THE 'PINO WAR

American Troops Hastily Defeat the Enemy—Aguinaldo Issues a Proclamation. Manila, May 19.—In the Catang fight, the enemy attacked the men of the 43rd Infantry. The Americans killed 209 of the rebels, and by actual count only three Americans were killed. Major John C. Gilmore and 100 men of the 43rd Regiment were ambushed on their march to reinforce Col. J. Frank. Seventy-five of the enemy were killed, and there were no American casualties. Transport Lennox has returned here after landing four troops of the 11th Cavalry to reinforce Col. J. Frank. The troops, Major Hugh T. Legaspi, and proceeded across the country to strengthen the garrison at Liguao. They were met by Filipino detachments named by Filipinos between the towns, and were two days constantly skirmishing, dismounted, and were finally forced to retreat. The officers report that they killed 40 Filipinos, but the natives declare 80 were killed.

Toronto, May 18.—The bank clearings for the week ended May 17 for the Dominion of Canada were as follows: Montreal, \$15,208,193, a decrease of 4.4 per cent; Toronto, \$10,299,925, an increase of 12.5 per cent; Winnipeg, \$2,409,411, an increase of 55.1 per cent; Halifax, \$1,233,111, an increase of 8.1 per cent; Hamilton, \$894,800, an increase of 13.5 per cent; St. John, N.B., \$568,995, a decrease of 11.7 per cent; Vancouver, \$856,240, an increase of 9.7 per cent; Victoria, \$702,436, an increase of 22.2 per cent.
