

## NOTE.

## THE AIMS OF THE ST. JOHN ART CLUB ARE ESSENTIALLY AS OUTLINED BELOW:

The Nova Scotia Museum of Fine Arts was incorporated by Act of Parliament in 1908 for the encouragement of Fine Art in this province, by the collecting of pictures and other works of art for purposes of exhibition; to hold exhibitions of pictures; to accept loans, gifts and endowments, and by any appropriate means give the public opportunities of seeing good Art, and of cultivating an interest in the art of this country and of other countries.

Its aim is the erection of a suitable building where works of art purchased by public subscription, or endowed, will be shown to advantage. All interested persons are invited to become members. An annual fee of \$2.00 entitles one to membership with all the privileges of exhibitions, lectures, and other activities of the Museum.

The VICTORIA SCHOOL OF ART AND DESIGN is the centre of Art Education of the province. It provides thorough, practical, instruction in Drawing, Painting and Design. It offers interesting and useful courses to craftsmen in any trade or profession; teachers; and students who wish to follow the study of Fine and Applied Art. The Principal will be glad to give further information, and invites all the visitors to the exhibition to visit the school, which is in the same building.
