kept. The Moderator was instructed to attest them in the usual form.

REPORT OF AUDITORS.

The committee appointed to examine the Treasurer's books and accounts reported that the same were most carefully and correctly kept. On motion the report was received, and the thanks of the Synod tendered Mr. Rutherford, the treasurer, for his services.

APPLICATIONS TO TAKE STUDENTS ON TRIAL FOR LICENSE.

Dr. Hamilton. on behalf of the committee on applications for license, reported recommending that leave be given to the Presbytery of Hamilton to license Mr. N. C. McLennan. to the Presbytery of Paris to license Mr. W. J. West, and to the Presbytery of Huron to license Mr. W. J. Hall and Mr. Wm. Graham.

The Synod adopted the recommendations.

TIME AND PLACE OF NEXT MEETING OF SYNOD.

It was agreed to hold next meeting of Synod at Chatham, and within St. Andrew's Church, there, on the third Monday of April, 1896.

SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

Dr. Lyle presented the report on Sabbath Observance, which, on motion, was received.

The following recommendations of the committee were adopted:

- 1. The Synod would urge the ministers under its care to preach on the Sabbath question at least once, during the coming year.
- 2. That the heads of families be enjoined to see that the young are taught to keep the Sabbath as God commands it to be kept.

On motion of Mr. W. J. Clark, seconded by Dr. Laing, the following resolution was passed.

That this Synod expresses its gratification at the organization of the Lord's Day Alliance of this province, heartily approves of its chief object, viz: To safeguard the rights of the Lord's Day to the whole community, rejoices at its success in ensuring the insertion of a clause in the Electric Railway Act forbidding traffic on the Radial Railways on the Lord's Day, and commends it to the earnest support of the members of Synod and the congregations which it represents.

On motion of Dr. Cochrane duly seconded, the report was then adopted as a whole, and Dr. Lyle thanked for its preparation. He was also asked to have it published in the church papers.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE MANITOBA SCHOOL QUESTION.

Dr. Hamilton, convener of the committee on the Manitoba School question, submitted the following resolution on the subject.

Your committee having considered the matter submitted to them, report as follows:

The religious element in education we deem to be of vital importance and we hold strongly that a non-christian and purely secular system is un, safe for the state, and cannot produce or foster good citizenship.

The truths and moral duties of Christianity held in common by all, are amply sufficient to supply what we desiderate in a public system of education, and the teaching of the distinctive tenets of any one branch of the christian church should not be undertaken by the state.

On these grounds we are opposed to the granting of public monies for the support of denominational schools.

The system of education established in Manitoba being, according to our understanding of it, christian but not sectarian or denominational, and admirably adapted to her mixed and sparse population, has the approval of the Synod.

Therefore we deprecate any outside interference with a view of forcing on Manitoba a system of separate schools. After considerable discussion, on motion of Dr. Hamilton seconded by Mr. J. L. Turnbull, the report was adopted.

TEMPERANCE

COMMUNICATION FROM THE NIAGARA DIOCESE.

The committee, to whom was referred the communication of the Niagara Diocese, reported a resolution, which (after ammendments) was, on motion of Dr. Hamilton, duly seconded, adopted, and is as follows:—

The Synod respectfully acknowledges receipt of the communication from the chairman of the Committee on Education of the Diocese of Niagara, and thanks the committee for their courtesy in informing this Synod of their purpose in regard to religious education in the public Schools of Ontario. The Synod recalls the satisfactory results of the former united action of the churches in the matter, and would hall with pleasure any opportunity of further improvement in this direction.

At the same time the Synod believes that it would not be justified in taking any step calculated to interfere with the non-denominational system now established by the introduction of doctrinal teaching, to which many of our fellow citizens would be conscientiously opposed, and therefore respectfully declines to co-operate with the Synod. as requested, in anything looking in the direction of the establishment of Parochial schools.

DOMINION ALLIANCE.

A communication from Mr. S. F. Spence, of the Dominion Alliance, requesting the Synod to appoint four persons to act as members of the Council of the Dominion Alliance, was read and the following appointed in terms of the request: Dr. McKay, Mr. E. R. Hutt, Mr. W. J. Clark and Mr. John Cameron.

THE LATE REV. WM. KING.

Dr. McMullen, from the committee appointed to prepare a minute in reference to the late Rev. Wm. King, of Buxton, reported the following, which, on motion, was adopted:


In being called upon to take steps towards the winding up of the Buxton Fund, the Synod would be failing in its duty, did it not bear testimony to the noble spirit and philanthrophic labours of our departed brother, the Rev. Wm. King, the founder of the said fund, and of the Buxton Mission.

His sacrifices and efforts on behalf of the colored people are a matter of history, and we merely refer to them in paying a tribute to his name and memory.
