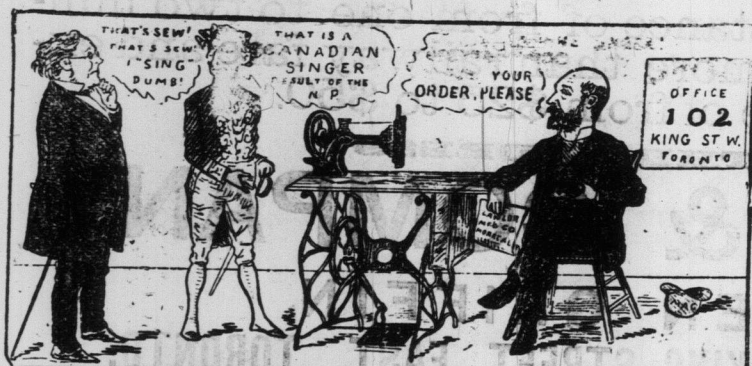

The inquest on the remains of Margaret Craig was held in French's hall, Yorkville, last night, Dr. Johnston presiding.

Dr. Philbrick made the post mortem examination in company with Dr. Armstrong. They found a large bump on the right side of the head.

William Craig, a son not old enough to be sworn, stated that his mother was ill for a week. She had no doctor.

Charles Craig, husband of deceased, testified that she had not drunk anything for ten or twelve weeks. She was never well after she had the salicylate.
