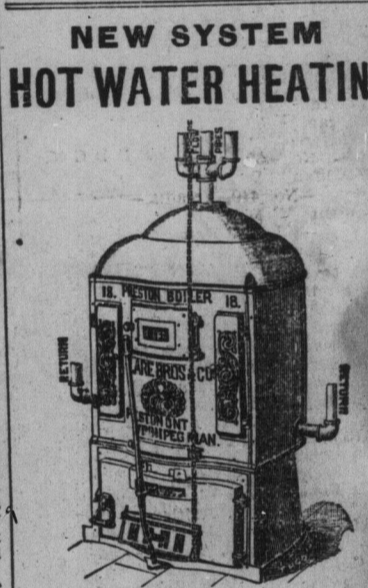

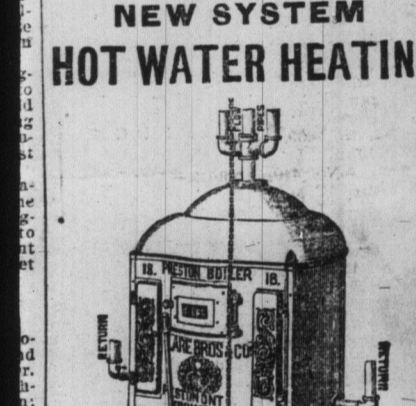
Big Shoe Firm in Trouble.
