The government will, it is to be hoped, have the case tried again, and there is not much doubt that in such a case the presiding judge will admit Vankoughnet's confessions, one and all; and if he does, the jury will probably return a decisive verdict.

THE GLOBE ON CANADIAN INDEPENDENCE. "Canada in its present condition is suffering from no disability, political, commercial or social." This is a gem from an article in yesterday's Globe on Canadian independence, which that journal is beginning to dimly apprehend as a living question, and it fairly represents the drift of the whole article.

That the Globe has conceded to discuss the question of Canadian independence at all is a hopeful and significant sign; that it should adopt the tone it has is not surprising; but from beginning to end the writer proclaims his own inability to see anything but the plain, the obvious, and the therefore cavalierly dismisses it with a few shallow generalities.

Amid so much fact there is one solitary grain of argument, and that we may as well deal with at once. It is the old threadbare argument of the "prestige of the British name"—how much more it would do for us if we wanted to make a foreign treaty than we could do for ourselves.
