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TWENTY-EIGHTH REPORT
OF
THE TORONTO MAGDALENE ASYLUM,
OR
INDUSTRIAL HOUSE OF REFUGE.

In February last, the Managers of this Institution intimated to their friends and the public, through the daily papers, their intention of changing the time of their Annual Meeting from the first Wednesday in February to the first Wednesday in October, in order to be in accordance with the Government year, which ends 30th September. And, at the same time, they gave a short account of the work done, and the necessary statistics, covering a period of *nine* months. This report will be the full account from October 1st, 1881, to September 30th, 1882.

“Let us not be weary in well-doing, for in due season we shall reap if we faint not.”—Gal. vi. 9. This text seems a most fitting one for the Managers and friends of the Home, and one which she, who for the last three years was its Secretary, but who has so lately passed away to her eternal reward, not only believed in but acted upon. Of Mrs. Burns it may truly be said that she “never wearied in well-doing.” Mrs. Burns took part in the very first meeting, (the others were Misses Rankine, Mrs. Capt. Dick, and Mrs. John Arnold) called at the Rev. Mr. Sanson’s, May, 1853 (nearly 30 years ago) to organize this charity; and, with the exception of the years she was absent from Toronto, was always deeply interested in and labored most indefatigably for its benefit. In losing Mrs. Burns, the Managers lose a very valuable helper in their work, and the inmates a truly devoted friend and counsellor.

In bringing a report of our work once more before our friends, we desire first, to acknowledge our humble dependence on our Heavenly Father for wisdom and guidance, and our grateful

thanks that He has permitted us to work in this part of His vineyard, trying to follow, however feebly, in the footsteps of our blessed Saviour, who, while on earth, did not despise the poor or needy, nor yet the *outcast*. We have, however, very little of what is new or interesting to tell. To quote Mrs. Burns' words, written last February, "We cannot give novelty to our reports; year after year is the same *old story*, now 28 times told. But of this we can assure our kind friends and supporters, that, although our Institution is growing older, it admits of no abatement of appliances nor any cessation of energy and prayerful effort. Our work admits of no holiday." Women come to us sorrowful and apparently most earnest in their desire to do better; but, after a few weeks spent in healthy work and freedom from all stimulants, a craving for these stimulants and desire for excitement takes possession of them, and only in some cases can we persuade them to remain in the Home. Hence the large number who "leave of their own accord." Sometimes coming openly and telling us "they cannot" or they "will not stay"; at other times not daring to face the Managers, but slipping out, jumping the fence, and running off—perhaps to be very sorry the very next day. And yet, we cannot shut the door against such, though we may, and do, make it somewhat difficult for them to get re-admittance; and this we do because we are convinced that to make it easy for them does not help them to exercise any restraint over their desires, but encourages them to yield to the craving which seizes them with a force we have little idea of.

Again I quote from Mrs. Burns: "We open the door as wide and as often as we can, but we insist on a term of probation before sending any out upon the public. However plausible the story or hopeful the case, we would not venture to recommend the *untried*. We owe something to society and its interests as well as to those whom we have taken under our care." Our record for this year is as follows:—

Of these, we have sent to service 20, to the hospital 6, to friends 3, died 1, dismissed 2, left of their own accord 34; remaining 32

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in the Home Sept. 30th, 1882. Of the 20 we had sent to service, 5 have returned to the Home, principally because the places did not suit them. The others we can but follow with our prayers, trusting they will continue to do well.

Visits like the following cheer us very much and make up for much discouragement. This was from one who had left the Home in '63 to take service in a country town. Her principal failing was *drink*, which had brought her very low, more especially as when under its influence she was very wayward if not violent, consequently was well known to the police. During the next two years after leaving us she *fell* three times, but being really honest, clean and hardworking, her mistress forgave her, being also satisfied that she was really struggling hard to get the better of her besetting sin. And the struggle was not in vain. She has since continued steadfast, is married, and most comfortably settled, both husband and wife being members of the Bible Christian Church; and by patient industry they have laid by a something for old age. On visiting the Home and meeting some of the ladies she had known, how fervent were her thanks and expressions of gratitude to God for such a home. Another visit was from a gentleman and his wife from the States, who, having means and leisure, had set out to find, if possible, some near relatives, of whom they had lost sight for many years, and one, an aunt, he found in E. M., and found her, too—for which he was very thankful—a Protestant and consistent member of the Methodist Church. The meeting was a most pleasant one, and he desired, and afterwards wrote to the same effect, that if at any time she was seriously ill he was to be told and he would come to her. From another, a former inmate and one of whose reform we had almost despaired, we continue to hear good accounts for now more than two years. We might mention other pleasing incidents, but these will suffice. We do not dare to speak of large numbers being thoroughly reformed; our experience tells us that the large proportion of this class are only safe when under restraint. We have numbers who do well for three, six or nine months, and then *fall*; such we may not speak of as reformed. The Rev. Wm. H. Wood, Assistant Chaplain in the Lock Hospital, London, England, visited the Home in June and wrote the following in the visitors' book: "Having visited the Refuge, I beg to say that I am much pleased

with the good work done in this Institution, and hope it will receive still greater support from those who are able to give."

Our Matron, Mrs. Spence, still continues to deserve our entire confidence. She has a most difficult position to fill, but she manages to bring to it a large amount of earnestness and unwearied patience; and the Sub-matron, Miss Drennan, who has charge of the sewing-room, manages her department most conscientiously. We have also engaged a Miss Dunlop to visit the Jail and other places where the women we seek to save are to be found, and after a trial of her services for three months, are satisfied she possesses the true spirit of the Christian worker, with much patience and perseverance. We shall in future, with Miss Dunlop's assistance, be enabled to follow up cases which require looking after.

To show that the inmates are not allowed to live in idleness, we would draw attention to the amount of work done by them this last year. The amount is \$1,621.80, nearly one-half of the entire expense of keeping up the Institution; and it must be remembered that this is in addition to all the necessary work of the Home, including the sewing, knitting and quilting for the inmates themselves. In our register some names appear more than once, and some may be inclined to think that the total, 98, is largely made up of these; but that is not so. *Four* appear *twice*, having gone to service and returned; *one four* times, for the same reason; and *one twice*, having been sent to the Hospital and returned. While *four* have been admitted *twice* and *two three* times, of whom we can give no good account. But these would only reduce the number to 82 individual names.

Our thanks are due and most gratefully offered to the Ministerial Association for their arranging for a service at the Home every Lord's Day for the last six months; also to Mr. Alcorn and Mr. Brown, who still continue their regular and valuable services on that day; and to any who may have assisted them. We are also much indebted to Dr. Britton for his freely-given services to the sick.

And now we close with our usual appeal to our friends and the public. We have endeavored to give you a true account of our work, and we confidently look for a renewal of your liberality. "Let every man, according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly or of necessity, for God loveth a cheerful giver."
