

The special prizes offered by the Farmers' Institute were keenly competed for; there was a fine display of preserves and butter.

We have entered this month on our sixth year of publication, and would call attention to the many new advertisements.

The biggest pumpkin was shewn by H. W. Robinson. G. E. Akerman had a pair of extra fine citrons. The show of potatoes was unusually large and of fine quality, the honors being divided between Messrs. Ruckle, Mollet, E. Lee, G. E. Akerman, and A. Mcfennan.

Miss Mollet, Mrs. Ruckle, Mrs. A. Wilson, and Mrs. Ed. Lee took the prizes for butter. Mrs. J. J. Akerman was first for bread, Miss Mary Mouat (under 15) first for fruit cake.

Weather Report for September—Kuper Island: Slean temperature, 56.7; maximum, 78.8 (on 11th); minimum, 34.0 (on 30th); mean proportion of bright sunshine, .520; maximum, .017 (on 24th—highest recorded here); days completely clouded, 1; rainfall, 148.
