





PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME.

From the report presented at the Annual Meeting of the Protestant Orphan's Home, 344 Dovercourt Road, on Tuesday afternoon, June 5th, it is evident that the good work of that institution is increasing with marvellous rapidity.

The meeting was held in the large Hall of the Home, which was patriotically decorated. The attendance was one of the largest that had ever assembled there on such an occasion. Rev. Canon Cayley presided, and among the gentlemen present were Rev. Canon Welch, Rev. Mr. Hart, Rev. Mr. Chown, Ald. Graham, Dr. McConnell, Mr. Huson Murray, Q.C., Major Leigh, Mr. W. B. McMurrich, and Mr. Elmes Henderson.

The report of the Lady Managers showed that during the past year there had been admitted to the Home 85 children, of whom 44 were girls and 41 boys. Of these 75 were natives of Canada, 4 of Great Britain, and 6 of the United States. In religion 54 were Church of England, 13 Methodists, 9 Baptists, 8 Presbyterians, and 1 Catholic Apostolic. Seventy-seven children left the Home, of whom 33 were girls and 44 boys. Fourteen were apprenticed, 43 were taken out by parents or relatives, and 2 died as a result of lung trouble following measles. Eighteen were transferred to the new orphanage at Picton, founded by the True Blues. The average number of children in the Home each month was 189, and the average number of inmates, 202.

A large number of applications for children were reported.

Touching reference was made to the death of Mrs. Van Koughnet, Honorary President of the Board of Management. She was for 45 years connected with the Home, and for 22 years was its First Directress.

The resignation of Mrs. John Cawthra from the position of First Directress, in consequence of her contemplated removal to England, was accepted with regret. Advantage was taken of the occasion to present Mrs. Cawthra with a

beautiful illuminated address, the work of Miss Ida Sutherland, one of the inmates of the Home. The presentation was made by Mrs. Leigh.

The work of Miss Deacon, the Matron of the institution, and her staff, was warmly commended.

The medical report showed the institution to have been practically free from sickness, except for a mild epidemic of measles.

The Treasurer's statement showed the receipts to be \$10,109.39, of which \$1,345.52 was Government grants, \$1,420 in city grants, \$1,557.25 in contributions from relatives, and \$303.45 bequests. The expenditure amounted to \$8,708.78, leaving a balance on hand of \$1,400.61.

THE FORTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME.

The Lady Managers of the Protestant Orphans' Home, have great pleasure in presenting their Forty-ninth Annual Report ; and wish to express their sincere thankfulness for all the blessings which have contributed to the welfare and happiness of the inmates of the Home. Chief among the causes for thankfulness being the continued good health of the children, no serious epidemic having been experienced during the year.

There have been admitted to the Home, during the past twelve months, 85 children, 44 girls and 41 boys; 75 of these children are natives of Canada, 4 of Great Britain, and 6 of the United States.

By religious denomination, 54 are Church of England, 13 Methodist, 9 Baptist, 8 Presbyterian, and 1 Catholic Apostolic.

Seventy-seven children have left the Home, 33 girls and 44 boys. Fourteen of these were apprenticed, 43 were taken by parents or relatives, and 2 children died, both of these were boys three years of age, one died of lung trouble, the other of pneumonia, followed by measles.

Eighteen children were transferred to the new Orphanage at Picton, founded by the True Blues, as previously agreed upon.

The average number of children in the Home each month has been 189, and the average number of inmates 202.

During the year an unusually large number of applications for children have been received. The applicants frequently stating that their neighbors had been supplied from the Home; thereby showing that the wards of the Home produce very favourable impressions on those with whom they come in contact in their new homes.

It might be mentioned that the number of children who do not "turn out well" is remarkably small, the satisfactory conduct of the children apprenticed being evidenced by the letters received from their employers.

The following are a few extracts from letters recently received :—

"Lizzie has proven herself in every respect satisfactory ; we all think so much of her. I am proud to report that she is a kind sweet dispositioned girl."

"Martha is happy and contented, she is a very good girl, and behaves herself very well."

"Katy is quite happy, she has kept very well and is giving good satisfaction."

"I take pleasure in letting you know that you could not have sent me a better boy than Arthur."

Of a boy now in his fifth year of apprenticeship, his employer writes : "We like him very much, he has been a very good boy."

The following message was received by the Secretary, concerning a little girl adopted two years ago :

"Tell the Lady Managers that, although there are some pretty rich people in Toronto, there is no one who has money enough to buy Mabel."

Sometimes a boyish letter, full of kind remembrances for nurses and others in the Home, testifies to the kindly disposition and happy surroundings of the little correspondent.

A full account is given in the Treasurer's Report of bequests and donations, and useful gifts in kind, received during the year, by which it will be seen that there are many friends who remember the Home from year to year. There are many who remember to provide pleasures and treats, also, for the little ones.

Among these are to be mentioned Mrs. Carlyle's annual ice-cream treat ; a trip to Munro Park, kindly provided by Mrs. Henry Cawthra ; the annual visit to the Toronto Exhibition ; several trips to the city parks ; a lime light entertainment, given by Mr. Calville ; an illustrated lecture by Mrs. S. G. Wood, and many treats by the Managers, especially in the different holiday seasons.

Mr. Edwards has again shown himself an interested friend of the boys, coming regularly and training them for his choir. The Managers received a grateful note of thanks from the Churchwardends and congregation of St. Jude's Church, for the assistance given in the Choir, by the Orphan's Home boys,

During the year, largely through the kindness of Mrs. Heintzman, a piano has been added to the Home, which has materially contributed to the enjoyment of the children, especially through the Physical Culture classes, which have been a new feature this year. A drill instructor was also secured for the older boys, during the winter months.

The Home has also been provided with the "Natural Drop," system of fire escape, at a cost of \$95.

The Medical Staff, as usual, deserve the kind thanks of the Managers, for their faithful services, and prompt attention during times of illness, particularly Dr. McConnell, who has been in almost daily attendance.

Mr. Huson Murray, the Solicitor for the Home, has been untiring in his labours, for the benefit of the Home, and the Managers desire to express their thanks for his many kindnesses.

During Miss Langton's long absence, the Board have greatly missed her efficient services as Secretary, and have much pleasure in welcoming her among them once more.

It is our sad duty to record the death of Mrs. VanKoughnet, the Honorary President of the Board of Managers. Mrs. VanKoughnet having been for 46 years connected with the Home, and 22 years the First Directress, and at all times the devoted friend of the inmates of the Home; her kindly influence and deep interest will long be greatly missed by the members of the Board.

Mrs. John Cawthra's resignation as 1st Directress, tendered on account of her contemplated removal to England, has caused the deepest regret to members of the Board. The Managers feeling assured, however, that Mrs. Cawthra's warmest sympathy will ever be extended toward the "Home" for which she has accomplished so much.

In conclusion the Lady Managers express their hearty appreciation of the valuable services of the Matron, Miss Deacon, and of her staff, in whose kindness and faithfulness in the care and oversight of the Home and its inmates they feel entire confidence.

MEDICAL REPORT.

In presenting the Forty-ninth Annual Report, we have to record a mild outbreak of measles and diphtheria, with two deaths from tuberculosis, following measles. The extent which these affect the Home varies from year to year. However we passed through the outbreak without any serious spreading. It is exceedingly difficult to prevent the entrance of contagious disease when so many friends and relatives, both from the city and country, are constantly visiting the children and in this way carry in contagion.

Nevertheless, when we compare our record for the year with other institutions in the Province, we are not at the head of the list.

The general health of the children has been good owing to the prompt and persevering efforts of Miss Deacon, the Matron, and her faithful attendants.

The untiring zeal of the Lady Managers to provide for every want of the little ones, and their cheerful acceptance of any suggestion which the medical staff may make from time to time, make our duties always a pleasure.
