The United States exports for these 10 years, as exhibited by the Canadian returns of imports, shows that the balance of trade for these years was really \$75,514,521 in favor of the United States, thus establishing a deficiency in the United States returns of exports to Canada of \$75,514,521.

Character of the Commerce. The value of the export trade from either country to the other is not determined by the considerations as to whether these exports can be marketed in the importing country to better advantage or at better prices than in any other foreign market.

New Products. The value of the products of the farm and field, the forest, the mine and the quarry, the United States during the two years ending June 30, 1891, was \$27,000,000. It may be assumed that the sum covers the value of imports from the United States to foreign countries.

Balance of trade in favor of Canada in raw products. \$3,749,741. The value of manufactured goods imported into the United States from Canada during the two years ending June 30, 1891, was \$4,858,217.

Balance of trade in favor of the United States in manufactured goods. \$4,994,905. The value of the like raw products of the United States during the two years ending June 30, 1891, was \$6,302,505.

Manufactured Goods. It is in this class of goods that the United States obtains great advantage from the duties of Canada. The exports of manufactured merchandise to Canada from about one-seventh part of the entire exports of this class of goods from the United States to all foreign countries.

Relative Liberty of the Two Customs Tariffs. The quarterly report No. 1, 1891-92, of the Bureau of Statistics at Washington, shows the proportions of the imports into

the United States from Canada which were admitted free of duty.

The total imports into Canada from the United States for the two years ending June 30, 1891, were \$10,877,450, of which there was admitted free of duty \$4,858,217, or 44.7 per cent.
