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A SKETCH OF THE GROWTH

AND PRESENT IMPORTANCE

Of the Legal Profession,

IN UPPER CANADA.

It is said that the Laws of a country are a history of its people. It may with equal truth be affirmed, that the Laws of Upper Canada are a history of the Legal Profession. The written laws of a Country are interesting and instructive, as well to the general reader as to the scholar. Referring to the early Statute Laws of this Province, we have on almost every page the evidence of a people few in number and far apart, struggling in a wilderness, to make for themselves a happy and a prosperous home.

With few wants, and no luxuries, their laws were simple and very easily numbered. We have also, among the same reliable records, traces of manners, customs, and institutions long since passed, and well nigh forgotten. Though interesting, these and kindred subjects to the general reader, it is presumed that to the professional reader a history of his own Profession in Upper Canada, now so numerous and influential, will not be less inviting.

The increased population in Canada, including the Upper and Lower Sections of the Province, has been of late years the admiration of the Old World, and the theme of journalists wherever the English language is spoken; added to this, there has been a steady

increase of material wealth, and the prosperity and happiness which, among a free and intelligent people, are the results of wealth. To be told that with the increase of population and of wealth the profession of the law has also increased, will not at all surprise the student of history. The struggles of the profession have been in this country the struggles of the people in miniature; so the increase and prosperity of the one has reflected the same desirable qualities in the other: the one law of nature governs both, and is supported by well-understood rules of political economy.

The learned professions are as much a necessity to a civilized people as the more stern and less polished occupations of tradesmen and mechanics. The profession of the law, though generally more carpented at, than either that of divinity or of medicine, is in its sphere as useful as either to the well-being of modern society. It has always been found, that when a people become numerous, all having wants of various kinds to be supplied, it is the interest of the whole community, and of each member of it, to have a division of labour. If any man in the social state were to be his own lawyer, his own doctor, and his own clothier, it does not require much discrimination to see that his estate, his life, and his comfort, would be all less effectually served than if he were himself to apply his attention to some one calling, and, when necessary, summon the assistance of others, more skilful than himself in other callings.

It is a wise rule that all men must obey the law; and it is a maxim, that ignorance of the law shall excuse no one who infringes its commands. Thus all men are bound to know the law and obey it, though some men only do really understand it. Paradoxical as this may appear to the theorist, it is still not the less both right and wise in practice. Those who view society, as organized in modern times, and see in it numberless conflicting interests, warring with each other, and yet all claiming its protection, must acknowledge the necessity of a vast accumulation of law, and of trained intelligence to interpret and apply it. The theorist who, thinking that the principles of justice being few, are easily understood, and can be easily administered, finds himself opposed to the experience of

ages. The number of adjudicated points in the Law of England is estimated at one million and a half, and are contained, as may be supposed, in libraries of no trifling dimensions. To study these points, and the laws out of which they arise, and upon which they depend, must be the vocation of a distinct Profession. To make the Profession equal to the knowledge and ability required of it, there must be peculiar learning, the offspring of previous preparation.

The Profession in the Mother Country is deservedly celebrated for its independance and learning. This, in a great measure, is attributable to the thorough system of preparation through which the Law Student is obliged to pass. In this Colony there has been not only an endeavour to imitate the excellence of the Profession at home, but to do so by adopting the means there made essential to ensure it.

We now proceed to examine these means, and, in doing so, to narrate the history of the Legal Profession in Upper Canada.

Shortly after the surrender of Quebec to the British, in 1759, and with it a large tract of habitable, and in parts inhabited country, the good government of the country surrendered became an object of Imperial solicitude. By the Proclamation of 1763, it was divided into four Governments, viz., Quebec, East Florida, West Florida, and Grenada. Governors were appointed to each, with power to summon Councils or Representatives of the people, to whom conjointly was committed authority to ordain laws for the public peace, welfare, and good government of the Colonies, as nearly as might be agreeable to the laws of England. To the Government of Quebec belonged the greater portion of what now constitutes Upper Canada. In 1774, an Act was passed by the Imperial Legislature, entitled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec, in North America." (14th George III., cap. 83.) By the 12th Section of this Act, the Governor was authorized to summon a Council, and with such Council had power to make Ordinances for the peace, welfare, and good government of the Province. Under this authority, in 1785, an Ordinance was passed, "concerning Advocates, Attorneys, Solicitors, and Notaries, and for the more easy collection of His Majesty's

Revenue." (25th George III. cap. 4.) It provided, that no person should be appointed or permitted to practice in any of the Courts of Civil Jurisdiction in the Province as a Barrister, Advocate, Solicitor, Attorney, or Proctor of Law who should not have *bona fide* served a regular and continued Clerkship for five years, under a contract in writing, for that purpose entered into with some Advocate or Attorney duly admitted, and practising in the Courts of the Province, or in some other part of His Majesty's dominions (sec. 1), nor until after such person should have been examined by some of the first and most able Barristers, Advocates, and Attorneys of the Courts of Judicature of the Province, in the presence of the Chief Justice, or two or more Judges of some of the Courts of Common Pleas, of which there was one for each District, and approved and certified to be of fit capacity and character to be admitted to practise Law in the Courts of the Province. (*ib.*) It is doubtful whether any persons availed themselves of this Ordinance, so as to practice in the Western portion of the Province, now Upper Canada. At that time, excepting at two or three points, the whole country West of Montreal was uninhabited by the whites. Afterwards, in 1791, the Province of Quebec was divided into Upper and Lower Canada, each of which was made a distinct Province. (31st Geo. III. cap. 31.) And in each Province, the Governor, with the advice of a Legislative Council and Assembly, was empowered "to make laws for the peace, welfare, and good government thereof." During the third Session of the second Parliament, held under the new Constitution of Upper Canada, there being a population of about 40,000, and a scarcity of Lawyers, an Act was passed suspending the operation of the Quebec Ordinance, "as regards the regulations concerning Advocates, Attornies, Solicitors, and Notaries," and enabling the Governor of Upper Canada to authorize by License under his hand and seal, such and so many of His Majesty's liege subjects, not exceeding sixteen in number, as he shall deem, from their probity, education, and condition in life, best qualified to act as Advocates and Attornies, in the conduct of all legal proceedings in the Province." (34th Geo. III. cap. 4.)

Upon the production of such Licenses to the proper officer, the names of the persons licensed were to be inscribed on a Roll for the

purpose to be provided, and kept among the Records of the Court of King's Bench, the only Superior Court of Common Law then in the Province.

It will be observed that no distinction, other than the name, was, either by the Ordinance of Quebec or this Statute, made between Barristers and Attorneys, and that, neither directly or inferentially, was it made improper for the one person to follow both branches of the Profession. Seven gentlemen, by virtue of the Act, at once received licenses to practise Law in Upper Canada; but still further measures were found to be necessary for the purpose of securing "to the Province and the Profession a learned and honorable body of men to assist their fellow-subjects, as occasion may require, and to support and maintain the Constitution of the Province." The Ordinance of Quebec, so far as it related to Barristers, Advocates, Attorneys, and Solicitors, was, in 1797, repealed. The Act repealing it allowed the then practitioners to form themselves into a Society, to be called "The Law Society of Upper Canada." (37th Geo. III. cap. 13.) There were at the time fifteen practitioners, who, in Trinity Term following the passing of the Act, formed themselves into the Society authorized. Their names are, John White, the Attorney-General; Robert Isaac DeGrey, the Solicitor-General; Walter Roe, Angus Macdonell, James Clark, Christopher Robinson, Allan McLean, William Dummer Powell, Alexander Stuart, Nicholas Hagerman, Bartholomew Crannell Beardsley, Timothy Thompson, Jacob Farrand, Samuel Sherwood, and John McKay. During the same term, the Society, as empowered by the Act, passed, with the approbation of the Judges, a number of Rules. The place of meeting was the town of Newark, the then capital of Upper Canada, now known as the town of Niagara. The Society being authorized by the Act to appoint the six or more senior members for the time being (whereof the Attorney and Solicitor-General for the time being were to be two) Benchers or Governors, first exercised the power on 9th November, 1799. The fifteen gentlemen whose names have been already mentioned, were on that day appointed Benchers of the Law Society of Upper Canada. This Society became "The Temple" of Canada; for it was enacted,

that no persons other than the then Practitioners, unless such persons should have been previously entered of, and admitted into the Society as a Student of the Law, and should have been standing on the books of the Society for five years, and should have conformed himself to its rules and regulations, and should have been duly called and admitted to the practice of the Law as a Barrister, according to the constitutions and establishment thereof, should be permitted to practise at the Bar of any of the Courts of the Province. (37th Geo. III. cap. 18, sec. 5.) A saving clause was, however, made, in favor of persons having been duly admitted to practise at the Bar of any of the Courts of England, Scotland, or Ireland, or of any of the British Provinces in North America. (*Ib*) One pupil, and no more, was at this time allowed to each Practitioner.

Notwithstanding these provisions, the scarcity of Lawyers still continued. Between the years 1797 and 1803, only four gentlemen were called to the Bar, and nine only were admitted by the Law Society as Students. The consequence was, that, in 1803, an Act was passed, reciting that great inconvenience had arisen, and was experienced in several parts of the Province, from a want of a sufficient number of persons duly authorized to practise Law, and that unless the number could be speedily increased, justice would in many places be with great difficulty administered. (3rd Geo. III. cap. 3.) The Governor thereupon, was authorized, in like manner as before, to appoint "such and so many of His Majesty's liege subjects, not exceeding six in the whole, as he from their probity, education, and condition in life shall deem fit and proper to practise the profession of the Law in this Province." (*Ib*.) Upon the production of every such license to the Clerk of the Crown and Pleas, the name of the person licensed was directed to be inscribed on the Roll of Attorneys of the King's Bench, and each person whose name was so inscribed, after having been admitted a member of the Law Society was authorized to practise the Law as fully as any Barrister or Attorney then practising. The six persons appointed appear to have been William Birdseye Peters, William Dickson, D'Arcy Boulton, John Powell, William Elliott, and

William Warren Baldwin, the father of the Honourable Robert Baldwin, C.B., the present Treasurer of the Law Society. Twenty-two persons in all were thus licensed by the Executive to practice the Profession. Measures, however, were still required to facilitate the education of the youth to the study of the Law. Between the years 1803 and 1807, only six persons were entered in the ordinary course as Students of the Law by the Law Society. In the latter year, the Legislature permitted every Practitioner to take and have four Clerks, and not one only, as before. (47th George III, cap. 5.) For the following seven years, that is to say, from 1807 to 1814, the admission of Students, and call of Barristers, though increasing, did so very slowly, and was scarcely adequate to the demand. The population of the Province, in 1808, had attained the number of 70,000. It is a singular fact, that, in this year, four gentlemen were admitted Students-at-Law, and all afterwards were elevated to seats on the Bench of the Superior Court. In Hilary Term, 1808, John Beverley Robinson, now Sir John Beverley Robinson, Baronet, Chief Justice of Upper Canada, became a Law Student, and, seven years afterwards, was called to the Bar. The late Mr. Justice Jones was, in Easter Term, 1808, admitted a Member of the Law Society, and called to the Bar in Hilary, 1815. The present Mr. Justice McLean was, in Trinity, 1808, admitted a Student, and in Trinity Term, 1815, called to the Bar. In Michaelmas Term, 1808, the late Mr. Justice Hagerman was admitted by the Law Society, and called to the Bar in the same term with Mr. Justice McLean.

In 1811, the war with the United States commenced. It summoned from their usual occupations most of the inhabitants of the Province, and amongst them many Barristers, Students-at-Law, Attorneys, and Articled Clerks. The result was not merely a cessation of business, but an interruption for several Terms of the Meetings of the Law Society. In consequence, several young men were unable to be duly entered as Students on the Books of the Society, and Students-at-Law were in like manner unable to be duly called to the Bar. Indeed, from 1811, to 1815, no persons were either admitted as Students, or called to the Bar in Upper

Canada. After the cessation of hostilities, the Society, in Hilary Term, 1815, entered the names of seven Students, including the Honorable George Strange Boulton and the Honorable John Rolph. During the same Term, five gentlemen were called to the Bar, three of whom, as already noticed, subsequently became Judges, viz., John Beverley Robinson, Jonas Jones, and Christopher Alexander Hagerman. To legalize these acts of the Law Society, an Act of the Legislature was required. It passed on the 14th March, 1815. (55th Geo. III. cap. 3, sec. 1.) It was by the same Statute declared, that all persons whose names were then entered upon the Rolls of the Court of King's Bench as Attorneys, and who were by military or other public duty interrupted in their regular service, were regularly entered as such Attorneys. (Sec. 3.) Similar provision was made for Attorneys' Clerks. (Sec. 4.)

For seven years following 1815, the admissions to the Law Society, of Students, did not average more than two each Term. The calls to the Bar during the same period did not average more than one each Term. It was during Hilary Term, 1813, that the Honorable James Buchanan Macaulay, the late Chief Justice of the Common Pleas, became a Member of the Law Society. He was called to the Bar in Hilary Term, 1822. Two years afterwards, Charles Coxwell Small, Esquire, the present Clerk of the Crown in the Court of Queen's Bench, having been admitted a Student in Michaelmas Term, 1813, was called to the Bar. His call was made in Easter Term, 1824. Three years afterwards, that is to say, in Hilary Term, 1827, Mr. Justice Burns, who became a Student in Easter Term, 1822, was called to the Bar. In the year following, William Henry Draper, now the Honorable Wm. Henry Draper, C.B., the present Chief Justice of the Common Pleas, having been admitted a Student in Easter Term, 1823, was also called to the Bar. In Michaelmas Term, 1828, the late Mr. Justice Sullivan, and the present Vice-Chancellor Spragge, both of whom were admitted Students five years previously, were called to the Bar. The Chancellor, William Hume Blake, did not become a Barrister till Easter Term, 1835, and in the Term following, his colleague, Vice-Chancellor Esten, received the same degree. Mr.

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Justice Richards was called to the Bar in Hilary Term, 1838; and his colleague, Mr. Justice Hagarty, in Michaelmas Term, 1840.

The Law Society of Upper Canada, though first authorized in 1797, was not incorporated till the year 1822. (2nd Geo. IV. Sess. 2, cap. 5.) The 4th Section of 37th George III. cap. 13, as to the admission to practice of English, Irish, or Scotch, or British Colonial Barristers, was then repealed, In lieu, it was enacted that it should be lawful for any person having been duly called to practice at the Bar of any of the Superior Courts not having merely local jurisdiction in England, Scotland, or Ireland, or in any of the British Provinces in North America, in which the same privileges would be extended to Barristers of this Province, on producing sufficient evidence thereof, and also on producing testimonials of good character and conduct, to the satisfaction of the Law Society, to be called by that Society to the degree of a Barrister. (*Ib.* sec. 2.) The 6th clause of the 37th George III. cap. 13, as to the enrolment of Attorneys, was in like manner repealed, and instead thereof, it was enacted that no person should be admitted by the Court of King's Bench to practise as an Attorney unless upon an actual service, under articles, for five years, with some Practising Attorney of the Province. (*Ib.* sec. 3.) In 1834, an exception was made in the case of the Attorney or Solicitor-General for the time being. (4th William IV. cap. 9.) It would seem, that at one time some Attorneys of the Courts were also engaged in mercantile pursuits, for the Legislature, in 1822, found it necessary to pass the Statute, 2nd George IV. Sess. 2, cap. 1, enacting, that after twelve months from the passing of the Act, no Attorney, being a merchant, or in anywise concerned by partnership in the purchasing and vending of merchandize in the way of trade as a merchant, should be permitted to practise during the time he was so engaged, nor for twelve months afterwards. (2nd Geo. IV. Sess. 2, cap. 1, sec. 44.) The population of the Province having increased to 150,000, the impolicy of combining the two pursuits of merchant and lawyer was, without injury to either calling, thus prohibited. When the population had increased to 360,000, the Court of Chancery was established; and it was enacted that Barristers or Attorneys admitted to practice in

the Courts of Common Law, should be permitted to practise in that Court, as Counsel and Solicitor respectively. (7th William IV. cap. 2, sec. 12.) Graduates of Universities, at home or here, were in the same year declared to be admissible as Attorneys of the Courts, after three years' service under Articles, instead of five years, as required of others; not graduates. (7th William IV. cap. 15. See also 10th and 11th Victoria, cap. 29.)

In 1840, the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada were reunited, for the purposes of Executive Government and Legislation; but, as regards the administration of Law, still remain separate and distinct Provinces, having separate Tribunals.

Queen's Counsel, after the re-union, appear to have been first appointed for Upper Canada, in 1841, when George Boswell, Esquire, the present County Judge of Northumberland and Durham, together with the Honorable John Prince, now a Member of the Legislative Council, were Gazetted as such. This was during the time that Mr. Draper was Attorney-General, and Mr. Baldwin Solicitor-General. As this distinction confers professional rank on the recipient, it is seldom conferred, and then only for merit. Political services are not generally taken into account when the honor is bestowed. Of this we have a good illustration in the list of Queen's Counsel last Gazetted. (October, 1856.) Upon the recommendation of the present Attorney-General John A. Macdonald, of the eleven gentlemen then made entitled to silk gowns, two at least, at the time Members of the Legislative Assembly, were in opposition to the Government that Gazetted them. The ordinary Commission is with precedence in the Courts of Law, such as belongs to the appointment, or with precedence next after a Queen's Counsel named being the one whose appointment was last made. What is called a special patent of precedence is sometimes granted; and, without reference to date, places the recipient next after the person whose name is mentioned, or the Attorney or Solicitor-General for the time being. The words are, "Next after the Attorney-General (or "Solicitor-General") for the time being, and amongst our Counsel learned in the Law next after C.D.," &c.

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There have been at least seven such in Upper Canada: the *first* granted to the Honorable William Henry Draper, with rank after the Solicitor-General for the time being; the *second* to the Honorable Henry Sherwood, with rank after the Attorney and Solicitor-General for the time being; the *third* to the Honorable William Hume Blake, with a like rank; the *fourth*, to Thomas M. Raden-hurst, Esquire; the *fifth* to the Honorable John Ross, in 1853, with rank after the Honorable William Buell Richards, who was Gazetted in 1850; the *sixth*, in June, 1853, received a special patent of precedence, next after the Honorable Robert Baldwin, who was Gazetted on the 15th September, 1842; the *seventh* to the Honorable James Buchanan Macaulay, with rank next after the Attorney and Solicitor-General for the time being. Where precedence is given to several Counsel "next after the Attorney and Solicitor-General for the time being," it is presumed, that, as between themselves, inasmuch as all cannot be next, they will rank according to the dates of their respective Commissions, when not otherwise expressed. Where the precedence is not special, but only as among Counsel already appointed to rank after a particular one named, the precedence has no reference to the official rank which the person named may at the time hold, or afterwards attain. Thus, a patent to rank after a person named, who subsequently becomes Attorney-General, does not entitle the recipient of the Commission to take precedence before the Solicitor-General. (In re H. J. Boulton, Q.C. 1 U. C. R. 317.)

Excluding the Judges, there are at present, out of a Bar of 383 persons, twenty-eight Queen's Counsel, or one silk for every fourteen stuff gowns.

Calls to the Bar are now regulated chiefly by the Rules of the Law Society, made in Michaelmas Term, 1835, amending the previous Rule of Trinity Term, 1st and 2nd William IV., and dividing the Candidates into two classes, those for "Call" simply, and those for "Call with Honors." The latter, though requiring a higher standard of qualification than the former, gives no special rank or precedence at the Bar.

The examination and admission of Attorneys is regulated by the recent Statute, 20th Victoria, cap. 63, and the Rule of the Law Society made thereunder, in Trinity Term, 21st Victoria, both of which are published at length on page 21 of this Directory.

In Upper Canada, with a population now exceeding 1,000,000, there are 383 practising Barristers, the greater part of whom are also enrolled Attorneys. There are, besides, 147 practising Attorneys, who are not Members of the Bar. The Profession, exclusive of the Judges, numbers 530. There are nine Superior Courts Judges, and thirty-one County Judges; making, in all, forty Judges. Thus, the aggregate of the Legal Profession in Upper Canada, with a population exceeding one million, is 570, or one Lawyer to every 1,755 inhabitants.

Advocates, Barristers, Attorneys, Solicitors or Proctors of Lower Canada may, under certain restrictions, be admitted to practise in Upper Canada, or *vice versa* (13th and 14th Victoria, cap. 26); and a Statute now exists, whereby measures may be taken for the admission of Attorneys or Solicitors of either Section of the Province to practice in the Courts of Law and Equity in England. (English Statute 20th and 21st Victoria, cap. 39.)

AN ACT

To amend the Law for the Admission of Attorneys. 20 Vic., cap. 63, 1857.

WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient to alter, amend, and consolidate the several Acts of Upper Canada relating to Attorneys and Solicitors: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

Preamble.

I. From and after the passing of this Act, the several Acts and parts of Acts set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, save only and except so far as such Acts or parts of such Acts, or any of them, repeal the whole or any part of the same, or of any other Act or Acts, and also save and except so far as relates to any matters or things done at any time before the passing of this Act, all which matters and things shall be and remain as good, valid and effectual, to all intents and purposes whatsoever, as if this Act had not been passed, and also save and except as to the recovery and application of any penalty for any offence which shall have been committed before the passing of this Act.

Repeal of former Acts and parts of Acts, as in 1st Schedule.

Things done under them to remain valid.

II. From and after the passing of this Act, no person shall act as an Attorney or Solicitor, or as such sue out any writ or process, or commence, carry on, solicit or defend any action, suit or other proceeding in the name of any other person, or in his own name, in Her Majesty's Court of Chancery, or Courts of Queen's Bench or Common Pleas, or in any of the County Courts of the Counties or United Counties of Upper Canada, now existing or hereinafter to be made, set apart or established, or in any Court of Bankruptcy, or Court for the relief of Insolvent Debtors, now existing or hereafter to be made or established, or in any Court of civil or criminal jurisdiction, or in any other Court of Law or Equity in Upper Canada, or act as Attorney or Solicitor in any cause, matter or suit, civil or criminal, to be heard, tried or determined, before any Justice of Assize of Oyer and Terminer, or Gaol Delivery, or at any General *Nisi Prius* Quarter Sessions of the Peace or Recorder's Court, for any County, City, Town, Township or Village, or before any Justice or Justices, unless such person shall have been previous to the passing of this Act admitted and enrolled and duly qualified to act as an Attorney or Solicitor under and by virtue of the laws now in force, or unless such person shall, after the passing of this Act, be admitted and enrolled, and duly qualified to act, as an Attorney or Solicitor pursuant to the directions and regulations of this Act, and unless such person shall continue to be so duly qualified and on the Roll at the time of his acting in the capacity of an Attorney or Solicitor as aforesaid.

No person to act as Attorney or Solicitor unless admitted and enrolled either under the provisions of this Act or before the passing thereof.

III. Except as hereinafter mentioned no person shall, from and after the passing of this Act, be capable of being admitted and enrolled as an Attorney or Solicitor, unless such person shall have

Except as excepted, no person to be admitted as

Attorney or Solicitor unless he shall have served a Clerkship of five years, have kept 2 terms, and have passed an examination before Law Society.

Provido: the articles, affidavits and certificate to be left with Secretary of Law Society 14 days before term.

A Graduate of any University of the United Kingdom, or of this Province may be admitted as an Attorney or Solicitor after 3 years' Clerkship, and after keeping two terms, and passing an examination before the Law Society.

Provido: that examination shall not take place unless the articles, affidavits, certificate, &c., have been left with Secretary of Law Society.

been bound by contract, in writing, to serve as Clerk for and during the term of Five years to a practising Attorney or Solicitor in Upper Canada, and shall have duly served under such contract for and during the said term of Five years, and shall have during such term of Five years attended the sittings of the Courts of Queen's Bench, or Common Pleas pursuant to the regulations to be made by the Law Society of Upper Canada, under the authority hereinafter contained, at least during two of the Terms of Hilary, Easter, Trinity and Michaelmas, and also unless such person shall after the expiration of the said term of Five years have been examined and sworn in the manner hereinafter directed. Provided that no application for examination and admission of any person under this section shall be entertained, nor shall any person be examined, sworn, admitted, or enrolled as an Attorney or Solicitor, unless he shall, at least Fourteen days next before the first day of such Term in which he seeks admission, have left with the Secretary of the Law Society of Upper Canada his contract of service, and any assignment thereof, together with an affidavit of due execution thereof, and of due service thereunder, and a certificate of his having attended the sittings of the Court or Courts during Term as hereinbefore provided.

IV. Any person who shall have taken or who shall take the degree of Bachelor of Arts or Master of Arts, Bachelor of Law or Doctor of Laws in either of the Universities of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or in either of the Universities of this Province, and shall have been bound by contract, in writing, to serve as a Clerk for and during the term of Three years to a practising Attorney or Solicitor in Upper Canada, and shall have continued in such service for and during the said term of three years, and shall during the whole of such term have been actually employed by such Attorney or Solicitor, or by the Toronto Agent of such Attorney or Solicitor with his consent, for any part of the said term not exceeding one year, in the proper business, practice, or employment of an Attorney or Solicitor, and who shall have, during such term of three years, attended the sittings of the Courts of Queen's Bench, or Common Pleas, pursuant to the regulations to be made by the Law Society of Upper Canada in that behalf, at least during two of the Terms of Hilary, Easter, Trinity and Michaelmas, and who shall, after the expiration of the said term of three years, have been examined and sworn in the manner hereinafter directed, shall be capable of being admitted and enrolled as an Attorney or Solicitor, although he shall have served a Clerkship under such contract as aforesaid for and during the term of three years only, and notwithstanding that such person shall have entered into such contract for service before taking any such Degree as aforesaid; Provided that no application for examination and admission of any person under this section shall be entertained, nor shall any person be examined, sworn, admitted, or enrolled as an Attorney or Solicitor, unless he shall, at least Fourteen days next before the day of such Term in which he seeks admission, have left with the Secretary of the Law Society of Upper Canada as well his contract of service, and any assignment thereof, together with an affidavit of due execution thereof, and of due service thereunder, and a certificate of his having attended the sittings of the Court or Courts during Term as hereinbefore provided as a certificate of his having taken a degree as hereinbefore provided, or duly authenticated certified copy of such certificate.

V. Any person who shall have been previously to or may, after the passing of this Act, be duly called to practise at the Bar of any of Her Majesty's Superior Courts not having merely local jurisdiction in England, Scotland or Ireland, and also any person duly and lawfully sworn, admitted and enrolled an Attorney or Solicitor of Her Majesty's High Court of Chancery or Courts of Queen's Bench, Common Pleas, or Exchequer, in England or Ireland, or Writer to the Signet or Solicitor in the Supreme Courts in Scotland, or Attorney or Solicitor of any of Her Majesty's Superior Courts of Law or Equity in any of Her Majesty's Colonies wherein the Common Law of England is the common law of the land, and shall have been bound by contract in writing, to serve as a clerk for and during the term of One Year to a practising Attorney or Solicitor of Her Majesty's Court of Chancery, or the Courts of Queen's Bench or Common Pleas in Upper Canada, and shall have continued in such service for and during the said term of one year, and shall during the whole of such term have been actually employed by such Attorney or Solicitor, in the proper business, practice or employment of an Attorney or Solicitor, and shall produce such certificates as are hereinafter mentioned, and shall have, during such term of 1 year, attended the sittings of the Courts of Queen's Bench or Common Pleas, pursuant to the Regulations to be made by the Law Society of Upper Canada in that behalf, at least during two of the Terms of Hilary, Easter, Trinity and Michaelmas, and who shall after the expiration of the said term of one year have been examined and sworn in the manner hereinbefore directed, shall be capable of being admitted and enrolled as an Attorney or Solicitor, although he shall have served a Clerkship under such contract for and during the term of one year only: Provided always that nothing in this section contained shall apply or be extended to persons admitted or enrolled solely as Attornies of the Courts of the Duchy of Lancaster, or of the Counties Palatine of Lancaster or Durham, in England, or of the Court of Sheriff's Substitute, or other Inferior Court in Scotland, or of any other than the Supreme or Superior Courts of Judicature of Her Majesty's Colonies aforesaid: and Provided also that it shall be requisite for any person as hereinbefore mentioned to advertise in the *Canada Gazette* at least two months previous notice of his intention to apply to the Court of Chancery, Queen's Bench or Common Pleas, as the case may be, in the next ensuing Term thereafter of such Court for such admission. Provided further that no application for examination and admission of any person shall be entertained, nor shall any such person be sworn or admitted and enrolled, unless he shall, at least Fourteen days next before the first day of such Term in which he seeks admission, have left with the Secretary of the Law Society of Upper Canada, the contract of service and any assignment thereof together with affidavits of due execution thereof, and of due service thereunder and (as the case may be) the several certificates of his having been duly called to the Bar as hereinbefore mentioned, or of his admission and enrolment as an Attorney or Solicitor of the Courts of Law or Equity hereinbefore mentioned, or of any one of them, and also a certificate under the seal of any of the Societies or Inns of Court in England, Scotland or Ireland, duly authorized in that behalf, when such applicant shall have been called to the Bar, or of any such Court or Courts, and duly attested under the hand of the proper Officer of such Society or Inn of Court, or of such Court or Courts, to the effect that the said applicant was at the date thereof on the Books of the said Society or

Inn of Court, or on the Roll of Attornies or Solicitors of such Court or Courts, and that no application to such Society or Inn of Court, or to such Court or Courts, had been made since his admission thereto against such person for misconduct, in such his capacity of Attorney or Solicitor; and also a certificate under the hands of two or more persons of the good moral character of the applicant: which two certificates shall respectively bear date within three months of the first day of the Term within which such application is made; Provided lastly, that nothing in this section contained shall extend to those persons who, in the present session of Parliament, have applied for Acts enabling them to practice as Attorneys and Solicitors in this Province, but the said Courts are hereby authorized to admit them upon proof of their service with any Attorney or Solicitor of either of the said Courts for one year previous to their applications to such Court for admission although such service may not have been under Articles of Clerkship; and upon proof by the certificate of the Clerk of either House of Parliament that a Bill to admit such person to practice had been introduced into the Legislature during the said session, and that such person had previously been authorized to practice as a Barrister or Attorney in some part of Her Majesty's Dominions.

Proviso: In favor of persons who have during the Session of 1857, applied for special Acts authorizing their admission as Attornies, &c.

Law Society required to examine all applicants for admission as Attornies or Solicitors as to fitness & capacity.

After examination, the Judges, upon receipt of certificate under corporate seal of Law Society, may cause oaths to be administered, and may admit to practice.

Proviso for production of the articles, affidavits, certificates, &c., and endorsement of Judge's fiat for admission.

VI. It shall be lawful for the Law Society of Upper Canada, and the said Society is hereby required before any person shall be admitted or enrolled as an Attorney or Solicitor, and upon satisfactory proof to the said Society of such certificates as are hereinbefore mentioned, in cases where the same are requisite under this Act, and of the said contract in writing for service, and of the execution thereof, and of the due and proper service thereunder, and upon due and proper satisfaction of the requisites of this Act having been complied with, to examine and enquire by such ways and means as they shall think proper, touching the fitness and capacity of such person to act as an Attorney or Solicitor; and if the said Society shall be satisfied by such examination, or by the certificate of such Examiners as hereinafter mentioned that such person is duly qualified and fit, and competent to act as an Attorney or Solicitor, then, and not otherwise, the Judges of the Courts of Law and Equity of Upper Canada, or any one or more of them, shall be, and he or they are hereby authorized, upon a certificate under the corporate seal of the said Society of the due service under contract, in writing, of such person, and of his fitness and capacity, and of his having duly complied with the requirements of this Act, or that he is in all respects duly qualified to be admitted as an Attorney and Solicitor, to administer or cause to be administered to such person in open Court, and during the Term in which such application for admission is made, in addition to the oath of allegiance, the oath hereinafter directed to be taken by Attornies and Solicitors, and after such oaths taken to cause him to be admitted an Attorney or Solicitor of the Court or Courts of Law or Equity of Upper Canada, and his name to be enrolled as an Attorney or Solicitor of such Court (as the case may be), which admission shall be signed by the Clerk or Registrar of such Court or Courts. Provided always that together with such certificate of the Law Society as hereinbefore provided and annexed thereto, shall be produced to such Judge or Judges of the Court wherein such person seeks admission, the original contract or contracts of service and any assignments thereof, and the affidavits of due service thereunder by this Act required, and all such

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other certificates as are hereinbefore required, and upon the said certificate of the said Law Society of Upper Canada shall be endorsed by such Judge his Fiat for admission, and the said document shall thereupon be delivered by the Clerk of the Court wherein such application is made, to the Clerk of the Crown and Pleas, to be by him filed and retained of record in his office.

VII. Whenever any person shall after the passing of this Act be bound by contract in writing to serve as a Clerk to any Attorney or Solicitor as aforesaid, the Attorney or Solicitor to whom such person shall be so bound as aforesaid shall, within three months after the date of such contract, make and duly swear, or cause or procure to be duly made and sworn, an affidavit or affidavits, of such Attorney or Solicitor having been duly admitted, and also of the actual execution of every such contract by him the said Attorney or Solicitor, and by the person so to be bound to serve him as a Clerk as aforesaid, and in every such affidavit shall be specified the names of every such Attorney or Solicitor, and of every such person so bound, and their places of abode respectively, together with the day on which such contract was actually executed; and every such contract and affidavit annexed thereto shall be filed within three months next after the execution of the said contract with and by the Clerk of the Crown and Pleas, at Toronto, who shall thereupon make and sign a memorandum of the day of filing such affidavit upon such affidavit and also upon the contract.

VIII. In case such affidavit as hereinbefore mentioned be not filed within three months after the date thereof, the same may be filed by the officer before mentioned after the expiration thereof, but the service of such Clerk shall be reckoned to commence and be computed from the date of filing such affidavit.

IX. Every person who now is or hereafter shall be bound by contract in writing to serve as a Clerk to any Attorney or Solicitor shall, during the whole time and term of such service, to be specified in such contract, (not exceeding the term of five years) continue and be actually employed by such Attorney or Solicitor in the proper business, practice or employment of an Attorney or Solicitor.

X. From and after the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for all and every person now authorized to practice as an Attorney or Solicitor, in Upper Canada, or who shall be hereafter authorized to practice as aforesaid, to take and have under contract in writing four Clerks at one time, and no more; and no Attorney or Solicitor shall take, have or retain any Clerk who shall be bound by contract in writing as aforesaid, after such Attorney or Solicitor shall have discontinued or left off practising as or carrying on the business of an Attorney or Solicitor, nor whilst such Attorney or Solicitor shall be retained or employed as a Writer or Clerk by any other Attorney or Solicitor; and service by any Clerk under Articles to an Attorney or Solicitor, for and during any part of the time that such Attorney or Solicitor shall be so employed as Writer or Clerk by any other Attorney or Solicitor, shall not be deemed or accounted as good service under such Articles.

XI. Every person who shall have been or shall be bound as a Clerk as aforesaid shall, before he be admitted an Attorney or Solicitor according to this Act, prove by an affidavit of himself as also of the Attorney or Solicitor to whom he was bound as aforesaid, or such Agent as aforesaid, to be duly made and delivered to the Law Society of Upper Canada, upon his application for admission, that

Affidavit to be made and filed within three months of execution of articles, and the articles to be enrolled.

How Articled Clerks shall be employed.

Every practising Attorney or Solicitor may have four Articled Clerks at one time, and no more.

Clerks whose Masters have died or left off practice, may enter into fresh contracts for the residue of their term.

Attornies or Solicitors not to commence or defend suits while in Gaol or on the limits.

he hath actually and really served and been employed by such practising Attorney or Solicitor or Agent (as to the latter for the term of one year only as hereinbefore mentioned) during the whole term and in the manner required by the provisions of this Act, and in the form to be approved by the Judges of the Court wherein such person shall apply to be admitted.

XII. No person who shall, from and after the passing of this Act, become bound as aforesaid, shall be admitted an Attorney or Solicitor before such contract and affidavit so marked as aforesaid respectively shall have been produced to the Law Society of Upper Canada, in pursuance of the provisions hereinafter contained, unless the same cannot be produced, in which case any Court or Judge of the Court wherein such person seeks admission, may, on application in that behalf, and on being satisfied of such fact, in his discretion, dispense with the production thereof.

XIII. In case any Attorney or Solicitor to whom any Clerk shall be bound by contract, in writing as aforesaid, shall, before the end or determination of such contract, become bankrupt, or take the benefit of any Act for the relief of Insolvent Debtors, or be imprisoned for debt and remain in prison for the space of twenty-one days, it shall be lawful for any of the said Courts of Law or Equity wherein such Attorney or Solicitor is admitted as aforesaid, upon the application of such Clerk to order and direct the said contract to be discharged, or assigned to such person, upon such terms, and in such manner as the said Court shall think fit.

XIV. If any Attorney or Solicitor, to or with whom any such person shall be so bound, shall happen to die before the expiration of the term for which such person shall be so bound, or shall discontinue or leave off practice as an Attorney or Solicitor, or if such contract shall by mutual consent of the parties be cancelled, or in case such Clerk shall be legally discharged before the expiration of such term by any rule or order of the Court wherein such Attorney or Solicitor shall have been admitted, such Clerk shall and may in any of the said cases be bound by another contract or other contracts in writing, to serve as Clerk to any other practising Attorney or Solicitor, or Attornies or Solicitors, during the residue of the said term, and service under such second or other contract in manner hereinbefore mentioned shall be deemed and taken to be good and effectual; Provided that an affidavit be duly made and filed of the execution of such second or other contract or contracts within the time and in the manner hereinbefore directed, and subject to the like regulations with respect to the original contract, and affidavit of the execution thereof.

XV. No Attorney or Solicitor who shall be a Prisoner in any Gaol or Prison, shall or may, during his confinement in any Gaol or Prison, or within the limits thereof, as an Attorney or Solicitor, sue out any Writ or process, or commence or prosecute or defend any action or suit, in any Courts of Law or Equity, or matter in Bankruptcy or Insolvency; and such Attorney or Solicitor so commencing, prosecuting or defending any action or suit as aforesaid, and any Attorney or Solicitor permitting or empowering any such Attorney or Solicitor as aforesaid to commence, prosecute or defend any action or suit in his name, shall be deemed to be guilty of a contempt of the Court in which any such action or suit shall have been commenced or prosecuted, and punishable by the said Courts accordingly, upon the application of any person complaining thereof: and

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such Attorney or Solicitor so commencing, prosecuting, or defending any action or suit as aforesaid, shall be incapable of maintaining any action or suit at Law or in Equity for the recovery of any fee, reward, or disbursement for or in respect of any business, matter or thing done by him whilst such Prisoner as aforesaid, in his own name or in the name of any other Attorney or Solicitor.

XVI. If any Attorney or Solicitor shall wilfully and knowingly act as Agent in any action or suit in any Court of Law or Equity, or matter in Bankruptcy or Insolvency, for any person not duly qualified to act as an Attorney or Solicitor as aforesaid, or permit or suffer his name to be any ways made use of in any such action, suit or matter, upon the account or for the profit of any unqualified person, or send any process to such unqualified person, or do any other act thereby to enable such unqualified person to appear, act or practice in any respect as an Attorney or Solicitor in any suit at Law or in Equity, knowing such person not to be duly qualified as aforesaid, and complaint shall be made thereof in a summary way to any of the said Superior Courts wherein such Attorney or Solicitor has been admitted, and proof made thereof, upon oath to the satisfaction of the Court, that such Attorney or Solicitor hath wilfully and knowingly offended therein as aforesaid, then and in such case every such Attorney or Solicitor so offending, shall and may in the discretion of the Court, be struck off the Roll, and for ever after disabled from practising as an Attorney or Solicitor; and in that case, and upon such complaint and proof made as aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful to and for the Court to commit such unqualified person so acting or practising as aforesaid to any Common Gaol or Prison for any term not exceeding one year.

XVII. From and after the passing of this Act, in case any person shall in his own name, or in the name of any other person, sue out any Writ or process, or commence, prosecute or defend any action or suit or any proceeding in any Court of Law or Equity, without being admitted and enrolled as aforesaid, or being himself the Plaintiff or Defendant in such proceeding respectively, every such person shall be and is hereby made incapable to maintain or prosecute any action or suit in any Court of Law or Equity for any fee, reward, or disbursements on account of prosecuting, carrying on or defending any such action, suit or proceeding, or otherwise in relation thereto; and such offence shall be deemed a contempt of the Court in which such action, suit, or proceeding shall have been prosecuted, carried on, or defended, and shall and may be punished accordingly.

XVIII. No person who has been admitted and enrolled shall be liable to be struck off the Roll for or on account of any defect in the Articles of Clerkship, or in the registry thereof, or in his service under such Articles, or in his admission and enrolment, unless the application for striking him off the Roll be made within twelve months from the time of his admission and enrolment; provided that such Articles, Registration, Service, Admission or Enrolment, be without fraud.

XIX. The Law Society of Upper Canada are empowered, and they are hereby required, from time to time, to make and ordain all such Rules and Regulations as they may consider necessary for conducting the examinations of persons applying to be admitted as Attornies and Solicitors, as well touching the Articles and Service, and the several Certificates hereinbefore mentioned, as the fitness and capacity of such persons to act both as Attornies and Solicitors;

Attornies or Solicitors not to act as Agents for persons not qualified, &c.

Punishment of persons contravening this section.

Prohibiting persons not enrolled from suing out writs, &c.

Offence to be a contempt.

Applications for striking Attornies or Solicitors off the roll for defect in Articles, &c., when to be made. Except where there has been fraud. Law Society may appoint Examiners, and make rules touching the examination

and admission of Attornies and Solicitors, &c.

Such rules and regulations to be submitted to and approved of by the Judges.

Persons only admitted in one Court capable of practising in all other courts on signing the other rolls.

Oath of office to be taken by Attornies, &c.

The oath.

No Attorney or Solicitor to trade as a Merchant.

Persons having completed the period of service, but not been admitted may, if qualified, be admitted.

Fees payable as set forth in second Schedule.

Judges to make such rules, &c., as may be necessary.

Act to apply to U. C. only.

and from time to time, to nominate and appoint, if they shall see fit to do so, Examiners for the purpose of conducting such examinations as to the said fitness and capacity: Provided always, that such Rules and Regulations shall be first submitted to and approved of by any three or more of the Judges of the Courts of Queen's Bench, Common Pleas or Chancery of Upper Canada, of whom one of the Judges of each of the said Courts shall form one.

XX. Every person who shall have been duly admitted, sworn and enrolled as an Attorney or Solicitor of the Courts of Queen's Bench, Common Pleas or Chancery of Upper Canada, shall be entitled, upon the production of his Admission therein, or an Official Certificate thereof, and that the same still continues in force, to be admitted as an Attorney or Solicitor in any other of the said Courts (as the case may be) upon signing the Roll of such other Court or Courts, but not otherwise, and shall thereupon be entitled to practise as an Attorney or Solicitor therein, as the case may be, in the like manner as if he had been sworn in and admitted an Attorney or Solicitor of such Court.

XXI. Every person who shall, pursuant to this Act, apply to be admitted an Attorney or Solicitor, shall, before he be admitted and enrolled as aforesaid, take and subscribe the oath, or if he be one of the people called Quakers, the affirmation following:

"I, A. B., do swear (or solemnly affirm, as the case may be) that I will truly and honestly demean myself in the practice of an Attorney (or Solicitor, as the case may be) according to the best of my knowledge and ability. So help me God."

XXII. No Attorney or Solicitor being a Merchant or in any wise connected by partnership, public or private, in the purchasing and vending of merchandize in the way of trade as a Merchant, shall be permitted to practise in any of the Courts of Upper Canada during the time he may be such Merchant or so engaged as aforesaid, nor until twelve months after he shall have ceased to be such Merchant or so engaged as aforesaid.

XXIII. Every person who at the time of the passing of this Act, or within the period of six months thereafter, shall have completed his period of service according to the Laws in force at the time of the passing of this Act, but shall not have been admitted an Attorney or Solicitor in pursuance of such service, shall, if otherwise qualified according to the requirements of this Act, be capable of being admitted and enrolled an Attorney or Solicitor in pursuance of the provisions of this Act, in the same manner in all respects as if he was actually bound by contract in writing, at the time of the passing of this Act, and notwithstanding that the attendance of such person during two of the Sittings of either of the said Courts in Term time has not been complied with as hereinbefore mentioned and required.

XXIV. The several Fees shall be payable to the persons and for the duties therefor to be performed as contained in the second Schedule to this Act appended.

XXV. It shall be lawful to and for the Judges of the Courts of Queen's Bench, Common Pleas and Chancery of Upper Canada, to make, from time to time, such Rules or Regulations, other than the Rules and Regulations hereinbefore referred to, as to them may seem necessary and meet for carrying out the provisions of this Act.

XXVI. This Act shall extend to Upper Canada only.

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RULE

Passed by the Law Society,

IN TRINITY TERM, 21st VICTORIA,

Under authority and by direction of an Act, passed 20th Victoria, Chap. 63, intituled, "An Act to Amend the Law for the Admission of Attorneys."

WHEREAS, by the provisions of an Act passed in the last Session of the Provincial Parliament, 20th Victoria, Chapter 63, to amend the Law for the admission of Attorneys, there has been imposed upon this Society the duty of examining and certifying as to the fitness and capacity of persons about to apply to the different Courts of Law and Equity in Upper Canada for

admission as Attorneys or Solicitors of such Courts, and various other provisions have by the said Act been made respecting such admission or enrollment, with power to this Society to make Rules and Regulations for the better carrying out the provisions thereof :

BY THE BENCHERS OF THE LAW SOCIETY OF UPPER CANADA, IN CONVOCATION (with the approbation of the Judges of the Province, as Visitors of the said Society, the same having been first submitted to, and approved of by one or more of the Judges of each of the Courts of Queen's Bench, Chancery, and Common Pleas, in pursuance of the said Act),

IT IS ORDAINED,—

I. That the two Terms to be kept by Articled Clerks, under the third, fourth, and fifth sections of the said Act of Parliament, shall be kept by them by attending the sittings of the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas, or one of them, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act, every day on which such Courts, or either of them, shall sit during such Term; and by their entering their names and subscribing their Declaration of Attendance in the Articled Clerks' Attendance-Book of such Courts, or either of them, pursuant to the said Rules of Court respectively; a Certificate or Certificates of which, from the Clerks of such Court or Courts, shall be left by every such Candidate, with his Petition for Certificate of Fitness, Articles, and other papers, with the Secretary, as herein and by the said Act prescribed, with respect to such Petition and Articles.

II. That in case any such Articled Clerk, while at Toronto, for the purpose of attending the Sittings of such Courts, or either of them, in compliance with the requirements of the said Act, shall, from sickness or other unavoidable impediment, be prevented from being or remaining in attendance in Court for the whole or any part of the time that such Court or Courts may be sitting on any day in either of such Terms, such Articled Clerk shall, nevertheless, be allowed such day or days' attendance, as within the meaning of the said Act, upon his satisfying the Clerks of the Crown and Pleas of the said two Courts, by certificate from his Medical attendant, or otherwise to their satisfaction, that such sickness or other unavoidable impediment was the sole cause of such absence; and upon such Articled Clerk leaving a Certificate thereof, under the hands of such Clerks of the Crown and Pleas, with the Secretary of this Society, with his Petition for Certificate of Fitness and other papers as hereinafter prescribed.

III. That all applications for Certificates of Fitness for admission as Attorney or Solicitor, under the said Act, shall be by Petition in writing addressed to the Benchers of the Society in Convocation; every such Petition, together with the documents required by, and the fees payable to this Society, under the said Act, or under the rules of the said Courts, or those of this Society, shall be left with the Secretary of this Society, at Osgoode-Hall, on or before the third Saturday next before the Term in which such Petition is to be presented.

IV. That every candidate for a Certificate of Fitness for admission as an Attorney or Solicitor under the said Act shall, with his Petition for such Certificate, leave with the Secretary of the Society, at Osgoode-Hall, answers

to the several questions set forth in the Schedule to this Rule annexed, marked, "A," signed by such candidate; and, also, answers to the several questions set forth in the Schedule to this Rule annexed, marked "B," signed by the Attorney or Solicitor with whom such Articled Clerk shall have served his Clerkship; together with a Certificate in the said last mentioned Schedule also contained.

V. That in case any such candidate, at the time of leaving his Petition for Certificate of Fitness and papers with the Secretary of this Society, as hereinbefore provided, shall be able to prove to the satisfaction of the said Secretary that it has not been in his power to procure the answers to the questions contained in the said Schedule B from the Attorney or Solicitor with whom he may have served any part of the time under his Articles, or the Agent of such Attorney, or the Certificate of Service therein also contained, the said Secretary shall state such circumstances specially in his report to Convocation on such Articled Clerk's Petition; and thereupon it shall be in the power of the Benchers in convocation to dispense with the production of such last mentioned answers and Certificates, or any of them, as they may think fit and reasonable.

VI. That all Examinations of Candidates for Certificates of Fitness for admission as Attorneys or Solicitors do take place on the first examination day of the Term, being the first Monday therein.

VII. That the Examination of Candidates for Certificates of Fitness for admission as Attorneys or Solicitors shall be in such books as the Benchers of the Society in Convocation shall or may from time to time for that purpose prescribe or appoint.

VIII. That such Examination be partly oral and partly by printed or written questions, as provided with respect to Examination for Call to the Bar.

IX. That the Secretary shall make Reports upon all Petitions of Candidates for Certificates of Fitness for admission as Attorneys or Solicitors similar to those required from the Treasurer on Petitions for Calls to the Bar; which Reports, together with the Petitions and documents to which they refer, shall be laid on the table of Convocation on the first day of Term.

X. That the Examination of Candidates for Certificates of Fitness for admission as Attorneys or Solicitors shall not be entered upon on the first day of any Term, until the Examination of all Candidates for Call to the Bar on the order of the day for that day be first disposed of.

XI. That the Ten Shillings Fee provided for by the said Act shall be received by the Secretary of the Law Society to his own use, and the Ten Pounds Fee to that of the Society, and be paid over into the Treasury accordingly.

XII. That the Committee of Questions of each Term shall frame and settle the questions to be printed or written for the Examination of Candidates for Certificates of Fitness for admission as Attorney or Solicitor for the following Term, and shall provide for the printing or copying of the same, as directed by the third standing order of Convocation of Hilary Term, 20 Victoria, in respect to the questions for Examinations for Calls to the Bar.

XIII. That Candidates for Certificates of Fitness for admission as Attorneys or Solicitors shall attend at Osgoode-Hall on the last Wednesday of

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the Vacation previous to the Term in which their Petitions are to be presented, and shall receive from the Examiner of the Society a copy of the questions to be answered by them in writing; and shall then and there, under the supervision of such Examiner frame answers to such questions, and deliver such answers in writing to him for the Benchers in Convocation.

XIV. That the attendance of such Candidates for the purposes mentioned in the foregoing section of this Rule be at Ten o'clock A.M., and that the answers be delivered to the Examiner by Three o'clock P.M., of the same day.

XV. That so much of the first section of this Rule as prescribes the entering of their names in the Articled Clerk's Attendance-Book of the said Courts, and the subscribing the Declaration of Attendance required to be contained in the heading to such Book, and the reference to such Book in the Clerks of the Crown and Pleas certificate of such attendance, shall not apply to the case of any Articled Clerk attending the sittings of the said Courts, or either of them, during the present Term.

No person can be compelled to serve as a Juror, at either Assizes or Quarter Sessions, who has served within one year preceding.

LAW TERMS—B.R. & C.P.

Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week.

Easter begins third Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week.

Trinity begins Monday next after 21st August, and ends on the Saturday of the ensuing week.

Michaelmas begins third Monday in November, and ends on Saturday of the ensuing week.

The Long Vacation, in all the Courts, commences 1st July, and ends 21st August.

CIRCUITS.

The Circuits are held twice a year in each outer County:—Spring, between Hilary and Easter Terms; and Autumn, between Trinity and Michaelmas Terms. In the County of York, there are three in each year,—Winter, commencing on the Thursday in January next after the Municipal Elections; Spring, the second Monday in April; and Autumn, the second Monday in October, in each year.

Heir and Devisee Commission.

The Court of Probate, and the several Surrogate Courts exercise the powers and functions which the Ecclesiastical Courts exercise in England, relating to the Probate of Wills, and the administration of the estates of Intestates. Persons dying and leaving property in more than one county, those interested must prove the Will, &c., in the Court of Probate which is held at Toronto, and is open throughout the year for the granting of Probates and committing Letters of Administration. It has four terms in every year, commencing on the first Monday in January, last Monday in March, first Monday in June, and last Monday in September.

The Surrogate Courts are held in every county, on the same days as the Probate Court. Wills can be proved, and letters of Administration granted, any day, at the office of the County Surrogate.

County Courts.

THESE COURTS are presided over by resident Judges in each County, being Barristers of at least five years' standing. They have original jurisdiction, under 19th and 20th Victoria, chap. 90, sec. 20, in "All personal Actions where the Debt or Damages claimed is "not more than £50, and in all Causes or Suits relating to Debt, "Covenant, or Contract when the amount is liquidated, or ascertained by the act of the parties, or the signature of the Defendant, "to £100;" and in cases of Tort to Personal Chattels to £30, with

trial by Jury. Appeals are allowed to the Courts of Queen's Bench or Common Pleas. They also possess Equity Jurisdiction, under 16th Victoria, chap. 119; Registration of Bills of Sale and Chattel Mortgages, under 20th Victoria, chap. 3; also the Registration of Limited Partnerships, under 12th Victoria, chap. 75. The Terms are regulated by 20th Victoria, chap. 58. There are four, of one week each, in each year, commencing on the first Monday in January, April, July, and October, and ending on the Saturday of the same week.

The Sittings are the same as the Quarter Sessions, and are held on the second Tuesday in the months of March, June, September, and December, in each year. Vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

A Fee Fund is fixed by Statute, 19th and 20th Victoria, chap. 90, secs. 18, 21, and 23, and other Fees by the Judges of the Superior Courts; and a Table of Costs was published, pursuant to Statute, on 2nd July, 1857.

Quarter Sessions.

CHAIRMAN—The County Judge in each County, who, with one or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in each County, four times a year, for Trials by Jury, in cases of Larceny, Misdemeanour, and other minor offences. This Court also has the supervision of some of the accounts in the County relating to the Administration of Justice, &c.

The Courts of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the several Counties and Unions of Counties in Upper Canada are held on the second Tuesday in the months of March, June, September, and December, in each year.

Recorders' Courts.

In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, and Kingston, the Recorder's Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Coun-

ties having no jurisdiction in Cities, the care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen, and Police Magistrate of each.

The City Sessions are held four times a year, on the first Monday in January, April, July, and November.

Division Courts.

THESE COURTS are held in different places in each County, by the County Judge, for the summary disposal of cases not exceeding £25 currency in amount, so far as regards matters of Debt or Contract ; and £10, so far as relates to injuries to personal chattels and torts. A Jury is permitted in certain cases. Attachments against personal property of debtors absconding from the Province, leaving property liable to execution, or removing their goods from one County to another, or from the Province, with intent to defraud, or keeping concealed to avoid service of process with intent to defraud, may be issued by the Clerk of the Division, or by the Judge, or by any Justice of the Peace. Courts are held once in two months, in each Division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. In the City of Toronto they are generally held about once a fortnight. The Divisions are established by the Courts of Quarter Sessions.

Insolvent Debtors' Court.

The COUNTY JUDGE in each County, presides in this Court, for the relief of Insolvent Debtors.

 THE LAW SOCIETY OF UPPER CANADA.

THE Law Society of Upper Canada was first established in 1797, by the Act 37 George III., cap. 13, which enabled the then Practitioners of the Law to form themselves into a Society, and make Rules for its government, under the inspection of the Judges, as Visitors. The Act of 1822, (2 George IV., cap. 5,) incorporated the "Treasurer and Benchers of the Law Society," giving a perpetual succession, and a common Seal, in the usual manner of Acts of Incorporation.

Under these statutes, the Society is governed by the BOARD OF BENCHERS, in the same manner as the various Law Societies in London, England. The Benchers sit in convocation every Term, for the admission of Students and Barristers, and the examination of fitness and capacity of Attornies, and for other general business. The examination for Students at Law, which is a Scholastic examination, is conducted in the presence of the Benchers; and the examination of Barristers, at the end of the term of five years after admission, and of Attornies, after the service of five years as Law Clerk, is conducted by the Benchers in convocation. These last two examinations are in the various branches of legal learning. Each Student at Law, on admission, is a member of the Society, and entitled to the use of the Library. The Revenue of the Society consists of the fees paid by Students-at-Law, and Barristers, and Attornies, on their admission; and the fees called *Term Fees*, charged to practising Barristers. By an agreement with the Government, the Society furnish the Superior Courts with suitable accommodation, for ever, for the sum of £6,000 currency. The Library of the Society is of considerable value, and is of great service to the Students and Practitioners. The Treasurer is elected annually, in Michaelmas Term, and enters upon his duties on the first day of the following term.

Students at Law.

Candidates for admission as *Students at Law*, are required to pass an examination in the following subjects:—

Optime Class.—Phœnissœ of Euripides; the first twelve books of Homer's Iliad; Horace; Sallust; Euclid, or Legendre's Geometrie; Hind's Algebra; Snowball's Trigonometry; Earnshaw's Statics and Dynamics; Herschell's Astronomy; Paley's Moral Philosophy; Locke's Essay on the Human Understanding; Whately's Logic and Rhetoric; and such works in Ancient and Modern History as the candidates may have read.

University Class, (for Graduates of Universities).—Homer, first book of Iliad; Lucian the Charon; Life or Dream of Lucian and Timon; Odes of Horace; Mathematics or Metaphysics, at the option of the candidate, according to the following courses respectively: Mathematics,—Euclid, first, second, third, fourth, and sixth books; or Legendre's Geometrie, first, second, third, and fourth books; Hind's Algebra, to the end of simultaneous Equations or Metaphysics,—Walker's and Whately's Logic, and Locke's Essay on the Human Understanding; Herschell's Astronomy, chapters first, third, fourth, and fifth, and such works in Ancient and Modern Geography and History as the candidates may have read.

Senior Class.—The same subjects and books as for the University Class.

Candidates for any of the above Classes are required to attend the Examiner, at Osgoode Hall, at 10 o'clock, on the first Thursday and first Friday of the Term during which they apply for admission.

Junior Class.—First and third books of the Odes of Horace; Euclid, first, second, and third books; or Legendre's Geometrie, by Davies, first and third books; and such works in English History and Modern Geography as the candidates may have read.

Candidates for this Class are required to attend the Examiner, at Osgoode Hall, at ten o'clock, on the first Friday of the Term in which they apply for admission.

Candidates for any of the above examinations, as Students at Law, are required to give notice (which must be signed by one of the Benchers), of their intended application, during the Term preceding that in which they intend to present themselves for examination, and pay with such notice a fee of five shillings. The other fees payable are Admission Fee and Certificate, £11 12s. 6d.

Barristers at Law.

The Requisites for call to the Degree of *Barrister at Law*, are:—

1. Being of the age of twenty-one years.
2. Being of the standing of five years from admission as a Student at Law; or three years, if a Graduate in Law or Arts of any University in Her Majesty's dominions, or if after admission, the candidate becomes a Graduate of any one of the three Canadian Universities specified in the Act 10 and 11 Victoria, cap. 59, namely:—the University of Toronto, Queen's College, or Victoria College.
3. Having, during these five or three years, attended Lectures for at least four Terms, in Osgoode Hall, and having presented to the Secretary of the Law Society, on the last day of Term, certificates of the same, signed by the Lecturer of each Term.

4. Having passed an examination in the following books:—

Candidates for this Examination are required to attend at Osgoode Hall, at ten o'clock, on each of the following days:—Those for the *ordinary Call*, on the last Friday of Vacation; and those for *Call with Honours*,

on the last Thursday and last Friday of Vacation; and to give notice, (which must be signed by one of the Benchers,) of their intended application, during the Term preceding that in which they intend to present themselves for examination, and to pay with such notice a fee of five shillings. The other fees payable at Call are, Degree and Diploma, £21 10s.

By the 2nd section of the Act 2 George IV., cap. 5, persons admitted to the degree of Barristers at Law, in England, Ireland, or Scotland, or in any British North American Province in which the same privilege is extended to Barristers from Upper Canada, on producing Testimonials thereof, and of good character and conduct, may be called to the degree of Barrister at Law in Upper Canada.

By the 1st Section of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, cap. 26, persons admitted as Advocates, Barristers, Attornies, Solicitors, and Proctors at Law, of Lower Canada, or who have studied there as a Law Clerk, for the full period required by the Act 12 Victoria, cap. 63, on producing sufficient Testimonials of such admission or study, and of good character, and passing an examination in the Law of Upper Canada, may be called to the degree of Barrister at Law in Upper Canada.

Attorneys at Law and Solicitors in Chancery.

The service as Law Clerk, to a duly admitted and practising Attorney and Solicitor, and admission as Attorney at Law, and Solicitor in Chancery, thereafter, has been considerably altered, and is now regulated by the Act of last Session, 20 Victoria, cap 63.

Under this Act, the persons entitled to apply for admission as Attornies or Solicitors, may be thus classified.

1. Persons who shall have been previous to or after the passing of that Act, duly called to practice at the *Bar* of any of Her Majesty's Superior Courts, (not having merely local jurisdiction,) in England, Scotland, or Ireland. Also, persons lawfully sworn, admitted, and enrolled, *Attorneys* or *Solicitors* of Her Majesty's High Court of Chancery, or Courts of Queen's Bench, Common Pleas, or Exchequer, in England or Ireland, or Writers to the Signet, or Solicitors in the Superior Courts in Scotland; or Attornies or Solicitors of any of Her Majesty's Colonies wherein the Common Law prevails; these not to include Attorneys of the Courts of the Duchy of Lancaster, or of the Counties Palatine of Lancaster or Durham, in England; or of the Court of Sheriff's Substitute, or other Inferior Court of Scotland; or of any other than the Supreme or Superior Courts of Judicature of Her Majesty's Colonies, (Sec. 5.)

2. Persons who shall have taken, or who shall take the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, or Master of Arts, Bachelor of Laws, or Doctor of Laws, in either of the Universities of the United Kingdom of Great Britain or Ireland, or in either of the Universities of this Province, (Sec. 4.)

3. All others not included in the foregoing, who shall have complied with the Act, (Sec. 3.)

Different provisions are made for these different classes of persons, but there are certain regulations common to all. The following may be enumerated.

1. Service with a practising Attorney of Upper Canada, under a written Contract of Service.

2. Attendance at the sittings of the Courts of Queen's Bench, or Common Pleas, of Upper Canada, pursuant to regulations to be made by the Law Society of Upper Canada.

3. Deposit with the Law Society, at least fourteen days before the first day of the Term in which admission is sought, of the contract of service, and any assignment thereof, together with an affidavit of the due execution thereof, and of due service thereunder, and a Certificate of having attended the sittings of the Courts.

4. Examination as to fitness and capacity by the Law Society of Upper Canada, which body is authorized "to enquire by such ways or means as they shall think proper."

5. Payment to the Law Society, on deposit of articles and assignments &c. of 10s. and for the Examination of fitness and capacity, £10.

The only material difference as to the provisions made between the three classes of persons above enumerated, is as to the period of service necessary. Persons of the first class are required to serve only for the term of one year; persons of the second for three years; persons of the third for five years.

Candidates of the first class must also at least two months previous to notice of intention to apply, advertize in the Canada Gazette. They must if Barristers, produce and file Certificates of having been called to the Bar, or if Attorneys or Solicitors, of their enrolment as such, they must also whether Barristers, Attorneys or Solicitors, produce and file Certificates to the effect that at the date thereof, Applicants were on the Books of the Society, that called them, or on the Roll of Attorneys or Solicitors of their respective Court or Courts, and that no application had been made against such person for misconduct. They must also, whether Barristers, Attorneys or Solicitors, produce and file Certificates under the hands of two or more persons of good moral character. The two last descriptions of Certificates, must bear date within three months of the first day of the term within which application is made, (Sec. 5.)

Under the above Act, also, persons admitted only in one Court, are capable of practising in all other Courts, on signing the other Rolls.

By the second Section of the Act, 13 and 14 Victoria, cap 26, any Advocate, Barrister, Attorney and Proctor at Law of Lower Canada, on being called to the Degree of Barrister at Law in Upper Canada, may also be admitted as an Attorney and Solicitor of the Superior Courts of Upper Canada, and by the 4 Win. IV., cap 9, the Attorneys and Solicitors General may be admitted to practice without service.

The Act 20 Victoria, cap: 63, to amend the Law for the admission of Attorneys, and Rule of the Law Society, passed Trinity Term, 21 Victoria, in pursuance thereof, are set out in detail at pp. 21 and 30 of this work.
