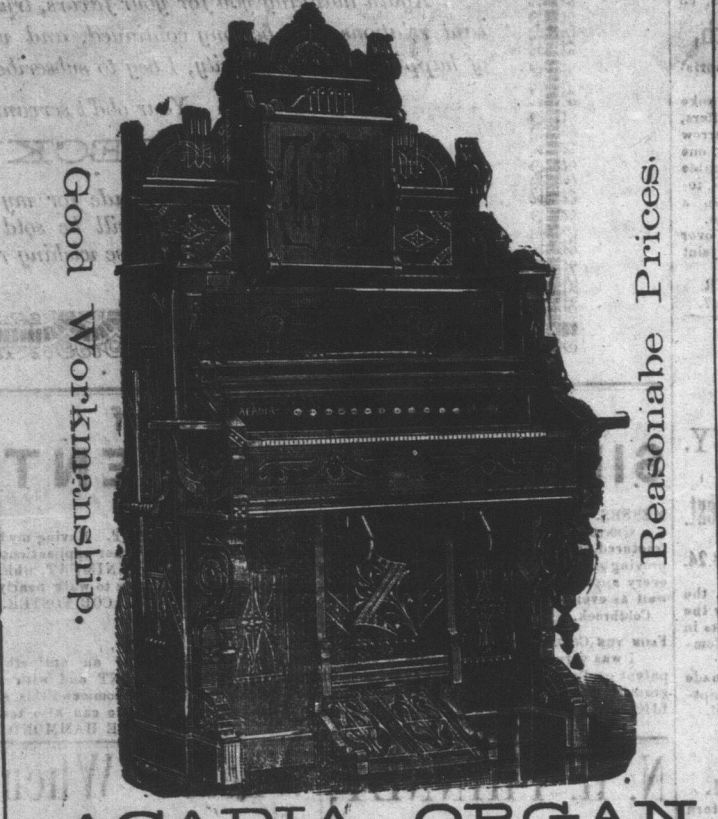

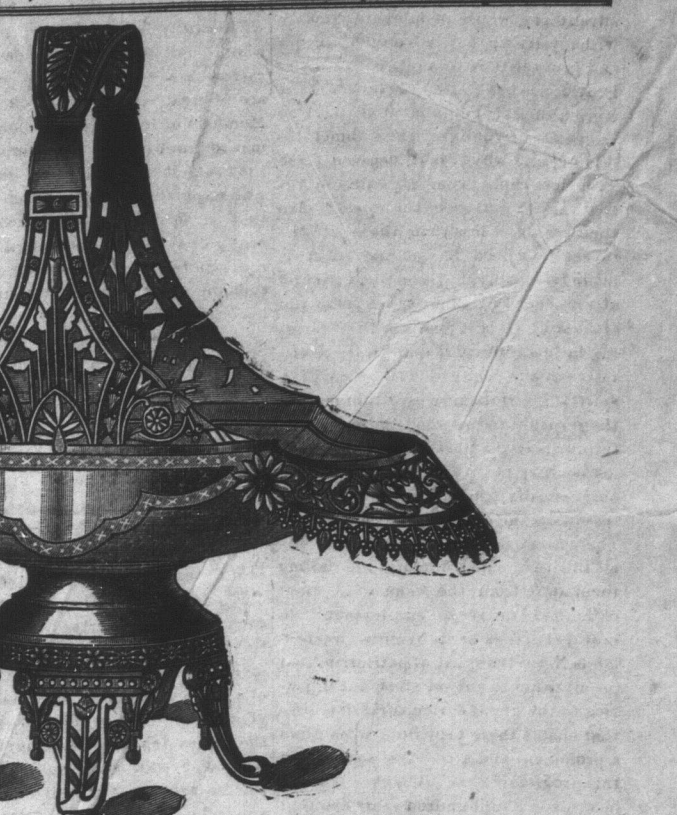

Agriculture, ever a subject of interest, does not lose any of its importance in being attached to this question. It is with feelings of pride and deep satisfaction I regard these Provinces so richly endowed by nature and climate advantages, whose people are replete with loyalty to our sovereign. Peace and prosperity within our borders, and Providence has blessed the laborer and the husbandman! Yet it is a truth that these Provinces cannot compete with the Agricultural countries of the world? Are they not to be the general rule is made? It is that the beauty and general attractions of our country are below the standard? Or is it possible that farming in this country is degenerating to the tastes of our young men and women? spirit of patriotism rises within me and these rushes to my mind those beautiful words of the poet, 'I love my own, my country best, and I never more emphatically, not these are not the reasons of the exodus to other lands. There must be something underlying all this that is instrumental in taking them away from the homes of their childhood to seek employment in crowded cities or in remote western lands. We have a noble heritage. Four hundred years ago God and nature pointed out to our forefathers these Maritime Provinces as the theatre of their destinies. They pointed out their numerous rivers as they rolled onward to the sea, bearing lasting tribute to him 'Who struck open their fountains and poured them out these river banks where wealth lays the foundation of cities and builds his noble manhood, and scenes here temple and religion her churches. It is the feelings of admiration all regard the swiftly flowing river as it tumbles over the steep, and stuns the country round with its noise, yet keeps it green and fresh with its ever shimmering dunes and whose estuary is of vast importance as it harbors ships which bring us rich products from every clime, and in return are laden with such rich and precious cargoes as ever country produce. And to-day do we stand in judgement and condemn the wisdom of our forefathers? If we were to impart a disinterested and impartial jury, one who had travelled our country, watched the tenacity and progress of its agricultural interest, the verdict would surely be that the Maritime Provinces do offer sufficient inducements to the sons and daughters of farmers to remain at home. We cannot understand the tendency on the part of some provincials to speak of our country as not being adapted to agriculture, and point to the far West. They speak of the great Northwest of our Dominion, and tell us that the soil is of the great central plain of the United States with its rolling prairies, of the beautiful sunny south. They tell of the land of the 'Sunset,' where California streams roll down their sands of gold. They speak of the large cities as places where our young men and women can get high wages with easy work, places where men have gone without capital and returned with it. They speak of the cities of the West, where they see Vanderbilt, Jay Gould, and other great financiers, when too late they have found out what a mistake they made in leaving the old farm. Now, this brings me more immediately to my subject. Does agriculture offer sufficient inducements to keep them at home? These Provinces situated on the Atlantic with numerous harbors, containing the winter ports of the Dominion, offer the unlimited advantages of direct communication with the most civilized European market.

Now look at the fertility of our soil. It is with just pride we point out to our mariners. Can they be surpassed? Does the virgin soil of western lands offer anything superior? Answer me who can I find there more fertile than that which has stood the test of years, nay, a hundred years, and to-day will produce three tons of hay per acre, and without a fertilizer? The famous marshes of Cumberland, the noted Trenton marshes and Grand Pre of historical fame will prove the truth of my assertion. Again I repeat it, and without fear of contradiction, that these Provinces contain thousands of acres of marsh that are fertile enough to be excellent. The best agricultural districts in Nova Scotia are Cumberland, Pictou and Colchester, the valleys of Cornwallis and Annapolis. In New Brunswick there is the noble County of Westmorland, the valleys of the St. John, Kennebec, and Miramichi are rich in soil and productive. Prince Edward Island is wholly adapted to agriculture. While I have only mentioned a part of the provinces, the rest is not by any means a barren field. It would permit me to point out numerous places in each County that would delight the heart of any farmer.
