Perhaps we are mistaken:—but sure we are of the tranquillity and lovashility of such places, however we might be unable to habituate to them our careless moments. Visit them, dear reader, as often as you can; read the names on the tombstones, the obscurgest of them now made of importance by the deprint of death; and come away, loving still better the friends that must have theirs


