# THE TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

### OF THE MANAGERS OF

# THE PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

The Lady Managers of the Protestant Orphans' Home, in presenting this, their Twenty-second Annual Report, beg to return thanks to Almighty God for the many benefits they have received at His hands during the past year.

Since the last annual meeting the number of inmates of the "Home" has reached 100, of whom 6 have been apprenticed, 3 adopted, 18 taken by their parents, and 34 admitted. The number of inmates in the House at present is 80.

On the 13th of October last, at the request of the Lady Managers, Her Excellency the Countess of Dufferin, accompanied by Lady Harriet Fletcher, was pleased to honour the "Home" with a visit.

Her Ladyship on her arrival was received by the Lord Bishop of Toronto, the Venerable Archdeacon Fuller, the first and second Directresses, and was greeted with the National Anthem, sung by the children. After which, Her Excellency and Lady Harriet Fletcher were conducted over the institution by the first and second Directresses; and, upon her return to the Board-room, the Countess expressed great satisfaction with what she had seen and her willingness to become one of the Patronesses of the institution. Her Excellency, on leaving the "Home," was cheered by the children until her carriage was out of sight.

During the same month, a theatrical entertainment was given in aid of the "Home," under the immediate patronage of their Excellencies the Governor-General and Lady Dufferin, the Lieut.- Governor and Mrs. Howland, which was a substantial success. The ladies desire to return thanks to Captain Donaldson, of the steamer *City of Toronto*, for a trip to Niagara, and to Captain Parkinson for the free trip he gave the children to the Island, which they enjoyed exceedingly; they also desire to thank Dr. Ogden for his great care of the health of the inmates during the past year, and to Mr. VanKoughnet, Solicitor to the "Home," for his unremitting care and attention to the affairs of the institution; to the Common Council of Petrolia, for their liberal donation of *fifty dollars* in aid of the "Home."

During the past year only two deaths have occurred in the "Home," although many of the children have been ill with measles and hooping-cough.

Mrs. John Ridout kindly gave the part proceeds of an operatic performance (the singers in which were entirely composed of lady and gentlemen amateurs) for the benefit of the "Home," by which a handsome sum was realised.

We cannot close our report without drawing attention to the frequent and handsome donations received from our steadfast friends, the Orangemen of Ontario, which will be seen in detail in the Treasurer's report.

In conclusion they desire to express their acknowledgment to the various Butchers, Bakers, Market-gardeners, Grocers, and Confectioners, for the many generous gifts they have made to the "Home" during the past year.
