

THE THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

Protestant Infants' Home.

The Committee have much pleasure in laying before their friends and the public, the third Annual Report of the Protestant Infants' Home. Under the Divine blessing, the Home has prospered beyond their most sanguine expectations. Many kind friends have been raised vp, who have contributed liberally to its support; and though, owing to the increased number of inmates, the expenses have been greater, yet the treasury has never been empty.

At the last Annual Meeting, there were 30 children in the Home; since that time 106 have been received. Out of that number 67 are the children of married parents, and 39 illegitimate. The health of the children throughout the year has been generally good only one epidemic has prevailed; and, but for the diseases incident to that class of infants, the number of deaths would have been very small. As it is, the mortality rate is smaller than that of similar institutions. During the year, 51 have died, 34 been removed by parents or friends and 5 adopted. The last-mentioned class have been frequently visited at their new homes, and they seem to be well cared for in every respect. We trust that the number of adoptions will increase from year to year, that being one of the main objects of the Committee.

During the past year, there has been a monthly average of 9 nurses, more than half of whom have been married women with infants of their own. One young woman, who entered with her infant when the Institution was first opened, left it last fall for a more profitable situation. Her child is remarkably attractive, and has been often selected for adoption, but she refuses to give it up, and it still remains in the Home. Several of the women have remained in the Home, and have nursed, besides their own children, 3 or 4 others in succession.

The difficulty of getting wet-nurses is still very great, but less than it was, for the Home is better understood, so that destitute respectable married women are more willing to avail themselves of its protection, and give the services so much required.

We still occupy the house No. 9 Notre Dame street, but it is far from being suitable; for such a large number of children, the accommodation is too limited, and the means for ventilating and heating are very imperfect. The house has been again leased for two years, and the attic will require to be enclosed and divided into rooms to provide extra accommodation for the increased number of infants.

We would anew urge upon our friends the absolute necessity for a more commodious building, if the work is to be successfully carried on.

The funds for maintaining the Home during the past twelve months have been raised in various ways. The ladies have again collected in districts, by which a considerable sum has been realized. In April, a Bazaar was held, the proceeds of which amounted to \$1441. Several kind friends unsolicited sent in donations, and a large sum was collected by our President. We have received a grant of \$460 from the Quebee Legislature; and collections have been received from a few of the Protestant churches of this city. In the Treasurer's report, a full statement of the income and expenditure will be given.

The Committee would take this opportunity of expressing the gratification afforded them by the visit of Lady Dufferin to the Home, and they hope that her example will be followed by many others. They feel convinced that the more thoroughly the working is understood, the better will it be appreciated. The Home is open to visitors every day after ten o'clock, and the Committee are anxious that the public should go and judge for themselves as to its management. It is impossible in a report like this to specify the many sad cases, even among the respectable poor, which come before the Committee. This year there have been an unsually large number of widowers' children admitted, and in two cases the infants of insane mothers have been sheltered.

Religious services have been held every Sunday during the year. The clergymen of the various churches have either officiated themselves or have provided substitutes.

Our kind physician Dr. Bell still continues to give his valuable services to the Home. The general healthy condition of the children is, no doubt, in a great measure due to his unwearied patience and faithful attendance.

We are thankful to say that our matron Miss Clunie continues as devoted as ever to the work in which she engaged three years ago. We cannot speak too highly of her kindness, good management and christian influence. We would also acknowledge the valuable services of the head nurse M s. Ritchie, who has been with us since August.

Our thanks are due to John Dougall, Esq., for a copy of the "Daily Witness" and for gratuitous printing and advertising; to the "Star" for gratuitous printing and advertising; to Donald Ross, Esq., for throwing open his green-house for the benefit of the Home; to Kenneth Campbell, Esq., for medicine furnished gratuitously; to all those kind friends who remembered us at Christmas, and by their donations ministered to the comfort and happiness of the inmates of the Home.

TO THE MANAGERS OF THE PROTESTANT INFANTS' LADIES,

It is with much pleasure I present to you this brief Annual Report, being my third, on the health of the Protestant Infants' Home during the year 1872-73, but I fear that the ample statistics to be found in the Secretary's statement will leave me very little to say that will be of interest to non-professional persons.

At the end of last year there were thirty infants remaining in the Home, and one hundred and six were admitted during the year. One hundred and thirty-six infants were, therefore, under my professional care during the past twelve months. The deaths were fifty-two during the year or a fraction over thirty-eight per cent. of the whole number. This per-centage of mortality is much lower than that of the first year of the existence of the Home, but is a little higher than that of the second in which the per-centage of deaths was only thirty-two.

In the beginning of the official year just closing measles was very prevalent, and the tender inmates of the Home did not escape the epidemic. Gradually it spread amongst the infants, attacking one after another of the little creatures that already seemed to have more than they could do in the struggle for existence. During April and May, this disease carried off a number of the infants and left several others so debilitated that they succumbed during the warm weather that immediately followed. With this exception no infectious disease invade, the Home. One infant, whose mother was carried off by small-pox immediately before its admission, having died shortly afterwards, it was suspected that

it also succumbed to the same poison, yet no well marked eruption appeared. Two of the infants died from infantile cholera; and diarrhœa, easily checked, was an occasional symptom of the debility which brought so many to their early graves. From the irritation and fever attendant upon painful dentition two died, and in many other cases this was also any of the causes leading to the debility and convulsions which terminated their short existence. Some of the infants shortly after their admission died of well marked syphilis, and in other cases this constitutional taint was the chief cause of the innutrition and marasmus which ended in death. In two cases the symptoms and post mortem appearances pointed to congestion of the bowels as the cause of death. The following table gives the number of infants that died in each month, from each disease during each month and during the year. From it may also be learned the fatality of the invasion of measles and its sequents, bronchitis and debility, to which I have already referred.

Of those that died twenty-one were wet-nursed wholly or partially, and thirty-one were fed or bottle-nursed. This mortality is greatly in excess of that of last year in the same class.

The nurses have generally enjoyed good health, yet it is desirable that they, as well as the children, should have more outdoor exercise than has been practicable during the past year, and to this end I again strongly urge that the Home

be removed as soon as possible to some suburban district, where sufficient grounds can be obtained for this purpose, as it is impossible for the nurses to take proper healthful exercise in a small back garden or in the crowded streets of the city. A building suitably arranged and properly ventilated is now absolutely a necessity for the good health of the children and their nurses, as in the winter especially it is impossible to ventilate the present rooms without opening the windows and causing draughts injurious to the infants.

It is unnecessary for me to refer to the attontion and skill displayed by the Matron and Assistant Matron in the care of the inmates of the Home, and to whom its success is mainly due, as these are already so apparent to those who have any part in the management of the Institution.
