THE PAGANTRY OF DEATH.

SIR JOHN MACDONALD'S FUNERAL AT OTTAWA YESTERDAY.

Amid a Rain of Tears from Heaven the Corps is borne from the Senate Chamber to St. Alban's Church and thence to the C.P.R. Station En Route to Kingston.

OTTAWA, June 10.—The mortal remains of the late Sir John A. Macdonald were borne another step to their final resting place today. The body lay in state in the Senate Chamber all night. Thousands from all parts of Canada viewed these well-known features for the last time. Ottawa itself was in mourning. Business was practically suspended. Streets, dwellings and public buildings in all parts of the city were draped in mourning. At noon, the casket was closed and preparation for the funeral procession was made. Col. Sir Gaston Desjardins, A.D.C., to the Queen, laid upon the coffin a magnificent wreath at the request of Her Majesty. Shortly after noon the funeral procession was formed. It proceeded from the eastern gate of the grounds by way of Elgin, Maria, Theodora, King and Dalrymple streets to St. Alban's Church, where the funeral service of the Church of England was performed. The procession took place in a hall an hour to a given point. An immense crowd gathered to see the cortege. The route was packed and buildings and offices were crowded. Returning, the procession proceeded along Daly, Cumberland, Elgin, Wellington and Queen-street west to the C.P.R. depot.

For the greater part of the day it had been oppressively hot, but about three o'clock a change came. The sky became rainy and immense black clouds rolled up. Just as the head of the procession passed the main entrance to the Parliament buildings the rain began to fall. The spectators gathered in all directions. Those who remained in the procession were drenched. The cortege started in this order:
