ARRIVAL OF THE "CANADA."

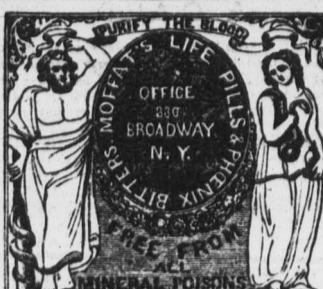
