To prepare the wards for the greatest possible comfort and care of these unfortunate sufferers, a mortgage of \$15,000 rests upon the main building; we earnestly hope that our friends will exert themselves to remove it as soon as possible, and thus free this home of its last incumbrance, fulfilling the cherished hope of its early founders."

Fifth Resolution: Moved by Rev. Dr. Castle, seconded by Mr. R. Kilgour, "That this meeting renders cordial thanks to the medical staff, and to the clergymen of Parkdale, for their faithful attendance upon the inmates of the Home, to the lady managers who, in attending the weekly meetings through the year, have borne the chief care and responsibility of supervision; to Mrs. Craigie for her excellent and efficient domestic management; to Miss Grace Mowat, the head nurse, and the attendants in every department, for fidelity in the discharge of their respective duties."

FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

TORONTO HOME FOR INCURABLES,

ENDING MARCH 1st, 1888.

The Board of Management of Home for Incurables have pleasure in submitting their Fourteenth Annual Report to the patrons and friends of the Institution. We render thanks to our Heavenly Father for all the numerous blessings bestowed on us during the past year; we also gratefully acknowledge the continued favor and support of friends at home and abroad.

We, as a Board, feel like singing a special jubilee thanksgiving, now our new wing is completed, concerning the erection of which we were so solicitous a year ago. It was formally opened by Mrs. J. B. Robinson, and dedicated with appropriate religious services, to its benevolent design, January 12, 1888. The occasion brought together a large attendance of our most respected citizens, clergymen as well as laymen, showing the deep interest the public take in the prosperity of the "Home."

We had hoped the entire cost of erecting and furnishing the new wing for cancer and consumptive patients would have been fully met, so that we might commence free of debt, but this hope not being realized, we mortgaged the property for \$15,000, with privilege of paying one thousand dollars yearly. We trust God will incline friends, whose purses are consecrated, to help us ere long to remove this burden of indebtedness.

The object for which the "Home" was founded, has, we believe, been accomplished in a higher degree during the past year than in any former one in its history.

The very name, "Home for Incurables," indicates the class of persons whose sufferings it aims to mitigate.

There are at present 71 inmates, five having been admitted since the new west wing was added—13 have died during the year—3 left by their own wish—one sent to lunatic asylum.

The lack of accommodation in the past precluded us from receiving many sad cases, but now that our borders are enlarged, we can gladly admit almost a duplicate number of the helpless and suffering.

The new wing has been comfortably and suitably furnished as far as our means allowed. In this connection we cannot refrain from again recognizing with gratitude, the liberality of Mrs. A. C., after whom the cancer ward has been named, for her munificent contribution of \$7,500 for building, and \$1,200 for furnishing said cancer ward.

We have also to thank Mr. and Mrs. Gooch for entirely furnishing a room at their sole expense. We are likewise indebted to Mrs. John Kay for a handsome Brussels carpet for board room. We acknowledge also the generosity of Messrs. Fletcher & Yorke for gift of board room mantlepiece, and of Messrs. Darling & Currie for papering reception room; but there are so many kind donors who have given of their strength, time and money, in helping to furnish rooms, that it appears invidious to mention one more than another, in this, our general statement. So the management with full heart thank each kind friend, referring them to Treasurer's report of Furnishing Fund and donation list, for fuller particulars.

Two entertainments have been given, one at "Queen's Royal," Niagara, with sale of work, the other, a strawberry festival at the "Home," with a second sale of fancy articles.

The religious services of the "Home" have been kept up all through the year, and we cannot sufficiently thank the clergy of Parkdale for all their loving kindness in so regularly holding gospel services and visiting the sick inmates. The thanks of the Board are gratefully tendered to the St. Andrew's Society for the grant of \$250; to the Gaelic Society, the Sons of Scotland, and several other benevolent and literary institutions, which kindly gave most interesting entertainments, which were highly enjoyed and appreciated.

The Management are pleased again to recognize the services rendered by Mrs. Craigie for her untiring diligence in the interests of the

She is proving a valuable addition to our excellent nursing department. We desire to acknowledge the unvarying attention and kindness of Dr. MacKenzie to the patients during the year.

The Board gratefully acknowledge the liberal grants of the Ontario Governments and City Council; the valuable services of the Medical staff to their patients during the year; to their Solicitor, Mr. Mortimer Clark; to the editors of the daily papers; to Mr. Chapman for the liberal supply of ice.

In closing this report the Board expresses the earnest hope that now an increased expenditure is necessarily involved in maintaining the enlarged and ever growing family at the Home, that friends and well-wishers will respond with a liberality proportioned to the needs, remembering—"He that hath pity upon the poor, lendeth unto the Lord, and that which he hath given will He pay him again."

HOME RULES.

Visiting days, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, from 2 till 5.
I. No person shall be admitted to the Home for Incurables until the Board is satisfied as to their character and respectability.

II. The inmates must at all times show proper respect to the Manager and Lady Superintendent, and a strict regard for the rules and regulations of the Institution. They are also urged to cultivate kind and cheerful dispositions, thereby making a happy Christian Home.

III. Those inmates who are able will be required to keep their own rooms in order, and to assist in such other domestic duties as they are able to perform.

IV. All such inmates as are able to leave their rooms are required to take their meals at the general table, and for sanitary reasons no one will be allowed to carry food or drinks to their rooms; good manners and cleanly habits are particularly requested at table.

V. All who are able are expected to attend morning prayers, prayer meeting and Sunday services at the hours appointed.

VI. Inmates shall not leave the premises without the consent of the Lady Superintendent. Any inmate wishing to be absent for more than one day must obtain the consent of the Board.

VII. Male inmates shall not be allowed in the rooms occupied by females, nor female patients in those occupied by males, unless in special cases.

VIII. Inmates desiring to make a request or complaint shall inform the Lady Superintendent, who will thereupon bring the request or complaint before the Weekly Board.

IX. The inmates shall not receive wines or spirits or other stimulants without the knowledge of the Lady Superintendent.

X. The inmates may be visited by their friends on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays in each week, between the hours of two and five o'clock. No visits at any other time except in special cases.

XI. Should an inmate be at liberty to leave the Home, they brought to the attention of the

XII. If any inmate behaves rudely or in any other manner, the Weekly Committee shall be duly investigated.

XI. Should an inmate become dissatisfied or unhappy, he or she is at liberty to leave the Home, taking with them only such articles as they brought to the Home.

XII. If any inmate shall not conform to the rules of the Home or behave rudely or improperly, such inmate may be discharged by the Weekly Committee at their first meeting after the insubordination has been duly investigated.

THE FOURTEENTH ANNUAL MEDICAL REPORT.

MARCH 1ST, 1887, TO MARCH 16TH, 1888.

THE Medical Staff of the Toronto Home for Incurables, beg to present their fourteenth annual report :—

This year is certainly a red letter one in the annals of the Home, as it marks the completion of the building which is undoubtedly not only one of the most complete on this continent, but in the world. The Cancer Ward is an incalculable boon, enabling us to treat that dire disease with greater comfort to the unfortunate victim and those in attendance. The sanitary arrangements are of a most perfect character, and reflect the greatest credit on the designer.

The mortality is much higher than last year.

This must not be looked on as a misfortune, for it shows that many poor sufferers have ended their days in the greatest comfort possible to be procured. This is the great aim of kindred institutions in Great Britain, that the most skilled nursing, creature comforts and medical attendance have been provided for those suffering from incurable disease, moreover that our inmates do belong to that class of patients "*Incurables*," suffering from incurable disease, not simply aged and decrepid. We cannot urge too strongly the necessity of keeping this home strictly for that purpose, a home for sufferers from disease needing medical care and skilled nursing, not for those who are unable to work from old age or from some affliction which does not impair their general health, but simply prevents them pursuing their ordinary avocation. We must again tender most unqualified praise to Mrs. Craigie, our Matron, for her excellent management in every way, to Dr. MacKenzie for his steady good work and consistent attention and kindness to the patients; and to the nurses for the satisfactory manner in which their work has been performed.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

HOME FOR INCURABLES

Adopted and Amended 28th March, 1884.

I. This institution shall be known as "The Toronto Home for Incurables."

II. Its object shall be to afford maintenance, nursing, and medical and surgical aid to persons suffering from incurable disease, and to provide for them, while inmates of the "Home," the ministrations of the Gospel.

III. Every subscriber of two dollars and upwards per annum shall be entitled to vote at the annual meeting, at which a Board of Managers shall be elected for the ensuing twelve months. Every individual who shall pay in advance, and at one time, the sum of fifty dollars, shall be entitled to the same privileges for life.

IV. All money now in the possession of the "Home," or which may hereafter be collected or acquired by it, shall be applied (unless otherwise directed by the donor) to the general objects, uses and requirements of the "Home."

V. The affairs of the "Home" shall be under the direction, control and management of a Board of Managers, of whom at least forty shall be ladies, and twelve gentlemen, and who shall be elected at the annual general meeting of subscribers, qualified as set forth in Article III.

The medical staff attending the "Home" shall be *ex officio* members of the Board of Managers.

In case of a vacancy arising, the Board may elect a member to fill the vacancy until the next annual general meeting.

The Board shall control and direct all the business of the institution, and their decision upon all points of management shall be final.

There shall be a President and Vice-President, and the following officers: Treasurer, Secretary, Third Lady Director, and Superintendent.

For the more convenient management of the Home from time to time appointments may be made, such as an Assistant Treasurer, and Superintendent of the Home.

The Board may elect such other officers and employees as may be necessary for the various officers and employees.

The By-laws shall be subject to the notice duly given, at any meeting.

VI. The Board of Managers shall meet at least once a month, and may hold special meetings at its monthly meetings. The Board shall have power to make laws regulating its officers and employees, and to give notice, to alter and amend the same.

Special meetings of the Board shall be called by one of the Lady Directors, or by any member of the Board. The place of meeting, and the time, shall be stated in the notice called for, and shall be taken up at such meeting.

VII. The annual general meeting shall be held as set forth in Article III, and shall be held on the first day of the month.

It shall be the duty of the Board to make arrangements for said meeting, and to report of the proceedings to the subscribers. The Board shall have the right to prohibit a full and accurate report of the proceedings of the "Home."

VIII. In view of the fact that the Home is situated in Toronto, and the grant of the Home shall be subject to the applications from the Government, the Board shall have preference in the grant of the Home.

IX. The Board will

There shall be chosen annually, and by the vote of the Board, a President and Vice-President, and, from among the Lady Managers, the following officers, viz : First Lady Directress, Second Lady Directress, Third Lady Directress, Secretary, Assistant-Secretary, and Treasurer.

For the more convenient working of the Institution, the Board may from time to time appoint committees of not less than three of their number, such as an Executive Committee, and committees for visiting and superintending the "Home."

The Board may also enact By-laws for regulating the duties of the various officers and employés of the "Home"

The By-laws shall not be altered except at a regular meeting, after notice duly given, at least a month previously.

VI. The Board of Managers shall hold stated meetings at least once a month, and may hold adjourned meetings when necessary. At such monthly meetings the Board shall have power to make additional By-laws regulating its own government, and for the government of the officers and employés, as before provided, and when necessary, after due notice, to alter and amend the same.

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President and one of the Lady Directresses, or on requisition of five or more members of the Board. When a special meeting is called, the time and place of meeting, and the business for which it is called, shall be stated in the notice calling the meeting, and no other business shall be taken up at such meeting.

VII. The annual general meeting of the subscribers, qualified as set forth in Article III, shall be held in the month of March.

It shall be the duty of the Board of Managers to make all necessary arrangements for said annual meeting; to lay before the subscribers a report of the proceedings of the previous twelve months, and to exhibit a full and accurate view of the funds, property, and effects of the "Home."

VIII. In view of the large contributions given by the citizens of Toronto, and the grant made by the City Council in aid of the "Home," applications from the city of Toronto for admission to the "Home" shall have preference over others.

IX. The Board will receive incurable persons from any municipality

in Ontario outside of Toronto, on condition that a bond be given by said municipality to pay such sum as the Board may determine from time to time for the maintenance of each patient so sent. Provided always, that a certificate as to general character and circumstances shall have been received from such persons as the Board may approve; that a certificate be given by the gaol surgeon of the municipality, or by such other medical gentlemen as the Board may approve, that the person seeking admission is incurable; provided also, that such certificate be endorsed by the medical officers of this Institution, and that the application be approved by the Board at a regular monthly meeting.

X. The foregoing Constitution shall not be altered, unless it be at the annual general meeting of subscribers, notice of such alteration having been given at least three months before the annual meeting, and approved by a majority of the Board of Managers.

BY-LAWS.

Amended and Adopted March 28, 1884,
and March 20th, 1886.

I. DUTIES OF OFFICERS.—At meetings of the Board of Managers the Chairman (elected as such from amongst the gentlemen Managers) shall preside. In his absence the Managers present shall name a Chairman *pro tem*.

The Chairman shall be the judge of order, and his decisions thereon shall be acquiesced in without debate.

He shall direct the Secretary when special meetings are ordered, to insert in the notices the import of the special business upon which the Managers are to convene.

II. The Secretary shall keep fair and regular minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Managers in a book to be provided for that purpose.

She shall preserve all the records and papers of the Society which do not belong to the Treasurer.

She shall cause a notice of each stated meeting, and of each special meeting of the Board of Managers, to be sent to the address of each Manager, at least one day previous to the day fixed for the meeting.

The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in her duties when required, and act for her at meetings of the Board in her absence.

III. The Treasurer shall receive all moneys belonging to the Society, and shall give a receipt to the persons from whom she may receive money.

For the sake of regularity, and in order to establish the amount, all persons who may hand money to the Treasurer are requested to ask for a receipt of the money so paid over.

When the Treasurer does not require the money in paying accounts which have passed the Board, she shall deposit the money or such part of it as may not be immediately required in the Savings Bank, to the credit of her official account as Treasurer.

She shall keep a fair and regular account of the receipts and expenditures, and her account book and bank book shall be open to the inspection of the Managers at each stated meeting.

Prior to the General annual meeting she shall prepare a statement showing the receipts and expenditures during the year, duly classified and audited, that a lucid, full explanation, or exposition of the working of the finances of the "Home" may be submitted at the general meeting.

The Treasurer's accounts shall be audited by a Committee of the gentleman managers named by the Chairman or by the Board.

IV. The Treasurer only shall pay accounts for articles and services supplied to the "Home," when duly certified, and in all cases of payment, shall require a receipt.

Accounts shall be certified to be correct as to prices, by the managers who made the purchase of the articles and shall be initialed "correct," accordingly. They shall then be initialed by the Matron or the Superintendent, to show that the articles were received at the "Home."

The accounts shall then be laid before the managers at the stated monthly meetings, and when payment is ordered, the order shall be entered on the minutes by the Secretary.

The Treasurer can then pay the accounts, and an entry upon the minutes will be a sufficient authority to the Treasurer to pay whatever accounts or disbursements the Board may have ordered.

V. The Managers may appoint from time to time Committees from amongst themselves to attend to any special duties.

As a rule such committees shall consist of not less than three, and not less than two shall be considered a quorum to act.

These Committees, for the sake of regularity and for future reference, shall as a rule report to the Board in writing.

VI. The stated meetings of the Board shall be held on the last Friday of every month, at such hour as the Board may from time to time appoint.

VII. The Superintendent and Matron shall hold their offices at the pleasure of the Board.

They shall do all in their power to promote the comfort of the inmates of the "Home," and shall follow the instructions of the Board

of the lady managers orders are given.

They shall keep a register necessary for the visitors. When desired the same shall be kept by the Treasurer.

VIII. The Managers shall be introduced into the "Home," following the following formalities

1st. Applicants for admission so long they have residence in the circumstances, also a certificate from a medical man, and written recommendation.

2nd. Thereafter two ladies (two ladies if the applicant be a man). They shall be examined to ascertain what can be practicable, and the general character of the case.

They shall see the applicant, attend to the attendance, hear what the applicant has to say to the Board of Managers.

3rd. That two of the Managers shall examine the applicant for admission, and the character of the disease, and the character of the disease of Toronto, the equivalent of Toronto, the equivalent of Toronto.

Each application for admission shall be considered at the regular meeting of the Board. Investigation, shall be a matter of the Board.

4th. If, after the application has been approved by the Board, there is a vacancy, or the occurrence of a vacancy, the patient is at, or near, the Home, the patient shall be directed to visit

of the lady managers for the week, and of the medical staff when orders are given.

They shall keep a book for entering all such things as they may consider necessary for the use of the "Home," and submit it to the weekly visitors. When disbursements are ordered, a regular account of the same shall be kept for the information of the Managers and the Treasurer.

VIII. The Managers deeming the point of admission of inmates into the "Home," to be a very important matter, decided that the following formalities shall regularly be observed.

1st. Applicants for admission into the "Home" are to state how long they have resided in the city, their residence, age, disease, and circumstances, also whether he or she has been attended by any medical man, and whether any clergymen has visited.

2nd. Thereafter two of the Managers shall visit the residence named (two ladies if the applicant be a woman, two gentlemen if the applicant be a man). They shall look at the surroundings of the applicant, ascertain what can be practically known of the person's circumstances, habits and general character, in short, get all the available information about the case.

They shall see the clergyman and the doctor, if either have been in attendance, hear what each has to say about the applicant, and report to the Board of Managers.

3rd. That two of the medical staff of the "Home" shall visit each applicant for admission, and report to the Board of Managers, the character of the disease and if incurable; and for any applicant outside of Toronto, the equivalent testimonials shall be required.

Each application for admission to the "Home" shall be presented at the regular meeting of the Board, and, if entertained, after due investigation, shall be acted upon at the following regular meeting of the Board.

4th. If, after the name of an applicant has in due course been approved by the Board, a considerable time should elapse before the occurrence of a vacancy, and there is reason to apprehend that such patient is at, or near, the point of death, then the resident medical officer shall be directed to visit the case and to report to the Board, as to the

advisability under the circumstances of removing the patient to the "Home."

5th. All the inmates of the "Home" must distinctly understand that an admission confers no right of permanent residence in the "Home," and at any time the Managers have the power of dismissing an inmate for what they may deem a sufficient cause ; of its sufficiency the Managers are to be the sole judges.

6th. Any inmate who shall leave the "Home" without the consent of the Directors, thereby forfeits all claims for residence within it, and will not be re-admitted.

IX. Any person received into this "Home" as a free patient, if possessed of money or property shall be required to convey the same to the Board for the use of the Institution, and if inheriting property while an inmate of the "Home," and desiring to leave, shall be required to pay the usual charge for Board, during the period of residence in the "Home."

X. Any members absenting themselves from three consecutive monthly meetings, except in cases of illness or absence from the city, shall have their names struck off the list of the managing committee.
