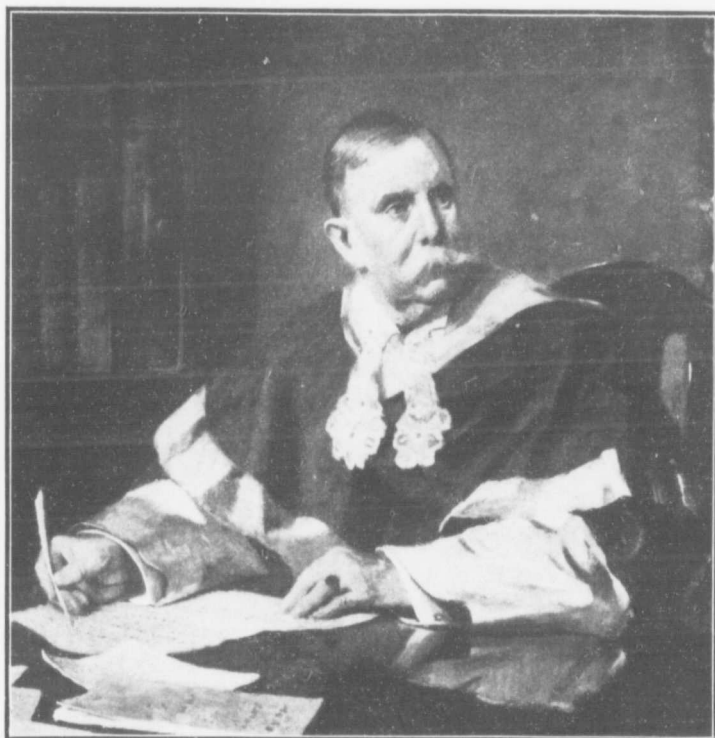

the Club by E. Wyly Grier, R.C.A.

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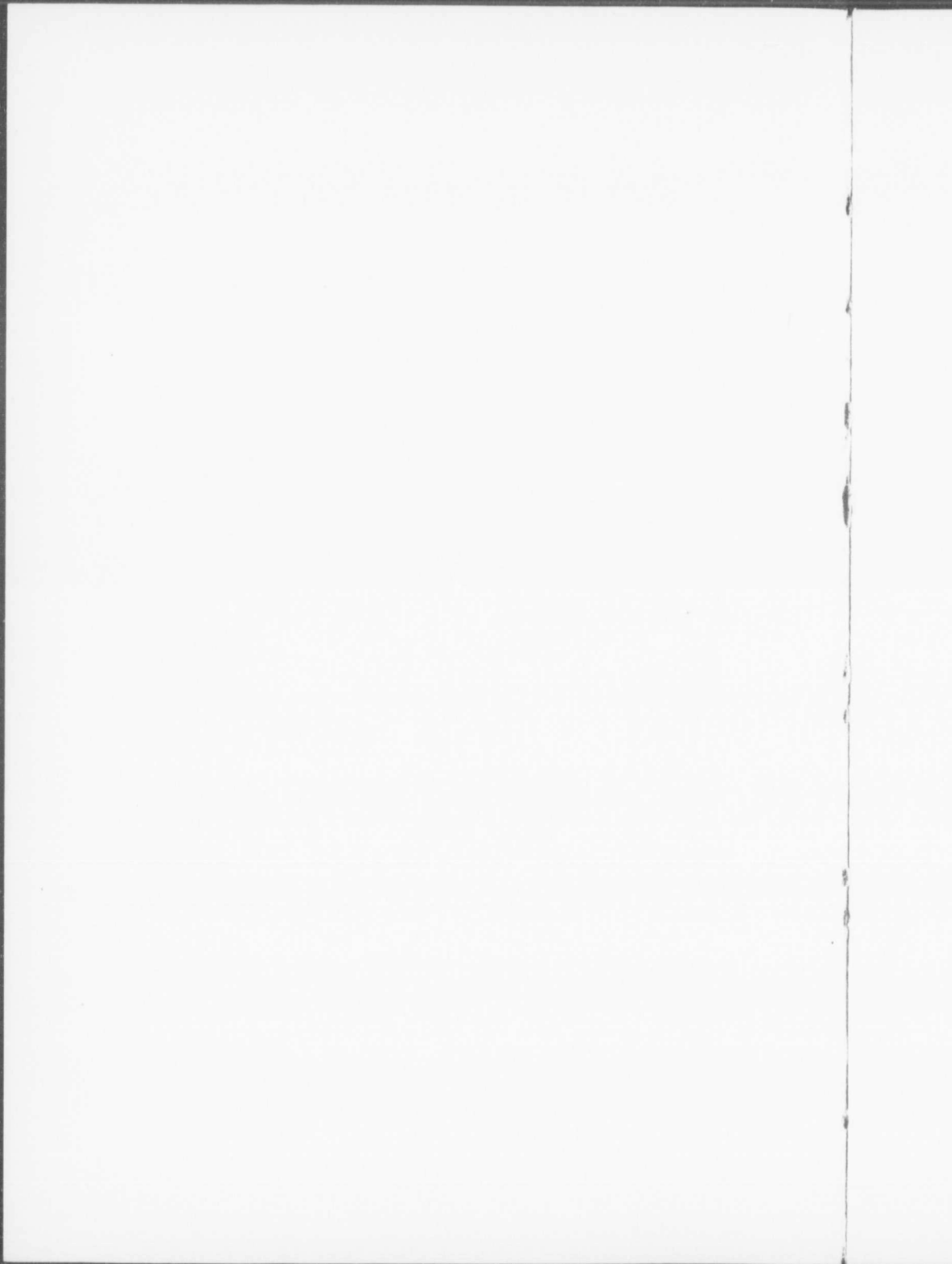

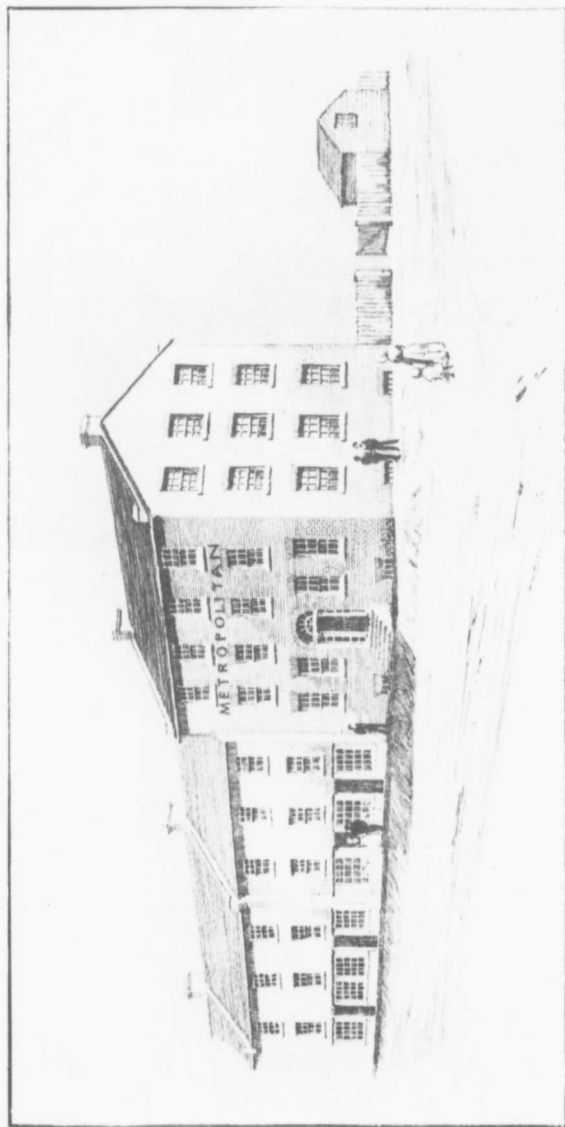

Historical Note

The following memorandum, furnished in 1911 by the only gentleman then living who was conversant with the early history of the Club—the late Sir Æmilius Irving, K.C.—will be of interest to the present members:

“In 1835 and '36 the idea was started where by Mr. Robert Stanton, then the King's Printer and a gentleman of position, was induced to erect a club house on King Street, on the site of the existing Mail Building, corner of Bay Street. A cut can be seen at page 440, Vol. I. of Robertson's Landmarks, as in 1850, with the sign therein of “Metropolitan,” a second-class hotel of the day. The individual promoters were largely from Toronto, with many outside supporters from Woodstock, Rice Lake, Niagara District, Lake Simcoe and Yonge Street up to Holland Landing.

“In Toronto the active gentlemen were Mr. W. Newbigging, Captain Sawers (retired Royal Marines), Messrs. W. H. Boulton, Percival Ridout, William Cayley, William Botsford Jarvis (Sheriff of the Home District), John Barwick, of Holland Landing, and probably Captain John

Simcoe Macaulay, R.E.; Mr. Isaac Buchanan, and his partner, Mr. R. W. Harris.

“I have placed Mr. Newbigging’s name first because I heard it stated that the success of the club was largely owing to his interest in the working, and that but for his death, about 1838, the club would have done much better than it did afterwards. He was of the firm of Murray & Newbigging, a business founded by the Hon. George Moffatt, of Montreal.

“I cannot pretend to name, and indeed, did not know at the time, those who composed the early chairmen of the committees, but I **think** those I have already named were of the committees.

“About 1839 or ’40, the committee—who had carried on the club on their own responsibility—called the members together and after several efforts to carry on had failed, it was determined to close and pay off the debts by a general assessment. This was done, and in 1842 some original members came together and reorganized the club on a less pretentious plan than at first projected.

“At this reorganization I was included among the new members. The arrangement was that

the club should have exclusive possession of several rooms of the old British Coffee House (afterwards rebuilt as the Rossin House), kept as a family hotel by a Mrs. Ellah, who had been in the employment of Sir John Colborne and was a famous housekeeper. The club thus re-organized (on a moderate scheme) was quite successful. The first club failed, having been started with ideas too liberal.

“Except on occasions there was no one to eat the dinners (provided if required); the members dined with their families, and there was no bachelor class prepared to pay for club dinners and the inevitable pint of sherry; moreover, there was great mismanagement and waste.”

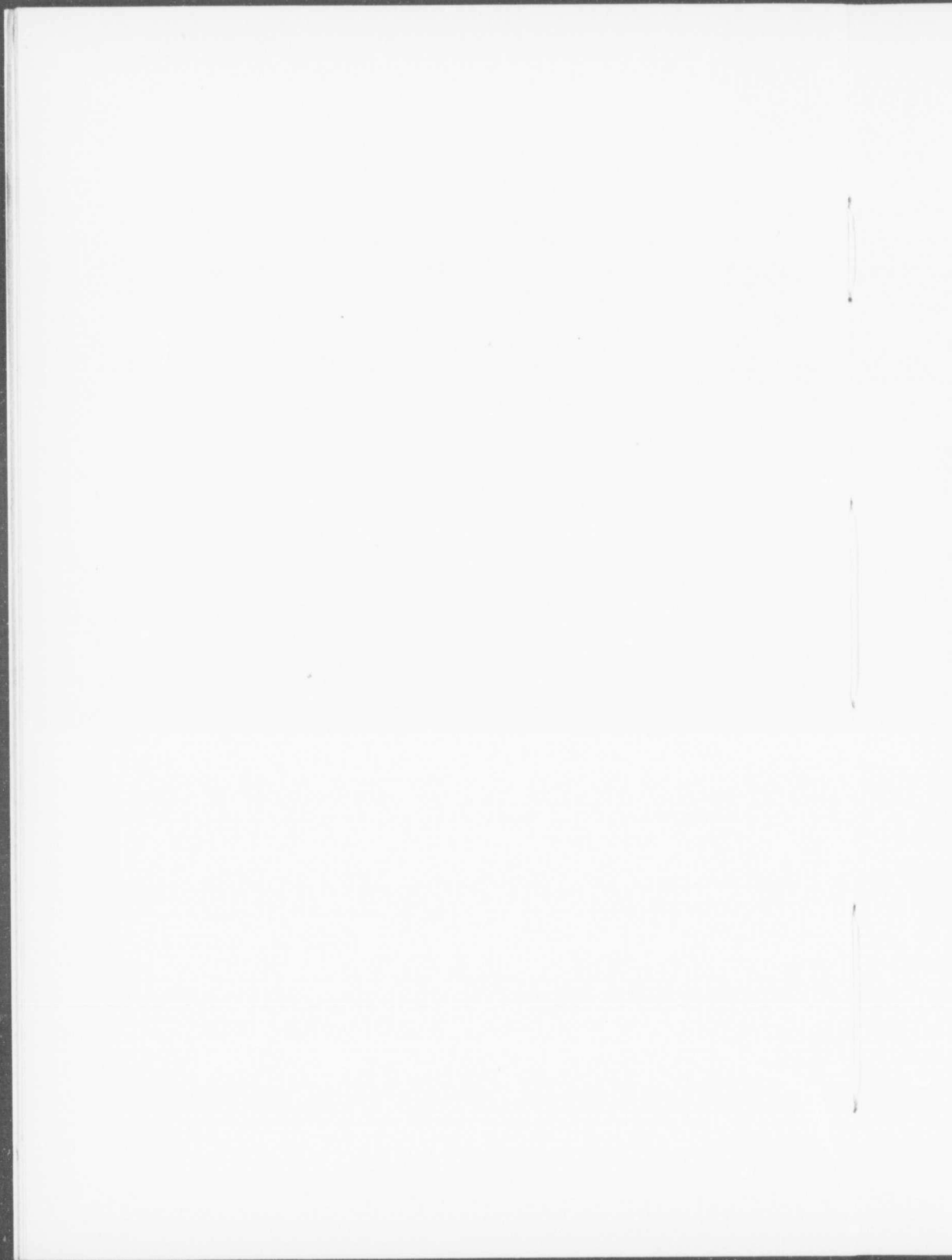
The migrations of the Club subsequent to the period covered by the above memorandum were as follows:

In September, 1847, (in consequence of the expiry of Mrs. Ellah's lease) to a Mr. Sinclair's rooms.

On 1st January, 1848, to rooms in the North American Hotel.

On 1st April, 1848, back to the British Coffee House, and remained there and in rooms in the Rossin House (erected on same site) until 1864, when the Club moved into the building Nos. 77 and 79 York Street.

They remained there until August, 1889, when the Club went into occupation of the present house, corner of York and Wellington Streets.

CHAPTER XCII.

(Assented to 15th October, 1863.)

An Act to incorporate the Toronto Club. Preamble

WHEREAS the persons hereinafter named, with a large number of others in Toronto, and elsewhere in Upper Canada, have associated themselves for the establishment of a Club, for social purposes, and have prayed to be incorporated by the name of the "Toronto Club," and it is expedient to grant their prayer: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. The Honourable J. H. Cameron, and A. Thornton Todd, J. M. Strachan, A. Morrison, John Crawford, Esquires, and such other persons as now are or hereafter shall become members of the said Association shall be and are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate, in deed and in name, by the name of the

"Toronto Club," and by that name shall have perpetual succession and a common seal, and shall have power from time to time to alter, renew, or change such common seal, at their pleasure, and shall by the same name from time to time and at all times hereafter be able and capable to purchase, acquire, hold, possess, and enjoy, and to have, take and receive, to them and their successors, to and for the actual occupation of the said corporation, any lands, tenements, and hereditaments, and real and immovable property and estate situate, lying and being within the City of Toronto, and the same to sell, alienate and dispose of whensoever the said Corporation may deem it proper so to do; and by the same name shall and may be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, in any manner whatsoever; and the Constitution, Rules, and Regulations now in force, touching the admission and expulsion of members, and the management and conduct generally of the affairs and concerns of the said Association in so far as they may not be inconsistent with the laws of

this Province shall be the Constitution, Rules, and Regulations of the said Corporation; Provided always, that the said Corporation may from time to time alter, repeal, and change such Constitution, Rules, and Regulations in the manner provided by the Constitution, Rules and Regulations of the said Corporation.

Proviso: as to present By-laws, etc.

2. All the property and effects now owned by or held in trust for the said Association are hereby vested in the said Corporation, and shall be applied solely to the maintenance of the said Corporation.

Property vested in corporation

3. No member of the Corporation shall be liable for any of the debts thereof beyond a sum which shall be equal to the amount of the original entrance fee and the annual subscriptions which may remain unpaid by such member; and any member of the Club not being in arrear may retire therefrom, and shall cease to be such member, on giving notice to that effect in such form as may be required by the By-laws thereof, and thereafter shall be wholly free from liability for any debt or engagement of the Club.

Liability of members limited

4. It shall be lawful for the said Corporation to issue stock, to such extent as

they may deem necessary, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of forty thousand dollars, in shares of one hundred dollars each; such stock to be subscribed for in a book to be opened for that purpose by the Committee of the said Club and to be paid up in such manner and within such delay as may be determined by the said Committee.

Application of

5. The funds arising from such stock shall be applied exclusively to the erection of a Club House and dependencies, and to furnishing the same.

Transfer of
Stock

6. The shares of such stock shall be assignable by delivery and surrender of the certificates to be issued to the holders of such shares respectively and by assignment on the books of the Corporation.

Rights of
shareholders

7. Each holder of such stock duly paid up shall be a proprietor of an undivided share of the real estate of the Corporation and of the buildings therein to be erected, and shall be exempt from all liability beyond the extent of the stock he shall actually hold.

Paying off
Stock

8. It shall be competent to the said Corporation to pay off so much of the

said stock from time to time as the said Committee may deem desirable; the share or shares so to be paid off to be selected by the said Committee by ballot.

9. Such payment may be made by de-^{Mode of}positing, in any of the chartered Banks ^{Payment} in the City of Toronto, to the credit of the holder or holders of such share or shares, the amount of such share or shares and of all dividends unpaid thereon, and thereupon such share or shares shall, *ipso facto*, cease to exist.

10. This Act shall be deemed a Public ~~Public~~ Act Act.

CHAPTER LXVII

An Act respecting the Toronto Club.
(Assented to 7th March, 1878.)

Preamble

WHEREAS the Toronto Club have presented their petition praying for an amendment to their Act of Incorporation, and whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition:

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:

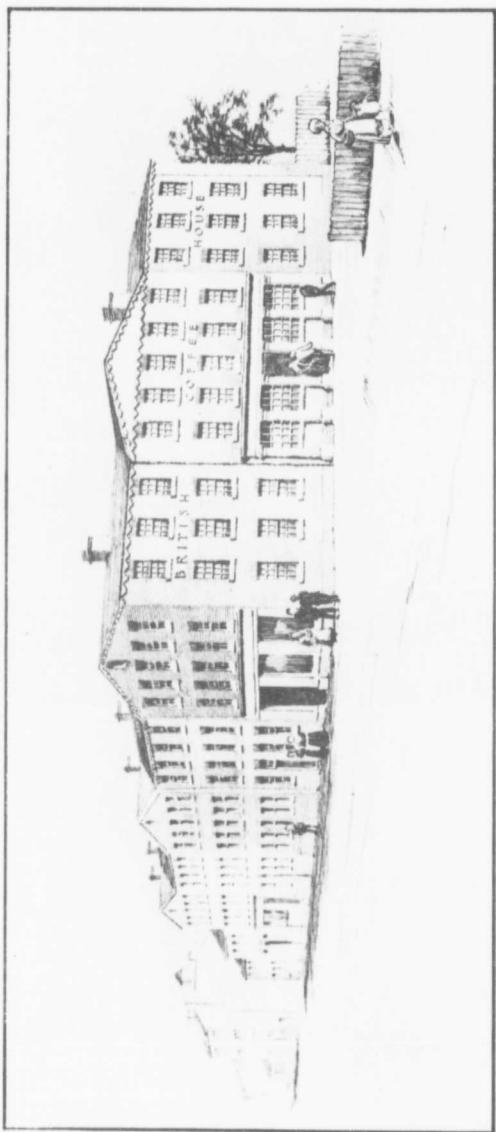
Power to borrow money

1. It shall be lawful for the Toronto Club to borrow money upon the credit of the Club and to hypothecate, pledge or mortgage the real or personal property of the club to secure any sum or sums of money so borrowed at such rate of interest and on such terms as may from time to time be agreed upon.

Power bills and notes

2. The Club shall have power to draw, make, accept and endorse all bills of exchange, and promissory notes necessary for the purposes of the Club under the

hands of their President and Secretary after authority from the Committee of the Club so to do, and in no case shall it be necessary that the seal of the Club be affixed to any such bill or note, nor shall the President or Secretary be individually responsible therefor: Provided that nothing herein shall be construed to authorize the Club to issue notes or bills of exchange payable to bearer or intended to be circulated as money or as notes or bills of a bank.



In this building and in the Rossin House, erected on the same site, the Toronto Club (with trifling interruptions noted in the historical sketch) occupied rooms from 1842 to 1864.

Rules of The Toronto Club

I—All former rules are hereby repealed.

II—Politics and religious questions of every kind are absolutely excluded from open discussion in the Club.

III—MEMBERS.

No one shall be admitted as a member of the Club who has not attained the age of twenty-one years.

LIFE MEMBERS.

(1) Ordinary and Non-resident Members of the Club may be elected as Life Members by a unanimous vote of the Committee at a meeting called for the purpose, either for great services to the Club or upon the payment of a sum to be fixed by the Committee in each case, provided that before election the name of the member and a statement of the services rendered

or of the amount of the payment so fixed shall be posted in the Club by the Secretary for two weeks, but if before the expiration of that time three Ordinary Members or Non-resident Members inform the Secretary in writing that they desire the approval of a general meeting, such election shall be stayed until approved of by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at such meeting. All Life Members heretofore and hereafter elected shall be exempt from further subscriptions or assessments but shall remain subject in all respects to the provisions of Rule VI., except that no portion of the amount paid to become a Life Member shall be returned.

ORDINARY MEMBERS.

(2) Ordinary Members are members residing in the City of Toronto, or within ten miles thereof, who have been duly elected as such, and have paid the entrance fee prescribed by the rules, and are not in default with respect to their annual subscriptions or dues to the Club. The number of Ordinary Members of the Club is limited to four hundred and twenty-five.

NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS.

(3) Non-resident Members are members residing more than ten miles from the City of Toronto, who have been duly elected and have paid the entrance fee prescribed by the rules, and are not in default as mentioned in the rule immediately preceding.

SUPERNUMERARY MEMBERS.

(4) An Ordinary or a Non-resident Member who may be absent from Canada during the whole period for which the annual subscription is payable, may be considered a Supernumerary Member; and pay an annual subscription of ten dollars during the continuance of such absence, but any member availing himself of this indulgence must previously notify the same by letter, to the Secretary who shall insert his name in the book of Supernumerary Members, and such Member before again using the privileges of the Club shall within one month after his return to Canada give notice in writing to the Secretary of his return, and shall pay his subscription, or the portion thereof, for the current

year, as provided in the case of new Members in Rule VIII, or if he elect to do so, may pay seven dollars per calendar month, not necessarily consecutive, during the time he may reside in Canada in any year, and failing such notification and payment, such member shall be considered as having withdrawn from the Club.

HONORARY MEMBERS.

(5) The Committee may elect as an Honorary Life Member of the Club the Governor-General of Canada, and also any person who has filled that office. All such Honorary Life Members shall be free from payment of fees and assessments and shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Club, except that of voting.

(6) The Committee may also elect as an Honorary Member the Officer commanding the forces in Canada, the Officer in command of the North American fleet, and any distinguished Officer of His Majesty's Service while serving in Canada, such membership to continue so long as the officer holds the command or continues in service in Canada, and shall entitle the Member to all the privileges of the Club, except

that of voting, without payment of any fees or assessments.

TEMPORARY MEMBERS.

(7) The Committee may admit to the privileges of the Club for such periods as it may from time to time think fit any stranger of distinguished rank or position visiting Toronto. And the Committee may also admit to such privileges for a period not exceeding one year strangers temporarily resident in Ontario, upon payment of a subscription of ten dollars per month.

(a) Ordinary Members of the St. James's Club, Montreal; the Rideau Club, Ottawa; the Halifax Club, Halifax; the City Club, St. John's, Newfoundland; the Manitoba Club, Winnipeg; the Vancouver Club, Vancouver; and in the discretion of the Committee, of any other Club; and the officers of His Majesty's Forces stationed in or visiting Canada or on duty in the Dominion, and the officers of the permanent forces of the Dominion of Canada, although residents of Ontario, but not residing in Toronto or within ten miles thereof, may on the intro-

duction of an Ordinary or a Non-Resident Member be admitted to the privileges of the Club for two weeks, and such privilege may be extended for one month longer on payment of ten dollars; such privilege not to be repeated within six months.

(b) Subject to the regulations prescribed by the Committee, any Member may introduce non-residents of Ontario to the privileges of the Club for two weeks, not necessarily consecutive, by entering their names in the Visitors' Book, but no introduction of the same person shall be made for more than two weeks within six months. Persons introduced under this Rule may not introduce or entertain any guests who are not Members of the Club.

(c) The Member introducing a friend to the privileges of the Club shall be answerable for any debt he may incur to the Club, and for any damage done by him to the Club property.

MILITARY MEMBERS.

(8) The Committee may admit to the privileges of the Club officers of His Majesty's

Forces stationed in or visiting Canada, or on duty in the Dominion, and the officers of the Permanent Forces of the Dominion of Canada, if stationed in Toronto, on payment of the annual subscription in advance without entrance fee. If stationed at a distance of not less than one hundred miles from Toronto, on payment annually in advance of the sum of twenty dollars, without entrance fee. Such officers when stationed in Toronto may also be admitted to the privileges of the Club without entrance fee on payment in advance of ten dollars per month. The name of any person admitted under this Rule, with the name of his proposer, shall be entered in the Visitors' Book.

IV—ELECTION OF MEMBERS.

(1) The name of every candidate for admission to membership shall, before nomination, be submitted by an Ordinary or a Non-resident Member to the Committee, accompanied by a letter addressed to the Secretary, declaring the fitness of the proposed candidate, and unless approved by two-thirds of the Members of the Committee present at a meeting called for the

purpose, such candidate shall not be eligible for nomination.

(2) Every nomination of a candidate shall be entered in a book kept for the purpose, and such nomination shall be signed by two Ordinary or Non-Resident Members, as proposer and seconder, neither of whom shall be a member of the Committee, and shall state the candidate's usual residence, rank, profession, or occupation. The Secretary shall forthwith post such nomination on the notice board, and after the expiration of two weeks thereafter such candidate shall be balloted for by Members entitled to vote, on any Monday between the hours of 9 o'clock a.m. and 6 o'clock p.m. The Secretary and one member of the Committee, or two members of the Committee, shall, after the time for voting has expired, open the ballot box and declare the result, provided always that at least forty qualified Members shall vote, in order to constitute a valid ballot, and that at least forty votes shall be cast in favor of a candidate in order that he may be elected, and that one negative ballot in every ten ballots shall prevent a candidate from

being elected. No person who has been so rejected shall be eligible for election within twelve months.

(3) The Secretary shall report the election of every new member to the Committee at the next meeting after his election.

(4) The Secretary shall furnish each candidate elected with a copy of the Rules and a memorandum of the amount payable for entrance fee and subscription, and until the same is paid such candidate shall not be deemed to be a member of the Club, or entitled to any of the privileges thereof. If any person heretofore or hereafter elected fails to pay his entrance fee and subscription within four weeks after notification, the election may be declared void by the Committee.

V—RESIGNATION OF MEMBERS.

Any Member whose subscription and debts to the Club are paid, but not otherwise, shall be at liberty to resign his membership on his written application to the Committee, and any Member who shall so resign shall cease to be a member

of the Club, and shall forfeit *ipso facto* all right or claim to its property or funds.

VI—EXPULSION OF MEMBERS.

Any member wilfully infringing the Rules of the Club, or being guilty of conduct in or out of the Club, which, in the opinion of the Committee, who may of their own motion take immediate cognizance of the same, or which in the opinion of any ten Members who shall certify the same in writing to the Committee, is detrimental to the character or interests of the Club, or is unbecoming a gentleman, shall be liable to suspension from all the privileges of the Club, on a vote of two-thirds of the Committee present when the question of the Member's conduct shall be investigated, and notice of such suspension shall at once be given by the Secretary by post to such Member's last known address. Such Member shall have the right of appeal by giving notice in writing within seven days after notification of his suspension, addressed to the Secretary of the Club, posted and registered, and such appeal shall be to a meeting of the Club, to be called by the Committee and to be held within

one month of such suspension, of which meeting at least seven days' notice must be given on the notice board, and also by post to the suspended Member at his last known address, and if such suspension is sustained by a majority of Members at the Special General Meeting so called, or if the Member suspended fails to notify the Secretary of his intention to appeal, he shall be considered to be expelled and shall cease to be a member and shall forfeit all privileges of the Club, including his entrance fee, but his subscription for the current year shall be returned to him *pro tanto*, and he shall be forever after ineligible for membership or to be introduced as a visitor in any way whatever.

VII

(1) Any Member may, subject to house rules and regulations made by the Committee, at his own expense invite guests to breakfast, lunch, dinner, tea or supper, by entering their names in the visitors' book. No person (other than a Member coming within one of the classes specified in Rule III) shall be invited into the Club

except to breakfast, lunch, dinner, tea, or supper.

(2) The Committee may extend to the guests of Members the privileges of the Private Card and Billiard Rooms, during the afternoon, such guests having lunched at the Club, and, subject to such regulations as the Committee may from time to time adopt, guests of Members shall have the privileges of the Club after seven o'clock in the evening, provided they have dined at the Club, but such privileges shall only be enjoyed while the Member introducing such guests is present with them.

(3) The names of persons introduced to the privileges of the Club under Rule III, with the duration of their privilege, shall be posted on the notice board.

(4) No person under the age of eighteen years shall be invited into the Club as a guest.

VIII

(1) Ordinary and Non-resident Members residing within fifteen hundred miles of Toronto shall pay an entrance fee of two hundred dol-

lars, and Non-resident Members residing fifteen hundred miles or more from Toronto shall pay an entrance fee of one hundred dollars. Resident and Non-resident Members shall pay an annual subscription as follows: If residing in Toronto or within ten miles thereof, seventy-five dollars; if residing more than ten and less than one hundred miles from Toronto, thirty dollars; and if residing more than one hundred miles from Toronto, an annual subscription of twenty dollars. All annual subscriptions shall be due and payable on the first day of December in each year, but Members who are required by the Rules to pay an annual subscription of seventy-five dollars, or thirty dollars, or twenty dollars, as the case may be, shall, if elected on or after the first day of February in any year, pay a subscription at the rate of seven dollars, two dollars and fifty cents, or two dollars per month, respectively, for the current year ending on the first of December following, and every Member failing to pay his annual subscription for one month after it becomes due, shall pay an additional sum by way of fine of two dollars for each month or portion thereof during which he

is in default. The name of every Member failing to pay his annual subscription before the first day of January shall be posted by the Secretary in the Club, and if the subscription, with all fines, be not paid within five months after the subscription shall have become due, he shall then cease to be a Member of the Club and to have any right or claim to its property, but he may, upon application within a reasonable time to the Committee, be reinstated by the Committee, if in its opinion it is deemed expedient to do so, and upon such terms as the Committee shall determine.

(2) The Committee shall adopt such rules and regulations for the payment by Members of all bills and accounts for dues or expenses incurred as they shall deem advisable in the interest of the Club from time to time; and the name of any Member failing to pay all I.O.U. debts and other obligations to the Club, for one month after the same are due, shall be posted in the Club. All credit shall be stopped to any Member while posted. If any I.O.U., debt, or other obligation to the Club of any Member be not paid within

five months after the same shall have become due, such Member shall then cease to be a member of the Club and to have any right or claim to its property, but he may, upon application to the Committee within a reasonable time, be re-instated by the Committee if in its opinion it is deemed expedient, and upon such terms as the Committee shall determine.

(3) If a Non-resident Member becomes a resident he shall pay the usual annual subscription of a resident Member or the portion thereof for the current year. A residence for three consecutive months in Toronto or within ten miles thereof shall constitute such Member a resident Member. If a Non-resident Member residing fifteen hundred miles or more from Toronto comes to reside in Toronto or within fifteen hundred miles thereof, he shall pay a further entrance fee of one hundred dollars. Upon failure to comply with the requirements of this Rule and the decision of the Committee upon the case, those provisions of this Rule applicable to Members in default shall apply.

(4) It shall be the duty of the Secretary to

notify all Members whose debts or obligations to the Club have remained unpaid for one month and no Member shall be allowed to exercise any of the privileges of membership in the Club until such debt or obligation is satisfied. All entrance, annual and other fees and all I.O.U. debts and other obligations shall be paid by cheque, payable to the order of "Toronto Club."

IX—GENERAL MEETINGS.

(1) The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held on the second Thursday in January in each year for the transaction of general business, the election of Members to fill the places of the retiring Members of the Committee and the appointment of an Auditor for the current year; and at such meeting the Committee shall present an audited report, together with a detailed statement of the accounts, assets and liabilities of the Club for the past year, and an estimate of the receipts and disbursements for the current year.

(2) A Special General Meeting of the Club may be called at any time, by direction of the

Committee, and such a meeting shall be called on a requisition to the Chairman of the Committee, signed by not less than ten Members. At least seven days' notice of the day and hour of such meeting, stating the object of the meeting, shall be sent to each Member by mail and posted on the notice board of the Club.

(3) The Chairman of the Committee shall take the chair at all meetings; in his absence the Members present at any such meeting shall elect a Chairman from the Committee.

(4) Notices of motion to be brought before all general meetings shall be handed to the Secretary and posted by him at least seven days before the day of the meeting, and no subjects shall be discussed thereat except those of which notice has been given, and no repeal, alteration or amendment of a Rule shall be adopted without such notice, nor without the consent of two-thirds of the Members present at such meeting.

(5) Twenty Members shall constitute a quorum at any General Meeting of the Club.

X—COMMITTEE.

(1) The Committee shall consist of nine Mem-

bers, four of whom shall constitute a quorum. The Committee shall elect a Chairman from their own number at their first meeting in each year. Three of the Committee, whose names are to be selected by the Committee according to their seniority as Members of the Committee, shall retire at the end of each year, and except in the case of a Chairman, shall be ineligible for election for a year. Each year at the annual meeting three Members of the Club shall be elected as Members of the Committee for three years. Any vacancy on the Committee occurring during the year shall be filled by the Committee at a meeting of the Committee called for the purpose, of which three clear days' notice shall be given, and the Member so appointed shall, so far as regards retirement from the Committee, be deemed to be of the same seniority as the Member whose place he has filled. The names of the three retiring Members shall be posted by the Secretary fourteen days before the annual meeting, and any two Members may nominate a Member or Members to be proposed in the place of the retiring Members, and such nomination or nominations shall be handed to

the Secretary and posted by him seven days before the day of such meeting. In case no nomination, or an insufficient number has been received, the meeting shall elect the required number. In case at any time more than three members of the Committee express in writing to the Secretary their desire to resign from the Committee, or in case for any reason more than three vacancies on the Committee occur at one time, the Committee shall immediately call a Special General Meeting of the Club for the purpose of dealing with such resignations and filling by election any vacancies thereby created on the Committee or for the purpose of filling by election the vacancies on the Committee as the case may be.

(2) The Committee shall meet weekly, or at the call of the Chairman, for the passing of accounts, the transaction of current business and the taking cognizance of any infraction of the Rules and Regulations.

(3) The Committee shall appoint all Sub-Committees and define their duties and powers, and, subject to the provisions of the general

Rules, shall make regulations for the internal management of the Club.

(4) The Committee shall appoint a Secretary, a Solicitor and a Banker, and may appoint and employ such other officers, servants and agents as may be required for the proper working of the Club, and it shall have all the powers of the Club, except the power to rescind or alter any Rules, Resolutions or By-Laws adopted by the Club, the power to expel Members, save as otherwise provided by the Rules, and the powers to raise money by way of loan on mortgages or debentures, or to sell any realty belonging to the Club.

(5) The Committee shall have power to levy an assessment of not more than \$10 in any year, subject to the approval of two-thirds of those present at an annual or a special general meeting called for the purpose of considering the same; and any Members making default in payment of such assessment so ordered, shall be deprived of the use and privileges of the Club, as for non-payment of subscriptions, as set forth in Rule VIII.

(6) Should any Member of the Committee be absent from six consecutive meetings of that body without an excuse satisfactory to the other Members, he shall cease to hold office, and his place shall be filled in the manner relating to vacancies provided by Rule X.

X(a)—PRESIDENT

At any Annual Meeting of the Club or at any General Meeting specially called for the purpose, the Meeting may elect a member of the Club to be President for the ensuing or the current year as the case may be. Such President shall be *ex officio* a member of the Committee in addition to the nine members provided for by Rule X, but shall not be expected to devote his attention to the details of the management of the Club. In the event of any member so elected being at the time a member of the Committee, his election to the office of President shall create a vacancy upon the Committee which shall be filled by the General Meeting of the Club electing him or filled at a meeting of the Committee.

XI—GENERAL RULES.

(1) The Club shall be open every day for the reception of Members at 8 o'clock a.m., and shall be closed and the lights extinguished at 1 a.m., except on Saturdays and Sundays, when the hour of closing shall be midnight; and no Member shall be admitted into or remain in the Club after these hours on any pretence whatever, unless specially authorized by the Committee.

(2) The Committee shall make regulations prescribing the conditions on which billiards, whist and other games may be played in the Club, and any Member committing a breach of such regulations shall be liable to expulsion under Rule VI.

(3) Any cause of complaint that may arise is to be written in the Complaint Book and signed by the Member complaining, or the complaint may be made by letter to the Secretary under the signature of the Member, and any complaint so made must be laid, by the Secretary, before the Committee at their next meeting.

(4) Any notice duly posted on the notice

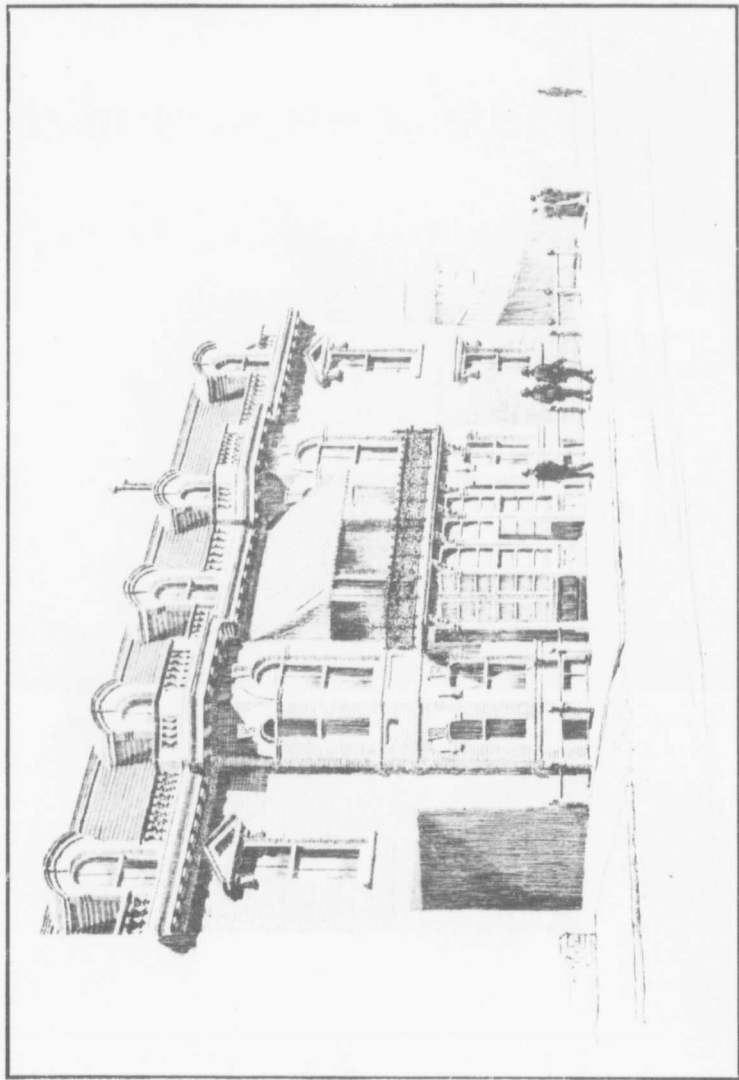
board shall be deemed a sufficient notice to all Members of the Club, unless otherwise ordered by the Committee or required by the Rules.

XII—SECRETARY.

The Secretary shall keep correct minutes of the proceedings of the Club, and of the Committees and sub-Committees thereof, and all necessary books of account. He shall deposit all monies and cheques to the credit of the Club in the bank appointed by the Committee, and shall have authority to endorse all cheques payable to the Club for the purpose only of depositing them in the said bank to the credit of the Club; shall discharge all duties assigned to him by the Committee; shall be paid such salary as the Committee may decide, and shall hold office during pleasure.

XIII—AUDITOR.

The Auditor shall examine and audit the books and accounts of the Club from month to month, and shall report thereon monthly to the Committee, and when required.

House Rules of The Toronto Club

Adopted, October, 1915.

NOTE:—*These Rules are subject to modification by the Committee from time to time as occasion may require.*

STRANGERS' ROOM.

This is for the use of visitors calling upon Members, or introduced by them.

DINING ROOM.

The Dining Room is open for lunch at 12.30 and dinner at 6.30.

On notice being given, this room may be reserved by Members for private dinners, with a minimum number of 40 guests. The charge for reserving this room is four dollars.

Smoking is permitted at all times.

PRIVATE DINING ROOM.

Breakfast is served in the Private Dining Room, which is open at 8 o'clock a.m.

On notice being given this room may be reserved by Members for private dinners. The charge for reserving this room is four dollars.

Smoking is not allowed at lunch until 2 p.m.

PRIVATE CARD ROOM.

This room may be reserved by Members any afternoon or evening for themselves and their guests, who have either lunched or dined at the Club, the charge for reserving this room is \$1.50.

SILENCE ROOM.

Talking is strictly prohibited.

No Newspapers, Periodicals, Books or other articles appropriated to this room shall be removed therefrom.

BILLIARD ROOM.

No more than one game of Snooker Pool or two games of Pyramids in succession may be played by the same players, nor may the table be occupied by them, or by Members playing

Billiards, more than 45 minutes, if any Member is waiting and ready to play. A Pool, Black Pool, Pyramid Pool or Snooker Pool of not less than four may be interposed at the end of any game.

Any Member injuring the cloth will be charged with the cost of repairing same.

All games on the Billiard Tables will be charged for in accordance with the schedule of prices posted in the Billiard Room.

BEDROOMS.

There are in all seven rooms available, of which three will be held exclusively for Non-resident Members. Resident Members may occupy a room for two weeks, but after that period will be required to vacate immediately upon notice from the Secretary. Non-resident Members requiring accommodation should write or telegraph in advance.

If under special circumstances the Committee deem it necessary or advisable to obtain possession of any room, any Member occupying that room shall, on being so requested, immediately vacate such room.

All bedrooms ordered and not occupied shall be paid for. A member receiving notice before 10 p.m. that his bedroom is required must vacate same by 1 p.m. the following day.

A Member shall not take to his bedroom any newspaper or book the property of the Club.

The charge for Bedrooms including bath and services of a valet, can be had by applying to the hall porter or by letter addressed to the Secretary.

Under no circumstances will the Club be responsible for the loss of jewellery or valuables left in the bedrooms.

BATHROOM.

A Member can order a bath at any time during the day and have use of Dressing Room and services of Valet by notifying the hall porter. The charge is 50 cents.

GUESTS.

Guests introduced by Members for breakfast, lunch, tea, dinner or supper, may be taken into any part of the Club by the Members intro-

ducing them, but may not play billiards before six o'clock p.m.

LADIES' QUARTERS.

The Rules of the Club, and the House Rules and Regulations made by the Committee, shall, except as hereinafter varied, apply so far as applicable to the Ladies' Quarters.

Members shall have the privilege of nominating as Temporary Members ladies of their immediate families actually resident with them. A list of these shall be forwarded to the Secretary for purposes of record, with the understanding that all Temporary Members so nominated are authorized to sign on behalf of the introducing Member upon I.O.U.'s for any refreshment served on their order.

Such Temporary Members (Ladies) shall have the privilege of introducing as their guests, Ladies, but not Gentlemen, to Luncheon or Tea in the Ladies' Quarters, the names of all such guests to be entered in the Visitors' Book.

Members may introduce guests, including Ladies, to Luncheon, Tea, Dinner or Supper in

the Ladies' Quarters, the names of such guests to be entered in the Visitors' Book.

Gentlemen unaccompanied by Ladies shall not use the Ladies' Quarters except by permission of the Committee.

Members intending to invite guests (Ladies) to Dinner or Supper shall be required to notify the Steward before two o'clock for Dinner and before seven o'clock for Supper.

In the absence of such notice, the Dinner Menu of the day must be accepted, and Supper *cannot be guaranteed.*

COMPLAINTS.

A Complaint Book is provided for the use of Members dissatisfied in any particular with the service. Members are particularly requested to refrain from correcting servants publicly. Faulty service should be reported to the Secretary or Steward, or entered in the Complaint Book.

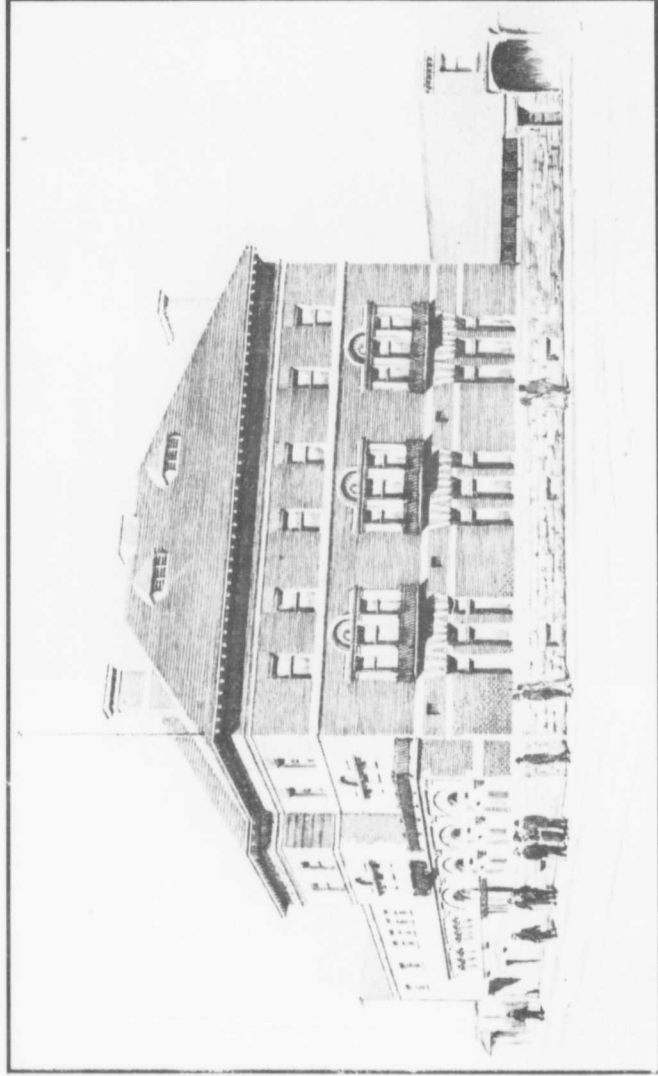

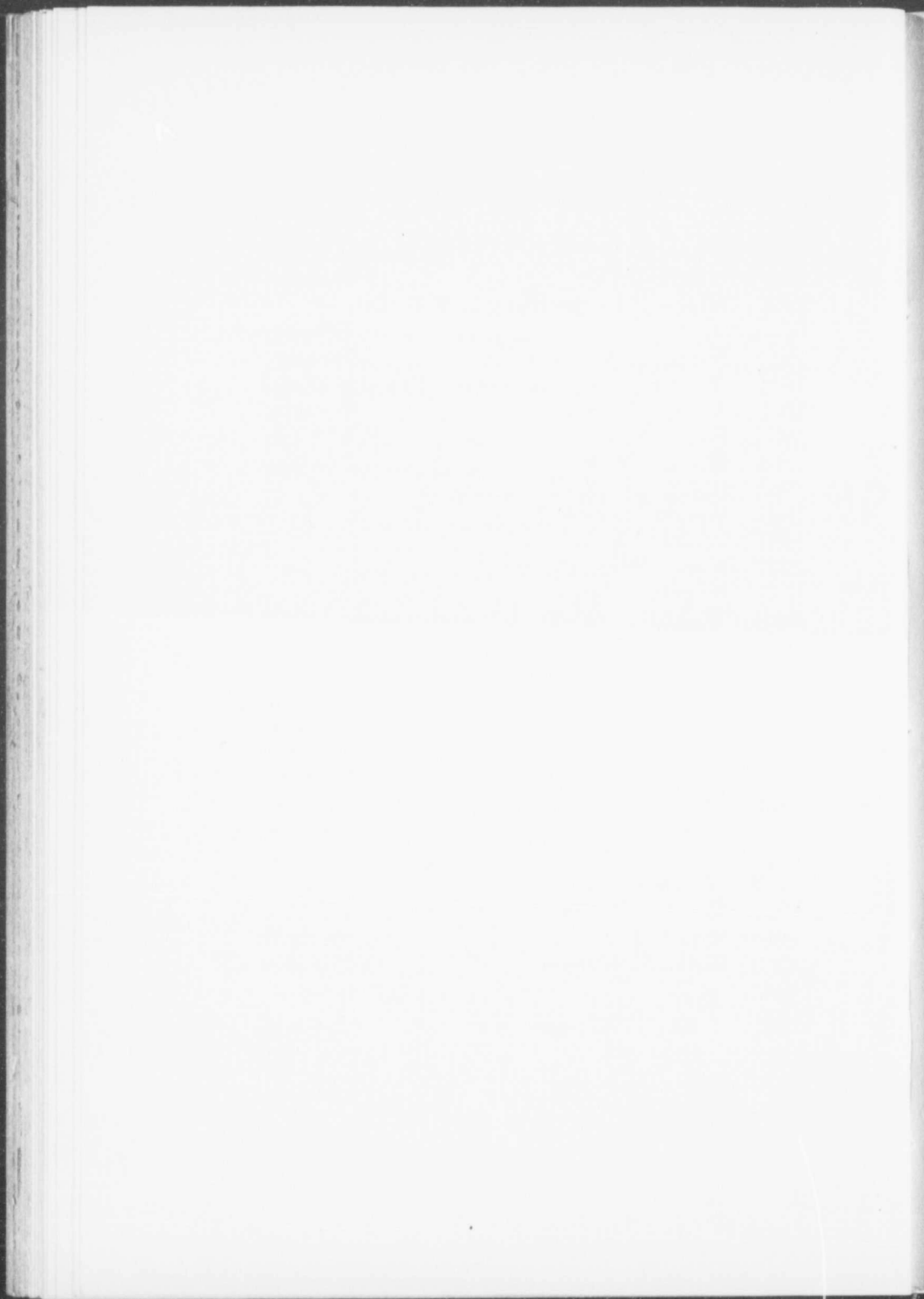
