Morning and Evening Stars.—Mercury will be an Evening Star until the 15th January; then a morning star until the 22d of March; an evening star until the 11th May; a morning star until the 7th July; an evening star until the 13th September; a morning Star until the 5th November; and an evening star until the 30th December. Venus will be a morning star until the 11th February; an evening star until the 13th December; and then a morning star the remainder of the year. Mars will be a morning star until the 14th May; then an evening star for the rest of the year. Jupiter will be an evening star until the 18th May; then a morning star until the 7th December; and then an evening star until the close of the year. Saturn will be a morning star until the 17th January; an evening star until the 26th July; then a morning star the remainder of the year.

Eclipses.—In the year 1853 there will be two eclipses of the sun, and two of the moon, viz: 1. A partial eclipse of the moon, Feb. 27, visible in P. E. Island. 2. An annular eclipse of the sun will occur on the morning of March 15th, when the sun will rise upon P. E. Island eclipsed. This eclipse will be visible in North and South America, East Africa, Europe, Asia Minor, Tartary, and part of Siberia. 3. A partial eclipse of the moon, Aug. 23d, invisible in the Northern Hemisphere; visible in the Seas and Islands of the South Pacific Ocean. 4. On Sept. 7th the sun will undergo a total eclipse, invisible in the Northern Hemisphere. The chief parts of the earth where this eclipse will be visible, are—South and Central America, Cape of Good Hope, Southern Atlantic and Pacific Oceans, &c.

Police Court.—This Court is composed of His Worship the Mayor and one Councillor, (the Councillors take their turn weekly,) or in the absence of His Worship, two Councillors—the Councillor for the week presiding, and is open for business, in the City Hall, every day (Sunday, Good Friday and Christmas Day excepted), between 11 o'clock a. m. and 2 p. m. City Licenses are issued from this Court by His Worship the Mayor and the City Clerk. The Police Station attached to this Court is in the rear of the City Hall, and is accessible day and night.

Mayor's Court—Established April, 1856.—This Court, established for the purpose of adjudicating in cases of Small Debts, is composed of His Worship the Mayor, with two Councillors; or in the Mayor's absence, three Councillors; and holds its sittings at the City Hall on the first Friday in each month, with power to adjourn to the following day. The last days of issuing summonses for these monthly Courts is the Wednesday week previous to the said first Friday. At the sittings in the months of March, June, September and December only, can debts over £8, and not exceeding £20, be adjudicated upon; the remaining eight months are confined to the adjustment of debts not exceeding £8.

The Common Seal of the City is made of silver, has engraved on it the device of a ship, a plough and sheaf of grain, with the words, "City of Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, Incorporated A. D. 1855." This Seal is kept by the City Clerk, and is affixed to any documents which may require it, on the payment of certain fees for the City.

City of Charlottetown., Incorporated 17th April, 1855.

—Is situated on the north side of the Hillsborough (or East) River, and contains twenty streets, running at right angles with each other, varying in breadth from 40 to 100 feet. They are named as follows: Water, King, Dorchester, Sydney, Richmond, Grafton, Kent and Fitzroy; these run east and west, parallel to the river. Those running north and south, are named West, Rochfort, Pownal, Queen, Great George, Prince, Hillsborough, Weymouth, Cumberland, and Edward. There are also two lanes, called severally Hensley and Clark streets. It has also the following squares, viz: Pownal, Rochfort, Queen, King and Hillsborough.

The City proper, and what was formerly called the "Common of Charlottetown," is divided into five Wards, called First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Wards, and are bounded and limited as follows, viz.: The First comprises all that part of the City south of Dorchester Street; Second, all that part of the City south of Richmond and north of Dorchester Streets; Third, all that part of the City south of Grafton and north of Richmond Streets; Fourth, all that part of the City south of Fitzroy and

There are in the City the following public edifices, viz. :— Government House, and Emigrant Hospital, on Government farm, in the suburbs, west of the City proper; Her Majesty's Barracks, between Sydney and Water Streets, west end; Queen's County Jail, used also as the City Jail, on the east end of Pownal Square; City Hall and Post Office; Meat Market; Provincial Building; St. Paul's Church, and Infant School Room, on Queen Square; Flour and Meal Market, and Engine House, corner of Great George and Richmond Streets; Saint Dunstan's (Roman Catholic) Church, and Baptist Chapel, on Great George Street; Methodist and Bible Christian Chapels, and Temperance Hall, on Prince Street, with the Free Church at the head, or north end, of said street; Central Academy and Normal School Room, between Weymouth, Grafton and Kent Streets; Engine House, King Square; and Scotch Church, corner of Fitzroy and Pownal Streets.

Under the surface of several of our streets the Gas Company has deposited between thirty and forty thousand yards of gas pipe. We trust that in our Almanac for 1859 we may be able to record a similar quantity of water pipes as laid down, actively conveying *pure water* to the citizens, (which cannot now be obtained through the 47 pumps that ornament our streets,) an article in our domestic economy much required.

The united length of our streets, and the roads through the Common which come under the supervision and repair of our City authorities, and payable out of the City funds, exceeds 16 miles.

The southern shore of our City has projecting from it into the Hillsborough River seven wharfs, viz. ; Pownal and Queen Street, City wharfs; the public ferry wharf, foot of Prince Street; and Messrs. Lord's, Peake's, Bourke's and Reddin's private wharfs.

The Hillsborough River has three ferry-boats in almost constant operation on it through the summer, from and to the City, viz. : the *Ora* and *Ino*, steam, and *Robert Burns*, sail boat. The former runs directly across to Lot 48 ferry, leaving either side every half hour through the day; the *Ino* plies between

the City and Mount Stewart Bridge, twice each week, for the purpose of accommodating persons coming to and returning from market; and the *Robert Burns* runs daily from and to the West River shore.

City Statistics.—In the year ending the first Tuesday in August last, during which our City has existed, under the Act of Incorporation, the following business has been performed at the City Council Board and at the Police Court, &c.

With respect to the City Council, it was called together 208 times—say 129 times during the first, and 78 times in the second year. At 150 of its meetings there were quorums; and in addition to the ordinary business performed, as may be seen by “Minutes of the City Council,” there was a code of rules, 40 in number, adopted for the internal regulation of the Council; and 36 By-Laws were passed, 32 of which were sanctioned by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and the Executive Council, and have been published, forming—with occasional slight amendments which circumstances may require—an excellent code of City Laws for a hundred years to come. They are entitled as follows: For the removal of the Flour and Meal Market, and to enable the Corporation to fit up the Old Court House for a Police or Mayor’s Court, and for other purposes; For holding the Quartely Meetings of the City Council; Respecting Theatres and Public Shows; Fire Department; Markets; Lamps; To establish the City Seal; Pumps and Wells; Auditing City Accounts; Relating to Drunkenness; City Criers; Auctioneers; Pounds; Loaded Vehicles, Coal Meters and Weighers; Disorderly Riding and Driving; Amendment to Law relating to Fire Department; Establishing a Lock-up; Weights and Measures; City Marshal and Constables; Nuisances; City Revenue; Assessment; Truckmen and Truckage; Highways; Sanatory; Dogs; Pumps, Wells, Cisterns, Reservoirs and Fountains; Bread; Cruelty to Animals; Side Walks in Queen Street; and Wharfage.

The City Board of Health, which is composed of the City Council, and came into operation in May, 1856, held six Board meetings and several Committee meetings. Its business is recorded.

At the Police Court the business has been, at times, far from ordinary, as may be seen by the "Minutes of the Police Court." Some idea may be formed of the business, independent of the "Minutes," by the following summary:—There were 639 meetings of the Court, before which 821 written, and about the same number of verbal complaints were made and listened to; 988 of these complaints became cases; 36 of which were handed to the Supreme Court, being above the jurisdiction of the Police Court; 952 were decided in the latter; and the remainder of the complaints were either settled between the parties out of Court or were suffered to fall to the ground by the complainants. A record of the written complaints has been kept, and the evidence in 273 of the above most important cases has been recorded.

In addition to the above, there were 15 monthly meetings of the Mayor's Court for the adjustment of Small Debts for the City, before which 605 cases were brought.

At 860 of the above 868 meetings, His Worship the Mayor, Robert Hutchinson, Esquire, attended.

To the three Locks-up belonging to the Police establishment there were 444 persons committed.

The Fire Department, to which several members of the City Council belong, also held 19 meetings, at which business extending over 40 pages was recorded.

At all the above meetings of the Council, the Board of Health, the Police Court, the Mayor's Court, and the Fire Department, say 887, the City Clerk attended, with the exception of two, caused by indisposition. Some idea of the amount of the written labour performed by him may be gathered from the fact of what he has registered—extending over 2900 pages—and computed, by long measure, to reach 14½ miles; with about an equal amount of incidental writing actually connected with the various spheres of his duty. He is admitted by all connected with the Corporation to be its hardest worked and most poorly paid servant.
