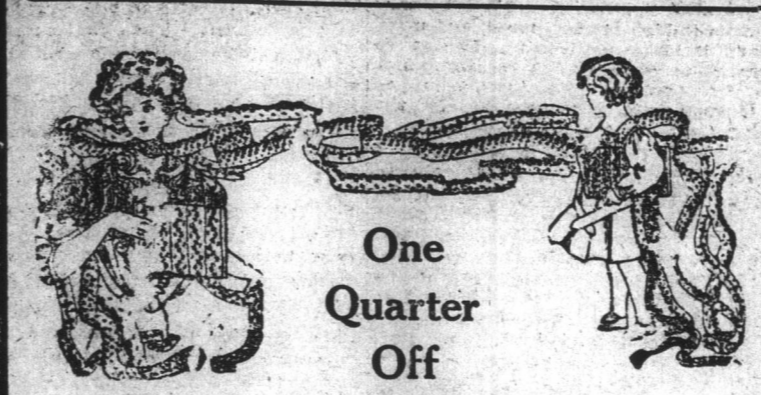
According to British Board of Trade returns, the net emigration from the United Kingdom to countries outside of Europe was as follows during the years 1908 and 1909:

Expedition, However, is Delayed by Arrest of Leader in Seattle. Seattle, May 4.—Well formulated plans for an expedition into the wilds of Southern Peru were knocked away on Friday by the arrest, on charges of larceny, of H. J. Thompson, captain and leader of a band of adventurers who were fitting up the schooner Yida at West Seattle for a journey by Callao, thence through the stretch of sand dunes that adorn the Peruvian coast for sixty miles inland, thence to penetrate to rocky fastnesses beyond. Search for gold and the operation of an industrial colony of miners on a co-operative basis was the object of the treasure hunters.

Theatrical Syndicate Batten from the Northwest by "Open Door." Seattle, May 4.—A special to the Post-Intelligencer from New York this morning says: The Messrs. Shubert & Co. have entered into a business arrangement with John Cort, who controls all the theatres in the north west of the Pacific Coast, numbering more than thirty, whereby John Cort has adopted the policy of the "open door," the one for which the syndicate have been fighting for more than a year. This policy has been adopted by Julius Cohn and his circuit of 200 theatres throughout New England, and M. Ries and his circuit of 100 theatres in Pennsylvania, Ohio, Maryland and New Jersey. FOUGHT INDIANS IN THE ANCIENT DAYS

A British Columbia Pioneer Prospector and Miner Tells of the Conditions As They Were.

(Vancouver, Province.) There is no more picturesque figure in British Columbia today than Edward Stout, better known as "Need" or "Daddy" Stout, pioneer prospector and miner. For upwards of half a century he has breathed the invigorating air of this coast province and his career has been a remarkable one. In a quaint little cottage just back of the station house in North Bend he is a willing away the autumnal days of his life and his only joy is in his home or in reciting the thrilling incidents he encountered when, with others of his class, he braved trails through the forests so that he might penetrate the fastnesses of the great interior...

NO EXERCISE AFTER WORK

London Physician Says Office Workers Are Better Without Exercise

London, May 4.—A distinguished London physician, Dr. Alexander Bryce, has started a discussion by asserting that office workers should not take exercise after their day's work. He says: "The root reason is that, though head work is not exercise in the sense that it develops the body, it most definitely is exercise in that it quickly induces 'fat' and physical lassitude. So it is almost pathetic for a man to expect any good to come from taking more exercise when the exercise involved in the day's work has already tired him out. "One takes it that young people have had sufficient outdoor exercise to reasonably develop their frames before beginning office work. So when once they have started in the office in earnest it is much better for them to realize at once that their days of physical strain are over and 'done with' and that henceforth they must confine these efforts to week-ends and holidays. They can follow this advice calmly enough, for it does not mean at all that they are going to deteriorate suddenly into wrecks. "The body and system easily adjust themselves to circumstances, even to overcivilized and consequently rather unnatural circumstances, and indoor head workers will soon find that a very decent state of health can be maintained with little or no apparent exercise. "For all people living under the undoubted inconvenience of earning a livelihood a most excellent rule of thumb in regard to this much misunderstood question of work and exercise is the following: Never try to mix the two, and stop exercising at once if you do not find that it gives you real enjoyment. "And I need only add," he concluded, "that the rational way home after a day's work in the office is by train, tram or omnibus, not walking, and that the proper time for real exercise is when no thought of work need intervene for at least forty-eight hours after the exercise has stopped. SPAIN MAY FACE CRISIS

Republican Party Conducts Violent Campaign Against the Throne.

London, May 3.—The Times draws attention to the unsatisfactory political conditions prevailing in Spain and Portugal. To all outward seeming matters in both kingdoms are fairly tranquil. A general election is pending in Spain. The discussion was under consideration by the cabinet early last week. It will reveal something in the direction in which the public mind is working. The recent banquet in Barcelona showed how far the school of Spanish Republicans is ready to go. Some of the speeches made on that occasion were downright treason by the law of all civilized states. Senor Lerroux, the most fiery of the orators on that occasion, has been making a political tour. He has visited many of the large cities, and even country districts. The tone of his rhetoric is supposed to show that everywhere he found the masses ripe for mischief. But the Government has not apparently taken any steps against him. Its inaction might be more easily ascribed to fear were it not for the decision shown in bringing Ferrer to punishment. MAY CLOSE PLATFORM FROM THE PUBLIC

Some Effort Being Made to Prevent the Crowding at the C. P. R. Station Platform.

Owing to the heavy increase in business at the local passenger station, Depot Master Burleigh said yesterday afternoon that he will try to make arrangements to prevent crowding on the platform when trains arrive and depart, although he does not know yet just how he will do it. "I know that friends like to gather at the train to see their acquaintances as they come in or go out, but the traveling public must be considered," he said. "It is not fair that a man who happens to be late in purchasing a ticket should miss a train because he could not force his way through a crowd in time. This jamming on the platform is unpleasant to all around. In some of the larger cities people are excluded from the platform entirely."
