The above sign, in smiling golden letters, strikes the eye of the visitor to the Island by the way of the ex-emption carman of the world, Mr. McConkey, so well and favorably known in Toronto as a public caterer, has leased the above hotel for a number of years.

Ald. Pepler also resented the insinuation. He wanted Ald. Steiner to understand he never failed in doing his duty. The chairman likewise rebuked the representative of St. James' Ward.

The chairman was appointed a sub-committee to consider a scheme to obtain guarantees from civic officials, another sub-committee was named to draft an advertisement for a Commissioner of Works and Health, or as the chairman called him, the Lord High Commissioner. The ad. will be widely published.

Patrons for the annexation of East Rosedale, and the section lying between the western limit of St. Paul's Ward and Spadina road, north of Bloor, known as the Annex, were considered. The committee will ask the Council for permission to summon by advertisement all parties interested, whether for or against, before the committee.

The Committee struck out the Engineer's report recommending the extension of Sheridan street to Dundas street, as a local improvement and on the initiative principle, the estimated cost being \$102,000. A similar recommendation respecting Allen avenue met with a similar fate. Mr. Sprague's recommendation for the widening of Oxford avenue was sent back for information.

On the two top floors, where the parlors, sitting rooms and sleeping apartments are located, everything is as neat and smiling as a May-day bridegroom. There are a number of cheerful and comfortable sleeping rooms, all double, and are provided with spiral mattresses. The counterpane is an exquisitely new. These floors will be for the exclusive use of guests.

During the reporter's trip from the cellar to the roof he came across little or nothing that was not new or of the latest design and convenient. The hotel has been completely renovated and arranged all the appointments of a metropolitan hostelry.

Outside the house improvements can be seen on every hand. Additional electric lights have been put up. New roller coasters and switch-backs are being erected. The Hotel Hanlan is a covered steam car, the counterpart of the famous organ in the Atlantic Garden in New York. About a hundred new benches have been added to the main promenade. A commodious new bifurcated walk has been erected immediately opposite the hotel, the width is double the size of the other sidewalks in existence.

One of the most desirable additions to the outside conveniences is a covered pavilion at the north end of the hotel. Here picnic parties can escape the scorching rays of the sun. In the pavilion is a billiard room, where tea, coffee, milk and lemonade can be obtained by the picnicker. Mr. McConkey intends to have in operation, in close proximity to the hotel a full blown candy factory.

The Hotel Hanlan will be formally opened on the Queen's Birthday, May 24 (Monday next).
